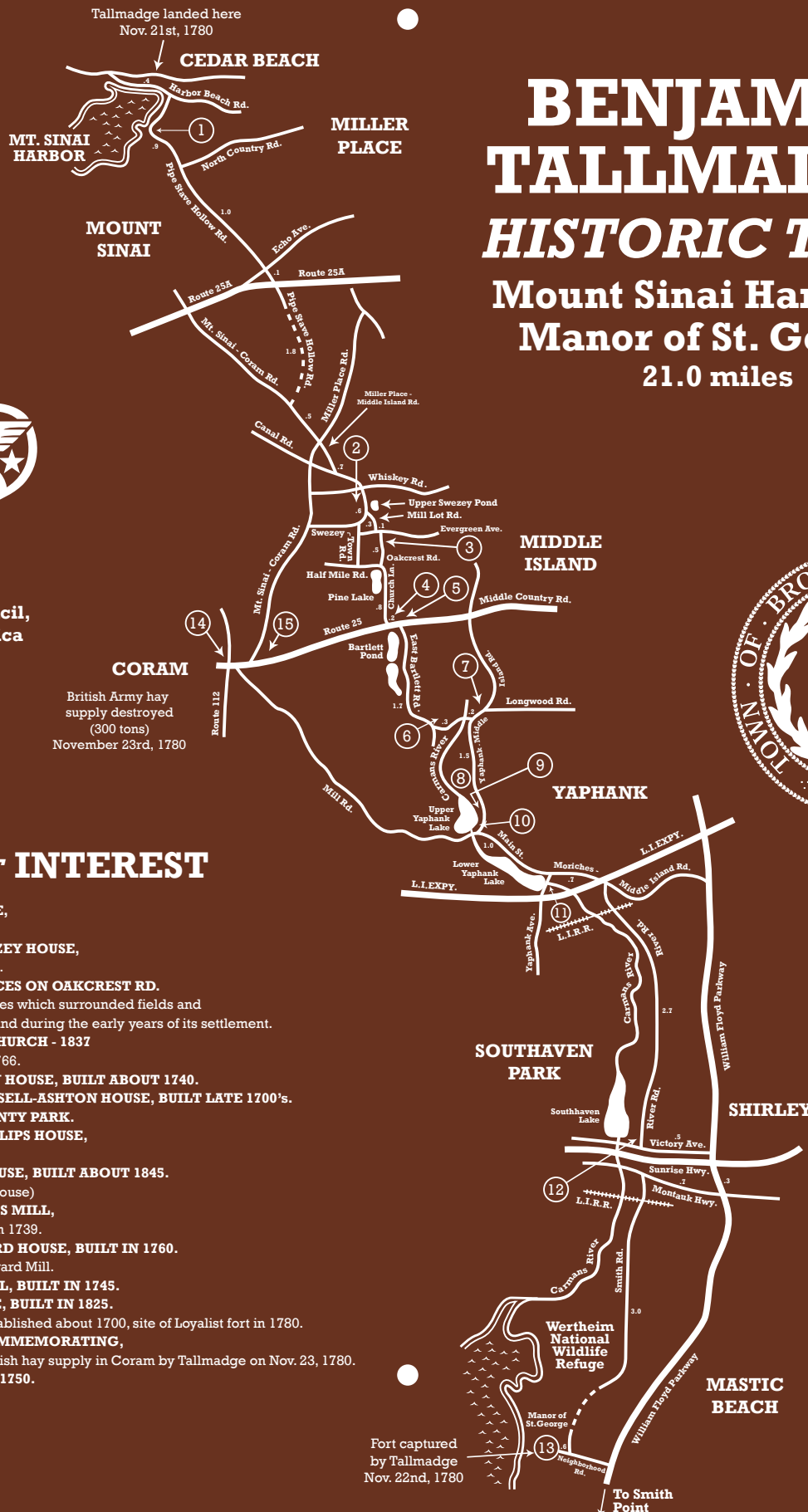

PLACES of INTEREST

- 1. SAMUEL HOPKINS HOUSE,**
Built about 1720.
- 2. SITE OF ORIGINAL SWEZEY HOUSE,**
Built before the revolution.
- 3. OLD LOPPED TREE FENCES ON OAKCREST RD.**
The remains of living fences which surrounded fields and pasture lands on Long Island during the early years of its settlement.
- 4. FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH - 1837**
Original church built in 1766.
- 5. SITE OF JOSHUA SWEZEY HOUSE, BUILT ABOUT 1740.**
- 6. SITE OF THE LEEK-MONSELL-ASHTON HOUSE, BUILT LATE 1700's.**
- 7. CATHEDRAL PINES COUNTY PARK.**
- 8. CAPTAIN WILLIAM PHILLIPS HOUSE,**
Built before 1780.
- 9. ROBERT F. HAWKINS HOUSE, BUILT ABOUT 1845.**
(Family cemetery S.E. of house)
- 10. CHRISTOPHER SWEZEY'S MILL,**
Was built on the this site in 1739.
- 11. SITE OF HOMAN-GERARD HOUSE, BUILT IN 1760.**
Former site of Homan-Gerard Mill.
- 12. SITE OF CARMAN'S MILL, BUILT IN 1745.**
- 13. MANOR OF ST. GEORGE, BUILT IN 1825.**
Original manor house established about 1700, site of Loyalist fort in 1780.
- 14. HISTORIC MARKER COMMEMORATING,**
The destruction of the British hay supply in Coram by Tallmadge on Nov. 23, 1780.
- 15. DAVIS HOUSE, BUILT IN 1750.**
