## Details, Dates, & Fees

#### **Registration:**

- Both unit registration and class registration open at 6 PM on Nov 3, 2026.
- \*\*\*Please note all registrations must have a Scout's name attached. Units may not register generic Scouts as placeholders. Council will be monitoring registrations and will remove placeholders.\*\*\*
- Registrations are not final until paid in full.

#### Fees:

Scouts: \$100.00 Adults: \$50.00 Instructors: FREE

(requires prior approval to register as an instructor)

#### Leadership:

- Each Scout Unit is required to be accompanied by registered Unit Leaders. Units must have two-deep leadership in accordance with Youth Protection Guidelines [female units must have an attending registered female leader].
  - While we will do our best to assign linked B&G troops to the same site (A vs. B sides), this may not be possible. If it is not, you will be notified ahead of time so you can prepare accordingly.
- We are now also accepting provisional Scouts for those who want to attend even though their troop is not. Scouts will be attached to another troop who will provide supervision.

#### **Information Meetings:**

- There will be virtual meetings offered on January 6<sup>th</sup> and January 8<sup>th</sup> at 7 PM. A Unit Representative (adult leader) only needs to attend one of the meetings.
  - A meeting link will be emailed to the unit contact that registered your unit in Black Pug.
  - The link will also be available on the council website and social media pages.
  - Details will also be emailed to unit leaders.
- A unit leader & SPL meeting will also be held in the Grand Lodge on January 16<sup>th</sup> at 9:30pm.
- Merit badge instructors will have separate information meetings, January 6<sup>th</sup> and January 8<sup>th</sup> at 8 PM (after the Unit Leader meeting). Instructors only need to attend one meeting.

## **General Information**

#### **Medical Needs**

- All youth and adult attendees must bring current, signed BSA Personal Health and Medical Record Parts A, B1, and B2 with a current copy of their health insurance card. These will remain with Unit Leaders during camp.

- Unit Leaders are responsible for administering medications and keeping them secured.
- There will be a staff medic based in the Grand Lodge to assist with medical emergencies; however, the unit leaders are the first source of aid for an injured Scout. The camp utilizes 911 services for Moore County.

#### **Emergencies**

 If a camp-wide emergency is declared, the siren will be signaled, and everyone will be required to immediately report to the flag pole area at the Grand Lodge. Leaders will account for All members (youth and adults) and wait for further instruction from event staff.

#### **Uniforms**

- Activity Uniform (Class B) is acceptable for all Winter Blast activities and classes.
- Please note: It will be cold and merit badges will be held outside. Dress appropriately.
- May we suggest that the 2026 Winter Blast hoodie would be a great fashion statement?

#### **Refunds**

• The refund policy for this event can be found in Black Pug on the registration page.

#### **Leaving Camp/Visitors**

- For your protection, all campers (youth and adult) who leave camp must check out with Admin Staff at the Grand Lodge.
  - If a youth must leave camp and is picked up by a parent or guardian, they
    must be accompanied to the Grand Lodge check out by a unit leader to
    verify the adult's authority to pick up the youth.
- No visitors will be allowed on site during the event

## Open Camp Areas

#### **Trading Post**

- The trading post will be in operation during the event.
- Hours will be limited. MasterCard and VISA will be accepted.

#### **Adult Leader Lounge**

Located below the Grand Lodge, the Grill area will be the place adult leaders can gather for coffee and hang out in an indoor space with access to restrooms and Wi-Fi.

## Meals

#### Meals

- All meals will be served in the Grand Lodge Dining Hall. Please check the schedule for menus and times.
- Seating areas will be assigned based on campsite. Each unit is responsible for cleaning their tables and the floor in their dining area after each meal. Brooms, dust pans, cleaning towels, and cleaning spray will be provided.

#### • Allergies / food restrictions

- We will only be able to provide vegetarian, nut-free, and dairy-free options. These must be requested in Black Pug during registration.
   On-site requests may not be able to be accommodated.
- If a camper has any other restrictions, they will need to provide their own food. Cold storage will be available for these individuals. Microwave ovens are available for use as well.

