Come join us for the Cub Scout Fall Festival! On October 17th, we will have an all-day Fall Festival for the kids! This includes an 18-foot inflatable slide, an inflatable obstacle course, 3 inflatable games (Axe Throwing, Hoop Zone Basketball & Ball Toss), Fall Festival Games (e.g. Pumpkin Ring Toss, Pumpkin Balloon Toss, Duck Bobbing), Face Tattoo Stations, Slime Making, Giant Bubble Blowing, Pumpkin Decorating, Picture/Photo Area, Hayrides, and crafts! Come see Fairytale Concessions for a Funnel Cake or a fried dessert! See the Weekend Schedule, Activities & Classes Section of this guide for more information!

LOGISTICS

Very Important Dates:

- **Campsite Requests** – Register early; it's first come, first served. Site Assignments are based on Pack size and campsite request.
- **T-SHIRTS** must be pre-ordered on the Black Pug Event Link by **Friday, September 25th**
- **EXPRESS CHECK-IN FORMS** (Pack Rosters & Medical Forms) must be turned into a Council Employee at the Council Service Center by **Friday September 25th**. NOTE: Don't have all the paperwork by the deadline? That's ok! If you have at least 70% of your paperwork to go along with your complete roster, you can still take advantage of early check-in and drop off what you have!
- **REGISTRATION & CAMPING FEES** are due by **Friday, October 2nd**.
- **PATCHES** are not guaranteed unless your Pack registers by **Friday, October 2nd**

Very Important Forms:

- **PACK ROSTERS** – Each Pack should have a complete roster of all Adults, siblings, Cub Scouts, and Den Chiefs that are camping with their Pack. **Rosters must be entered electronically in Black Pug with payments by October 2nd.** *Final rosters can be printed from Black Pug in lieu of completing the attached Pack Roster form.*
- **MEDICAL FORMS** - ALL youth and adults who are coming to camp must complete BSA Health and Medical Record Forms A, B1, and B2. We are required to have these documents on camp, secured with camp administration and/or the medical officer for the duration of the event. Save yourself some time and use **Express Check-In!** If you don't use Express Check-In, you need to bring these forms to check-in at camp.

Campsite Request / Unit Registration:

- Campsite reservations are on a first-come, first-served basis for all Packs. There is a participant limit, so please register early. **Site assignments are based on Pack size and campsite requests.**
- All Packs should register for a campsite as a unit, **using only one registration form.** Campsite registration should include a best-guess attendance and be completed by **Friday, October 2nd.**
- If your Pack is not attending & your Cub Scout would like to camp, please contact **Trey Eskridge** at the Council Service Center. We can assign you to a provisional Pack for this event.

Camping Fees / Attendee Registration:

- **ONLINE REGISTRATION & CAMPING FEES** <https://www.tuscarorabsa.org> are due by **Friday, October 2nd**, and ***NO individual registrations will be accepted after this date due to limited availability of program supplies and staffing arrangements.***
 - \$25 per Cub Scout and Sibling/Den Chief (aged 4 or older). Siblings and Den Chiefs can participate in all activities.
 - \$10 per BSA Registered Adult Leader, Parent, Legal Guardian, and Sibling aged 3 and under. A parent or guardian must attend with each Scout.
- **Refunds** - In the event you have a Scout or family that is unable to attend, but has paid for the campout, a refund (camping fees only) may be given ***if the request is made in writing to Trey Eskridge more than ten days prior*** to the event start date. All other refunds are on a case-by-case basis only. Refunds will not be given for any Pack or individual that is a no-show for the event. If the event is postponed for any reason, a refund will be given to those who are unable to attend the rescheduled date *after the scheduled weekend*.
- **PATCHES** are not guaranteed unless your Pack registers by **Friday, October 2nd**. *If your unit does not receive patches at the event, we will make every effort to get them to your unit at a later date.*



Event T-Shirts:

- **T-SHIRTS** must be pre-ordered and paid in full on the Black Pug Event Link **by Friday, September 25th at 5pm**
- Short Sleeve T-shirts (all sizes) - \$20 apiece
- **Refunds** - There are ***no refunds*** on pre-ordered T-shirts.

