Get ready for a great time at the Cub Scout Weekends at Camp McNeill. There will be three weekends for Packs to choose from. Registration is first come first served for Packs. There will be a participant limit for all weekends. Each weekend will have the same program and theme.

Camping Fees and Registration:

The cost to attend is \$55.00 per Cub Scout. Adults and siblings are \$35.00 each. A parent or guardian is required to attend with each Scout. T-shirts for the campout are available for pre-order for an additional cost of \$15.00. Pre-ordered t-shirts are available for pick up at camp during checkin. There will be additional shirts available in the trading post. Your size will not be guaranteed if you do not pre-order shirts. **All registrations and fees are to be submitted prior to coming to the campout**.

Camp Refund Policy:

Camping fees are transferable but not refundable.

Check-in:

Check in will be in front of the Camp McNeill Administration Building located next to the parking lot. Check in will be from 5:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. on Friday. Check in will be available on Saturday Morning from 8:00 a.m. until 10:00 a.m.

For the safety of all guests, vehicle entry to campsites will be strictly controlled. We will have carts available to help you carry gear to your campsites. A Pack trailer will be allowed to be taken to the site. No vehicles will be allowed to park in the site.

COVID Camp Protocols

- Everyone who arrives to camp will have their temperature checked, including the driver (even if it is for a drop off). Anyone who shows a sign of a fever will be turned away including those who rode in the same vehicle. It is recommended for those who carpool to self-check temperatures prior to departure, but everyone will still be temperature checked upon arrival.
- Those at camp must practice social distancing which is 6 ft apart from others.
- Our staff will be operating a stringent and regular cleaning schedule of all areas of camp throughout the day including program areas and supplies in-between uses.
- Our camp staff will be wearing masks when applicable. We encourage Scout participants to wear them too. Masks will be provided.

Campsites:

Campsites will be assigned based on Pack size and need. Some sites may host more than one Pack. Most sites will have a fire ring for Packs to use. If there is not a fire ring in the site, fires are to be built off the ground in a barrel. Packs must use fire barrels or pans to contain campfires.

Activities:

There will be lots of activities during the day. Some activities will center on Adventures or Awards. Scouts are encouraged to attend as many activities as possible. There will be BB shooting, archery, slingshots, and crafts. Scouts will be able to work on their Shooting Sports Award. Scouts who are participating in the Lions program will participate in wild card activities. Advancement activities will include:

A schedule of events will be given at check-in. ALL youth and adults who are camping must complete a **BSA Medical Form Parts A & B**.

First Aid

First aid personnel will be on site during the event. Each Pack should have a basic first aid kit in the site for minor first aid needs. For the safety of others, campers who are sick or running a high fever should not attend.

Bathrooms/Showers

There are bathhouses and restrooms around camp for campers to use. Some facilities are female or male only. We must all share in the responsibility to help keep these facilities in good shape. If supplies or maintenance are needed, please let a staff member know.

Trash Disposal

Packs must pack out all trash from the campsite upon leaving camp on Saturday. A trash bin or trailer will be available to dispose of trash bags.

Vehicles

All vehicles are to be parked in the McNeill Admin parking lot. Vehicles are not allowed to park in the campsites. **Riders are NOT allowed in the bed of pickup trucks or on trailers. NO PARKING IN THE CAMPSITES.**

Meals

Saturday breakfast, lunch, dinner, and Sunday breakfast will be provided. There will be limited seating capacity inside the dining hall to allow for distancing. If there are any dietary needs or restrictions, please let the staff know.

Fires at Camp

If no ban is in place, campfires are allowed in fire rings at their sites. All campfires must be contained within the fire ring or a pan raised off the ground. <u>Please do not dig holes for</u> <u>campfires.</u> Campfires must be attended by an adult at all times, including when the Pack attends activities and the campfire ceremony. If the fire is not watched, it must be put out. You may bring firewood or burn downed-wood only. **Do not cut standing trees.** Make sure all fires are completely out before leaving camp.

Trading Post will be open during posted hours throughout the day Saturday, and after the campfire. Candy, snacks, drinks, t-shirts, crafts, and other memorabilia is available at the Trading Post. It is for you to use at your own discretion. It is suggested that campers bring \$10-\$50 spending money. Credit and debit cards are accepted.

Lost and Found: The lost and found is located in the Camp McNeill Administration Building.

Valuables: Scouts and leaders are encouraged not to bring valuables to camp. Also, please do not let scouts bring unnecessary electronic devices. Let nature and their friends be the entertainment for the weekend!

No Pets: Pets are not allowed at Camp McNeill. Nature's creatures are to be left in their natural environment.

No Fireworks and Firearms: Fireworks are illegal in North Carolina and are not permitted on camp property. Personal firearms and/or ammunition are not allowed at the Cape Fear Scout Reservation. The use of alcoholic beverages and/or controlled substances at camp is prohibited.
