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Event Overview



University of Scouting is Occoneechee Council's annual training event that provides a day of fun and learning with the Scouting community in Occoneechee Council.

You'll have access to over 60 courses across essential topics like Activities & Adventures, Leadership, Special Needs Scouting and more!

This is the 20th anniversary of University of Scouting in Occoneechee Council, and this year we're doing things a bit differently.

We've got new courses, new instructors, and we're changing how our courses are arranged to focus on what you can learn.

Who is invited?

University of Scouting is open to anyone in the Scouting community, including adult leaders and parents who just want to know more.

Classes are intended for adults or Scouts BSA level youth where indicated.

For cub-aged scouts, we have our new Cub Camp Snoopy program, but youth need to be actively registered with a Scouting unit.


This is the same facility that we have used for the last couple of years.

Cost, Registration, & More

Cost

University of Scouting costs \$30 for the full day of learning.

Online registration through Sunday, Oct. 27th includes lunch, snacks, and an event patch. Walk-in registrations on Saturday, Nov. 2nd will not include lunch.

If you have a Cub Scout that will participate in the Cub Snoopy Camp, that will be a \$20 add on fee at the time of registration.

It is possible that some classes will have an additional program fee. (Ex- First Aid costs an extra \$40.)

The first 75 people who register will get a free University of Scouting Council Shoulder Patch (CSP). Additional CSPs will be available for purchase at \$10 each until they are all gone. See the patch section for more info.

Instructors (those that are teaching classes or filling other University of Scouting roles) pay \$20. This includes food, an event patch, and an Instructor CSP.

Please only register as an instructor if you have already been asked to teach a class or fulfill a role at University of Scouting. If you are interested in teaching but don't have a class assigned please contact us at <u>UniversityofScouting@ocscouts.org</u> and we can let you know if we have any instructor spots that need to be filled.

Attire & What to Bring


We encourage participants to come in their favorite Scouting t-shirt.

University of Scouting has a new patch this year to commemorate the 20th anniversary.

Each paid participant will receive an event patch.



Note: We will not be providing pins as we have done in previous years. The new patch takes the place of the pin.



This two-hour session focuses on the process of Boy Scout advancement, especially from Life Rank to Eagle Scout. The responsibilities of the Unit, District, and Council will be discussed. Learn how important good record keeping is to an Eagle Scout candidate and the significance of his Eagle Scout Board of Review. **This is a 2 period class. Recommended for adult participants.*

You will get all the basics to use this tool to enter and submit advancement for your unit. ***This is a 2 period class.**

We will discuss health and safety, environmental impacts and the personal relationship to the outdoors following Leave No Trace guidelines. Flag etiquette and respect for the symbol of freedom and justice for all Americans is a central part of Scouting at all levels. Learn how to lead flag ceremonies, flag folding, display and retirement ceremonies with confidence.

Introduction to basic fishing gear and techniques, and is designed for Unit leaders and parents who want to take their Cub Scout or young Scouts BSA youth fishing. This is what leaders need so they can support a successful fishing adventure for their youth. *This is a 2-period class.



Outdoor Ethics Period 2-3* **Orientation for All Leaders and Youth**

This class introduces the concept of outdoor ethics to participants with little or no experience in outdoor ethics in a fun and engaging way. It should help youth and adults at all program levels understand Scoutnig's outdoor ethics program including knowledge of the Outdoor Code, Leave No Trace, Tread Lightly! and The Land

Ethic/Stewardship. This course satisfies one of the requirements for the Outdoor Ethics Awareness Award Program. The instructor is a certified Scouts America Outdoor Ethics Level 2 Instructor. *This is a 2-period class.



Period **Pack Grubmaster: Feeding the Masses** 6

How much food do you need to feed a Pack? How many shopping carts are you going to fill to make sure everyone's dietary needs are met? Learn how to plan a great weekend of food fit for everyone.