CHECK-IN:

Express Check-In (Skip The Line!):

Skip The Line & Submit all of your Pack's paperwork early! (This is the preferred check-in option, and we encourage all units to take advantage of this method if at all possible.) No waiting, no standing in line, no shuffling through a stack of forms, no calling parents for missing signatures...Just show us your approval form or submit remaining paperwork and we'll let your Pack parents access your campsite for a gear drop!

Express Check-In Process:

1. Gather all completed and signed medical forms and your Pack Roster. Don't have all the paperwork by the deadline? That's ok! If you have at least 70% of your paperwork to go along with your complete roster, you can still take advantage of early check-in and drop off what you have! You can print off the Pack Roster from **BLACK PUG**.
2. Submit them to the Council Service Center by **Friday, September 25th**. Please make sure you leave them with a staff member, so they can secure them appropriately for our registration team to pick them up and review them.
3. Our registration team will contact your Pack by email and let you know what you need to bring to camp to complete registration. We will even have a dedicated station for our Packs using Express Check-In so they can skip to the front of the line!

Check-In at Camp:

1. **CHECK-IN WILL BEGIN ON FRIDAY AT 4:00 PM.** Please do not arrive prior to this time as our staff will not be equipped or prepared to assist you until 4:00 pm. ***The Pack-designated check-in person should plan to arrive as close to 4:00 PM as possible, but ENCOURAGE PARENTS AND CAMPER TO ARRIVE LATER, as they cannot access the campsite until the unit is officially checked in.***
2. **INSTRUCT ALL YOUR CAMPER TO PARK IN THE MAIN PARKING AREA** and wait for your Pack to be checked in. Why? ***Per our BSA liability policy, no one is allowed in campsites or camping areas until they have completed the check-in process and all required forms (See "Very Important Forms" above) have been submitted and verified.***
3. **TO HELP EXPEDITE THE CHECK-IN PROCESS**, Packs are requested to send only one leader to the check-in area inside Headquarters to check in the unit.
4. **IF YOUR PACK CHOOSES THE EXPRESS CHECK-IN OPTION:**
 - All you need to bring to check in at camp is your approval form (issued once all forms have been verified by our express registration staff), or your missing and/or incomplete paperwork (any issues with submitted forms will be communicated to you by our express registration staff well in advance of the campout).
 - We will have dedicated registration stations for Express Check-In
5. **IF YOUR PACK DOES NOT CHOOSE THE EXPRESS CHECK-IN PROCESS:**
 - Cub leaders should turn in all of their Pack's Medical forms and Pack Roster at camp check-in. ***Online registration should be complete on BLACK PUG with names and payment by October 2nd.***
 - There will be several check-in stations on site. All Packs with complete and accurate forms should be able to progress through the check-in process in a timely manner.
 - We will have one station dedicated to units that have incomplete, missing, or incorrect forms. If paperwork issues are discovered at check-in, we will kindly ask that you proceed to our dedicated "wait station" so as not to hold up the line for other units that are ready to check-in.
6. **ONCE CHECK-IN HAS BEEN COMPLETED SUCCESSFULLY**, the Pack will then be given a complete packet, including confirmed schedule of events and confirmation of campsite.

