Event Program

- **Training** – the proper technique for “loading”, “aiming” and “firing” the caps guns to fall with US Safe Scouting Guidelines is explained, demonstrated, with units being guided and enabled to enjoy the event, and improve opportunities for success!
- **Battle Engagements** – This is a Safe Scouting version of capture the flag with cap guns being used. Those units showing the best overall command of the training will be the most likely to succeed.
- **Artillery** – strike the enemy!
- **Capture the Flag** – crack the code and find the hidden flag!
- **Chess** – not your board game size;
- **Checkers** – test your skill at trapping your opponent and capturing the troops.
- **“Lightning” Stratego** – Set-up: free set-up in the first four rows of the board nearest each player. The figures side of each piece faces its player and is initially unknown to the opponent.
 - **Troops**: colonel, captain, sergeant, three scouts, cannon/bomb, flag: total eight men. Strength is in decreasing order as listed above -colonel strongest, flag weakest. If the set you are using does not have cannon, then use a bomb. Standard Stratego movement is used, except that here, all pieces move
 - **Moving**: all pieces can move one square forward or backwards or left or right. In addition, scouts (only) can move up to or onto the first enemy piece (but not through a friendly piece). The lakes cannot be entered, or crossed over, by any piece.
 - **Combat**: combat ensues when a piece moves onto an enemy piece. The pieces are turned around, revealing the rank of the two combatants. The higher ranked piece survives and stays on the board; the lower ranked piece is removed. Colonel is highest, then captain, sergeant, scout, cannon, flag. If both pieces are equal rank, both pieces are removed from the game. In addition, the cannon, if it moves, can attack a second square in the direction that it moves. To remove the “target”, the cannon must successfully name the rank of the target piece. If the cannon does not successfully identify the enemy piece, both pieces stay on the board. The cannon has, of course, identified itself and open to attack from the opponent.
 - **Victory**: capture the flag: attack the flag with anything.
- **Napoleon’s Puzzle** – combine communication, imagination, teamship to win
- **Scavenger Hunt** – find the targeted items
- **Warhawks** – test your skill at landing the ‘hawks and scoring points
- **Tug ‘o War** – bring the flag to your side of the game space

Additional Event Information

Black Creek District activities are designated as Scouting events. As with every Boy Scouts of America event, certain rules and regulations must be followed to ensure everyone's safety and positive participation.

Code of conduct:	All Scouts, leaders and guests at this event will follow the Boy Scouts of America, Scout Oath and Scout Law.
Safe Scouting:	The Guide to Safe Scouting will be the benchmark by which all Scouting activities will be conducted. Any questions regarding safe Scout rules and principals will be directed to the District Executive.
Youth Protection:	All registered Scouting leaders are required to have current youth protection training. Make sure that all unit leadership in attendance is compliant. As with every Scouting activity, this will require two deep leadership (2 Adults), especially when interacting with Scouts in camp and during activities.
Meals:	Units are responsible for providing meals for their attendees. Please make appropriate arrangements for food and meal preparation. Please provide a means for taking your trash and recycle back with you at event's end.
Garbage:	All trash must be put into designated receptacles or disposed of properly off the activity site. This can be accomplished by units packing out their own trash. For the future of our planet, please reduce your trash by using mess kits and pack out all recyclables.
Alcohol & Tobacco:	Alcohol and drugs are not allowed at any BSA activity. Tobacco product usage is not permitted in the presence of our Black Creek Scouts.
Transport:	When transporting Scouts in vehicles, they must be in proper passenger seats wearing seat belts. Riding in the back of trucks or on tailgates is prohibited.
Medical:	Each unit should have a first aid kit at their campsite. Please report any injuries to the Medical Officer who will document the injury in the medical logbook for the event (one book for youth, one for adults, and one for staff). Medical staff will be on site and available for the event. Each person attending the event will need to provide a current A&B Health Form to the unit leader. There are no exceptions.

District Event Rules & Regulations Reminders

This page should be given to all families attending!!!

1. Prior to departure, the campers attending should ensure they have completed the SWC Camper Health Screening questionnaire (found in this package).
2. Prior to departure, it is recommended that temperature checks should occur, to ensure that all participants do not have a temperature exceeding 100.4, as those persons will not be permitted to attend the event.
3. Upon arrival and prior to exiting the vehicle, all participants are required to submit upon arrival, the completed and signed Health Questionnaire (found in this package).
4. Upon arrival and prior to exiting the vehicle, all people will have their temperature checked at the event site check-in. Those people in a vehicle with a person not passing the temperature check will be requested to leave the event, without exiting the vehicle. There can be no exceptions.
5. During the event, units will maintain a distance of not less than 6 feet from other units and will wear face masks during the event activities.
6. During lunch, units will maintain a distance of no less than 10 feet from other units.
7. ALL cars are to be in a proper parking lot. There may be NO cars left at your campsite. **DO NOT DRIVE INTO THE CAMPSITES.**
8. Follow the direction of the Scouts and volunteers who are assisting the activity leadership.
9. Take ALL trash to the proper receptacles.
10. Absolutely NO digging, breaking of branches or cutting of standing trees.
11. Each unit will ensure that the restroom facilities they use are left clean.
12. Any damage to camp property MUST be reported to your Scouting professional.
13. No flames of any sort allowed in or around tents. BSA Policy
14. Campfires are allowed in proper campfire containment units where permitted, fire buckets at the ready. BSA Policy
15. Campfires MUST always have adult supervision. BSA Policy
16. No cutting of any standing trees, alive or dead. BSA Policy
17. No children can roam camp by themselves – Remember, 2 deep leadership.
18. Teach and use the “buddy system.
19. Closed-toed shoes are to be worn at any Scouting activity.

- 20.** Make sure ALL Scouts, siblings and parents know what unit they are in and the location of their camp.
- 21.** No dish washing in restroom sinks. BSA policy
- 22.** All activity participants need to have a completed health form part A & B / Part C for trips over 72 hours
- 23.** All injuries MUST be reported.
