Camp Reservations & Fee Schedule

- \$100 per Scout deposit due March 15, 2024
- \$575 Early Bird Price Paid in Full April 19, 2024
- \$625 Regular Price Paid in Full May 17, 2024
- Late Registration Fee of \$30 applies after May 17

New Scouts and Crossovers receive Early Bird Price at any time

Adult Fee: \$200 or \$41/day for partial week adults. 1 free adult is given for every 8 youth registered.



Additional Week Discount

Scouts can attend an additional week of camp with a discount of \$150 off the Regular Fee.

This applies to traditional summer camp as well as NYLT and Eagle Flight camps.



Cancellations

- The non-refundable \$100 deposit is not refundable under any circumstances.
 - This fee may be transferred to another camper within your unit.
- The balance of a campers' fee may be refunded up until two weeks prior to the start of your week at camp for the following reasons
 - o Medical issue regarding the camper
 - o Summer School
 - o Extreme family emergencies

- Partial refunds may be refunded to the unit for reasons other than the above, up until two weeks prior to the start of your week at camp.

New Scouts

- New Scouts and Crossovers receive Early Bird Price at any time
- Adult Fee: \$200 or \$41/day for partial week adults. 1 free adult is given for every 8 youth registered.



Sibling Discount

- \$50 discount per sibling
- Requests for sibling discounts must be submitted to <u>camping@senecawaterways.org</u> before final payments are due in order to apply.



Membership Verification

Scouts BSA Resident Camp

- All Scouts and Adults attending Scouts BSA Resident Camps must be registered with the Boy Scouts of America and have a membership ID number assigned.
- All adult leaders attending Scouts BSA Resident Camps must have a current Youth Protection ٠ Training date.
- Seneca Waterways Council units will use an online validation system as part of registration. U ٠
- Out of Council units should bring a copy of the my.scouting roster or a roster generated from your • Scout Service Center, listing all adults and youth attending camp. This document should also include youth protection dates, certificates of completion are also acceptable. Third party rosters, or excel worksheets are not acceptable forms of roster verification. If roster does not include YPT information, a training report or certificates **Must** also be submitted.
- Birth Dates for all Adult Attendees must be submitted through the scoutingevent.com registration • at least two weeks before attending camp, so that camps staff can complete a NYS Background check
- To make sure that criminal background checks have been completed and a member ID can be ٠ issued, we recommend submitting adult applications no later than mid-May to your service center to be processed. This should give plenty of time for processing.
- Unregistered Scouts and Leaders will not be permitted to stay overnight in camp.

Medical Forms for Camp

- Plan ahead now. Medical Forms continue to be required to attend a summer camp program.
- Scouts BSA Resident Camps and Webelos week require Part A, B, C and Medication Form for all youth and adults.
- Medication Form provides the camper with approval to carry sunscreen and bug spray while attending camp. This is a New York State law. Campers can not have bug spray or sunscreen without this form being completed.
 - This form also provides permission for over the counter medication distribution.
 - Over the counter medication distribution is not a guarantee.



Food Service

- Massawepie Scout Camps allows units to eat either in our Dining Hall, or patrol cook in their campsite as a unit with food provided from our commissary.
 - Patrol cooking units can also elect to eat in the Dining Hall for lunch to allow for more flexibility in their camp schedule.
- Three meals per day are served provided, beginning with Sunday dinner and ending with Saturday breakfast.
- If Scouts or leaders have special dietary needs, notification must be made through the Camp Food Accommodation form (see appendix) two weeks prior to your troop's arrival. Send all requests to msc-food@senecawaterways.org. Requests made at the time of arrival may not be accommodated.



Living the Scout Law in Camp

The Scout Oath and Law are expected to be followed throughout your entire visit at camp. Massawepie Scout Camps has a NO tolerance policy for bullying, hazing or harassment. Bullying is grounds for immediate dismissal from camp at the discretion of the Reservation Director. Any form of verbal abuse, physical abuse, or threats will result in immediate dismissal from camp; authorities may be contacted at the Reservation Director's discretion.