7. **VEHICLE ACCESS RULES FOR SCOUT SAFETY - A Scout is Obedient & Courteous:** For the safety of all campers and in adherence to National policies as they relate to our BSA liability insurance coverage, ***vehicle entry to campsites will be controlled*** as follows:
- During posted gate hours ***only*** on Friday evening AFTER your Unit has completed the check-in process, we will allow your Pack families to enter the campsite gates and drop gear. ***They should not stay to set-up their campsite*** since this will delay other vehicles from entering the campsites and cause a back-up in the parking area. They should drop their gear, then take their vehicle promptly back to the parking area. ***PLEASE DRIVE 14 MPH OR LESS***
 - For the safety of our campers, ***no unauthorized vehicles will be allowed past the campsite gates or in the campsites from posted "gate closed" hours on Friday evening through Sunday morning.*** We will have carts available to help you carry gear to your campsites if you arrive during posted "gate closed" hours.
 - A Pack trailer will be allowed to be kept in the campsite.
 - **No vehicles will be allowed to park in the site. No exceptions.** Our staff will be checking campsites to make sure vehicles have been moved back to the parking area. If you are asked to move a vehicle out of your campsite, please remember to be kind and courteous to our staff.
 - All vehicles are to be parked in the large field parking lot or Pedro's Field if you are camping on the high side (Campsites 7-12). **Maintain One-Way Flow of Traffic on the High Side of Camp.**
 - The circle drive in front of the camp headquarters building is for equipment drop-off and pick-up only. Only camp service vehicles and instructors' vehicles should be parked in this area.
 - **Riders are NOT allowed in the bed of pickup trucks or on trailers.**
8. **Saturday Check-In will start at 8:30 am right after flag.** We will direct Saturday arrivals to your campsite & give them a schedule. The Cubmaster or their designee is responsible for checking them in.

Weekend Schedule, Activities & Classes

Just a reminder that Packs are responsible for providing their own meals for Fall Cub Family Weekend.

LEADER'S MEETING AT AMPHITHEATER 8 pm: There will be a leader's meeting Friday night at 8 pm at the amphitheater to go over all activities, any potential updates and/or changes for the weekend, and camp safety procedures. At least one leader from each Pack must attend this meeting. Don't be shy – sit close to the front to hear all the important details. ***The meeting will be moved to HQ if it rains.***

WAMPUS CAT OUTFITTERS TRADING POST - The camp Trading Post will be open with snacks, souvenirs, apparel, gear, toiletries, and many other items for sale. Wampus Cat Trading Post hours ***will be announced Friday evening at the Leader's Meeting.***

The inflatable games include Axe Throwing, Hoop Zone Basketball, and Ball Toss! Second, the judging categories:

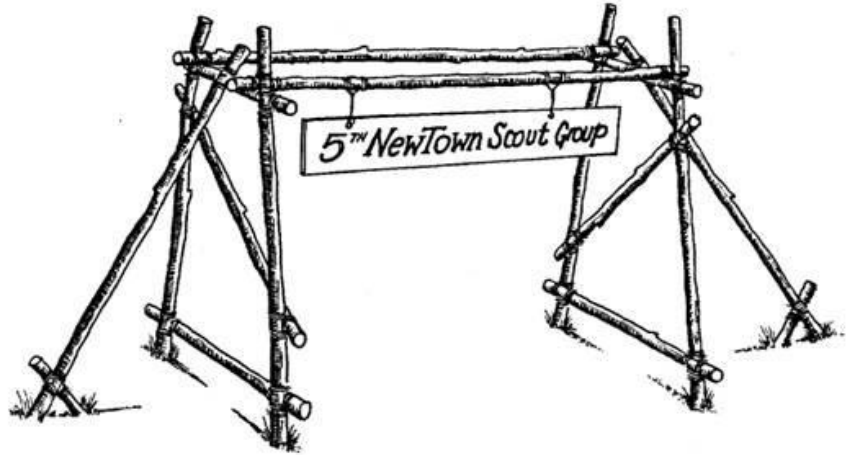
- Creative Name – 20 points possible

You can earn points in several different categories, including Flags, Fire Area, First Aid, Kitchen, Campsite, and Bonus Points! Please see the Campsite Inspection Sheet in this guide for details on how you can earn points at your Campsite! Awards will be given at the Campfire!

Please place a picture of Dolly Parton in your Campsite Shelter. This is to honor Dolly Parton's advocacy for literacy.



