Day 1 – Arrival

- **4:00 PM (Check-in):**
 - Upon arrival in Medora, go immediately to the **Medora Campground Office**. The Medora Campground is located on the west side of town, across the Little Missouri River. The staff at the campground office will check you into your tent site or group tent site.
- **4:15 PM:**
 - Julie or a staff member from GES will meet you at the **Medora Campground Office @ 4:15 PM**. They will meet you there to walk through the itinerary, answer any questions about your time in Medora, and provide your group folder with maps, tickets, and important information for your stay.
- **5:00 PM:**
 - Activities as designated by the troop leaders.
- **5:45 PM:**
 - Please report to the **Harold Schafer Heritage Center** for the flag lowering ceremony at **6:00 PM**. A volunteer will be there to instruct you for future flag ceremonies.
 - After this ceremony, your group will walk to the entrance of Theodores to begin the **Town Square Ceremony**. After the flags are lowered, a volunteer will show you where to place the flags for storage overnight. Tom Brosseau who will be playing the Great American Folk Show on the Town Square Patio would like to introduce the troops before lowering the flags at the Town Square Patio. Please connect with him and wait for his cue before doing the flag ceremony. *(There is a plastic bin labeled 'Flags', in the storeroom between the bathrooms on the Town Square Patio).*
 - **For the rest of your stay, all Flag ceremonies will be conducted solely by your troop.**
- **6:45 PM:**
 - Activities as designated by the troop leaders.

Day 2

- **8:30 AM:**
 - Please report to the **Town Square** for the flag raising ceremony at **8:30 AM**. *(Please pick-up flags from the bins in the storeroom, located between the bathrooms on the Town Square Patio.)*
- **9:30 AM:**
 - Please report to **Point to Point Provisions**. Eugene or a staff member will be there to welcome your group and provide guidance on the tasks.

- **10:30 AM:**
 - o Please report to the **Buffalo Gap** to assist with “Project Cardboard.” Cathy Norberg will meet you there and explain what to do. Please also assist here: **Rough Riders Gift Shop**, and **Cowboy Lyle’s Candy Store**. Please pick up any trash you see around the buildings.
- Lunch on own / designated by troop leaders. Water bottles can be filled in at the Rough Riders Hotel.
- If time, pull weeds in flower beds of **Rough Riders Hotel** and **Harold Schafer Heritage Center**.
