Twilight Camp is Seneca Waterway's premier "Day Camp" for Lions, Tigers, Wolfs, Bears, Webelos, and Arrow of Light. It is conducted by the council under certified leadership at an approved site. The camp is offered in the early evening hours and does not include any overnight activities. Scouts will attend 4 evenings of programming accompanied by their parent, legal guardian, cub scout leader, or Adult 21 years of age, but will return home to sleep.

When is Twilight Camp?

It's from Monday, August 5th through Thursday, August 8th, 2024. The program starts the sessions at 6pm and goes until 9:00pm at the latest. At 5:30pm, Packs will check in at the registration table each night to get a wrist band and daily itinerary.

How much is Twilight camp?

Registration for Twilight Camp is \$55.00 per youth for early bird (if you register before 05/17/24, \$60.00 regular price, and \$50.00 per youth if you register 6 cubs from your Pack/Den.

What kind of activities does Twilight Camp Offer?

Twilight Camp in organized around a theme – this year's theme is "Time Travel"!!!

Each night there are 4 or 5 activities. Activities may include things like crafts, scavenger hunts, scout skills and lore, and of course, games! Popular events from past years have included archery, sling shots, water bottle rockets, obstacle course, and rope bridge.

What can I do with my older scout who is in Scouts BSA (previously called Boy Scouts)? If your son/daughter is in the older scouting group and they are first class rank or higher they can be camp staff members and work the different stations with camp leaders.

What do I bring to Camp?

 - Appropriate dress for the weather (including sunscreen)
 - A Class B shirt (could be an old Camp t-shirt, or Pack shirt
 - Camp chair (if desired)
 - Closed toed shoes
 - A willingness to have FUN!

How do I sign up for Twilight Camp?

We ENCOURAGE (but don't require) Packs to register as a group. We would like to keep everyone

together! One person, typically a Pack Leader or Pack Camp Coordinator, will sign scouts up for this event. They can do so by going to this link

Emergency Information

Camp Emergencies

Staff, attending Parents/Guardians, and Campers will review emergency procedures at the beginning of each day of camp. In the unlikely event of an emergency, a signal will sound and staff will follow guidelines and practiced procedures.

Lost Camper

In case of a lost camper, you will hear an emergency sound. At this point, everyone in camp should stop what they are doing, gather in a seated circle, and perform a name check on every person in the group, including adults. Once attendance is taken, campers can sing a song or play a game but we ask that they continue to stay seated until the Camp Director gives the all clear signal.

Weather

Every effort will be made, consistent with BSA's Guide to Safe Scouting guidelines, to offer a full outdoor program each day. Please make sure campers are dressed appropriately for the weather, whether it is for rain or for heat. Campers should dress in layers to either keep them warm or be able to cool off. If there are rainstorms we will be moving into rooms in the church for "rainy day activities". These are backup activities that we can do inside if the weather prevents us from outdoor activities. If there is lighting and thunder, we will be moving inside the church immediately. We will make an announcement over a speaker to enter the building.

Please be sure to provide your own cell phone numbers as emergency numbers in your camp registration online forms and you will automatically be added to receive texts through Remind. This is the fastest and easiest way to stay informed on camp weather situations.