LOTS OF OTHER FUN ACTIVITIES:

- Take your campers to the Human Foosball court, Gaga Ball Pit, and Swing Sets for more fun activities they can do on their own.
- **FISHING** - If your campers enjoy fishing, take them to one of our lakes! All you have to do is bring your own fishing pole and bait. Please do not fish in the swimming area, boat launch area, or off the Swimming Area Docks. Stepping on an old fishhook may end a scout's fun at summer camp!

SKATEBOARDING: The Skateboard Park will not be open, but we have plenty of other fun activities for your scouts and their siblings.

ADVENTURES BY RANK: Adventures will be offered by Rank. The Final Schedule will be available upon check-in Friday, October 16th.

- Worship Service at Amphitheater – 8am – **VOLUNTEER LEADER/SCOUT/DEN/UNIT NEEDED**
- Headquarters Open for Unit Check-Out – 8:30am
- Camp Closes at 10:30am – All Units should be checked-out and off premises

CHECK-OUT:

- **Packs are required to check-out with our camp administration staff before leaving camp.**
- Unit event patches and all unit medical forms will be included in your Pack's check-out packet, which must be signed for and picked up by a unit representative. (All unclaimed medical forms will be destroyed after 5 business days, and we cannot guarantee the availability of event patches if not picked up prior to leaving camp at the end of the event.)

Help Us Keep Our Campers Safe & Our Camp Clean

First Aid:

- Each person at camp must have current BSA 680-001 Health and Medical Record Forms A, B1, and B2 on file with camp administration or the camp medical officer while at camp.
- First aid personnel will be on site during the event in the Medical Lodge.
- Each Pack should have a basic first aid kit at their site for minor first aid needs.

Bicycles At Camp: We invite you to bring your camper's bicycle to camp! While they are bicycling on camp, riders should obey the following rules:

- All Bicycle Riders must wear helmets at all times
- Bicycles should not be ridden after dark
- Pedestrians have the right of way

Target And Range Area:

Only closed-toe shoes are allowed in the Target and Range area. **This does not include Crocs!** Scouts are not allowed inside the marked ranges (marked by tape or fence) without the permission of our range safety officers. Also, when the red flag is hoisted on the shooting sports range, scouts should not run in this area.

Fires at Camp:

- If no ban is in place, Pack campfires are allowed in fire rings at their sites. If there is no fire ring in the assigned site, units are responsible for bringing their own fire pit, fire ring or barrel to use for campfires. All campfires must be contained within the fire ring or a pan raised off the ground.
- Please ask at headquarters if a fire ring is needed. A few are available for use. ***Please do not dig holes for campfires.***
- Campfires must be attended by an adult always, including when the Pack attends activities and the campfire ceremony. If the fire is not watched, it must be put out.
- Unfortunately, **Camp Tuscarora does not have the resources to provide firewood to campers.** You may bring firewood or burn downed wood only. ***Do not cut standing trees.***
- Make sure all fires are completely out – cold to the touch - before leaving camp. ***Do not bury ashes.***

Bathrooms/Showers Maintenance & Cleaning: There are bathhouses and port-a-johns around camp for campers to use. Some facilities are female or male only. We must all share in the responsibility to help keep these facilities in good shape.

- If supplies or maintenance are needed, a staff member should be notified immediately.
- Before leaving camp please take time to clean your campsite and the adjoining bathhouse to your campsite. Cleaning supplies will be provided.
- ***Please do not wash your dishes out in the bathroom sinks.*** This clogs the sink drains and creates extra work for our ranger to repair. Place food debris in trash bags.

Trash Disposal:

- Please place trash by your campsite sign (i.e. Campsite 3) by 3:45 pm on Saturday for pickup and disposal by staff.
- Trash not left for pickup on Saturday must be packed out from the campsite upon leaving camp on Sunday. A trash bin, dumpster, or trailer will be available for units to dispose of trash bags.