#### Service Opportunity

 At each meal there is a need for servers in the kitchen. Unit leaders should register their adults and Scouts via Black Pug to volunteer to serve one meal at the event.



Please be advised that the food prepared in the Grand Lodge Kitchen contains, may contain, or come into contact with the common food allergens: Dairy, Eggs, Wheat, Soy, Peanuts, Tree Nuts, Sesame, Fish, Shellfish. For product ingredients list, refer to the bulletin board in the kitchen

The kitchen is unable to accommodate every food allergy and dietary need. A fridge and microwave will be available for anyone who needs to bring their own food.



## **Camping Information**

#### How are campsites assigned?

- Campsites will be assigned by camp staff based on unit size.
- While we will do our best to assign linked B&G troops to the same site, this may not be possible. If it is not, you will be notified ahead of time so you can plan accordingly.

#### Will there be a working sink in the campsite?

• Camp has been winterized, so we are working with limited facilities. Toilets are available in the site. Sinks and showers may not be working. Handwashing stations will be provided if sinks are not functional.

#### What if we want to stay over Sunday night?

 The event is over on Sunday. If you want to stay Sunday night, you will indicate so in the troop's registration. Please note that there are no planned evening activities, no available indoor spaces, no medic, and no Monday breakfast.

#### Can we have campfires?

• We sure hope so! Camp must follow the mandates of Moore County Emergency Management and the Fire Marshal regarding fire safety.



## **Arrival Process**

#### **Check in at the Grand Lodge**

- Each vehicle arriving in camp should proceed to the Grand Lodge for check-in.
  - Send in one adult (please have everyone else remain in the vehicle) to check in the vehicle.
  - If multiple vehicles from the same group arrive simultaneously, only one adult needs to come into the Grand Lodge.
- At this time, you will be given your campsite assignment and any pre-purchased hoodies.
- Vehicles may then proceed to the site to drop off gear and Scouts.

#### **Parking**

- After drop-off, all vehicles must be moved to the Admin parking lot near the camp entrance.
- Units are permitted to park one vehicle and/or trailer at their assigned campsites for their convenience. Once parked, the vehicle can not be moved until check-out Sunday evening.

#### **Driving in Camp**

• Only official camp vehicles and approved staff can drive in camp.

## **Departure Process**

#### Check out at the Grand Lodge (Sunday night)

- Units will check out from the event after dinner and brief closing ceremony on Sunday night at the Grand Lodge. Exit packets will be handed out at that time.
- Prior to departure, showerhouses need to be swept out, trash taken to the dumpster, and fires put out and cold to the touch.
- All troops should plan to be out of camp by 8 PM on Sunday night.
  - If a troop needs to stay over Sunday night and has indicated such in their registration, they will still need to check out with the event staff on Sunday evening, then return to their campsite for the rest of the night and depart camp Monday morning by 10am.

#### Is there any way we can help?

- Yes! We need groups to do flag ceremonies. There is a check box in Black Pug as you register your troop where you can indicate your willingness to volunteer.
- Yes! Is your troop coming via bus, minibus, or large van? Would you be willing to help transport Scouts to off-site (but nearby) merit badge sessions? There is a check box in Black Pug as you register your troop where you can indicate your willingness to volunteer to drive.
- Yes! We'd love some help setting up and tearing down. If you (adults) are available to arrive Friday morning or stay after troops depart on Sunday, we would appreciate the help! Contact Scott Sublett to volunteer @ 14scott.sublett@gmail.com

#### Where are Scouts expected to be when they are not in class?

- All Scouts are expected to be taking merit badge classes during all daytime sessions.
- If a Scout does not have a class, troop leaders should be prepared to provide oversight which adheres to BSA Youth Protection policies.
  - The Grand Lodge will not be open to Scouts and all indoor spaces available will be used for merit badge sessions.

- Staff will be in the Grand Lodge and available via the camp radio network during the event.
  - For non-emergent issues, we will find unit leaders in their campsite, or elsewhere in camp.
  - For emergent issues, we will take immediate appropriate action and contact all event staff and/or unit leaders via radio and/or cell phone.

• Winter Blast staff will be at the Grand Lodge to assist unit leaders when needed. Scouts should go to their unit leaders for assistance first.