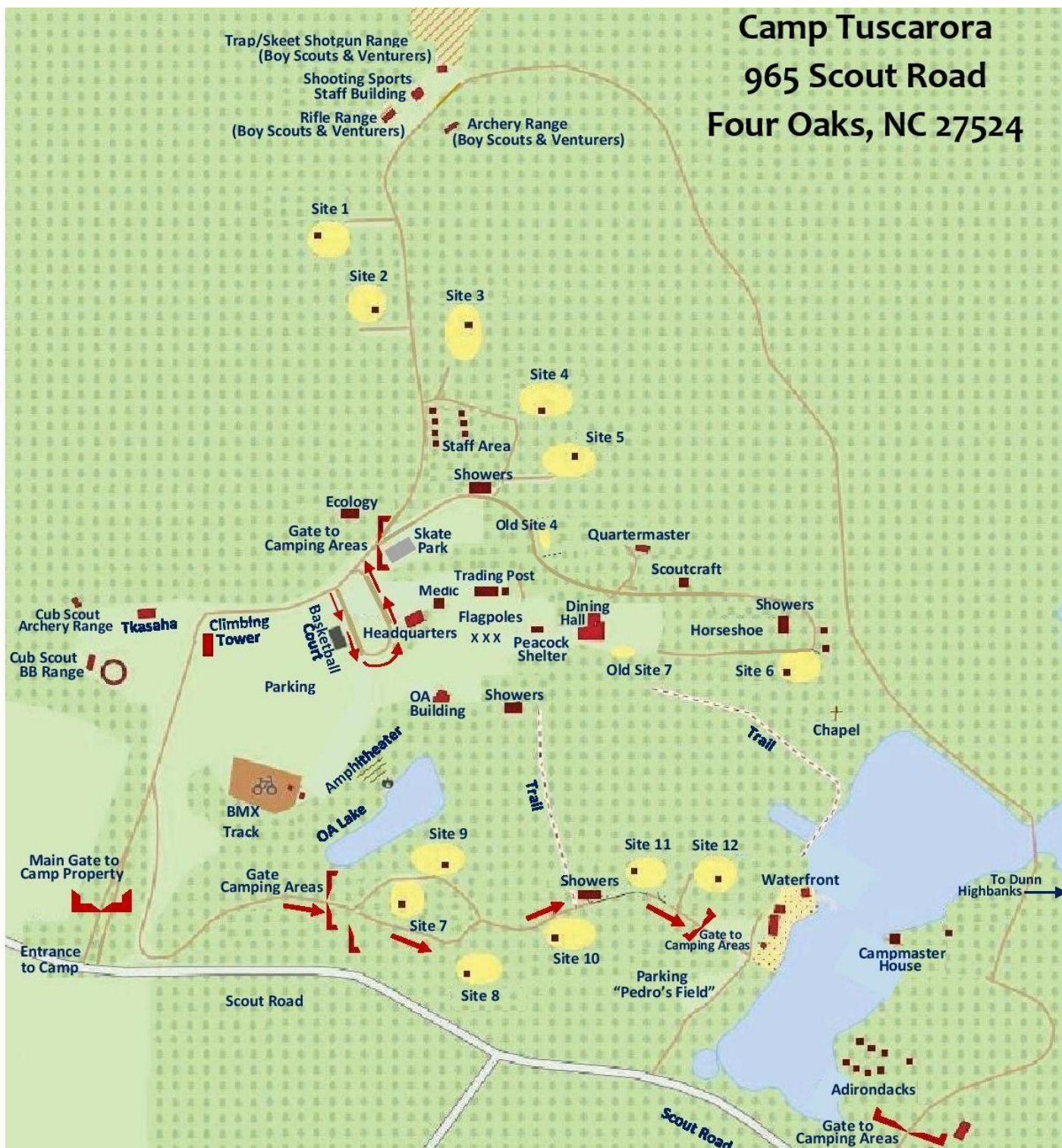
