WHY A SCOUT SHOW

There are numerous reasons for having Scout Shows. They provide a colorful, adventuresome experience for all members - Cub Scout, Boy Scouts, Explorers, and Ventures - both new members and veterans. A Show provides good Unit Program for several months before the activity.

Scout Shows are held to show and gain support for Scouting by correctly interpreting to the public what our program is in terms of objectives and activities. An important purpose is financial - to assist the council in providing Unit services and provide Units with a well-publicized and run fund-raising opportunity. Think What made you want to be a scout? What do you like best about scouting? This is a BIG recruitment event!

In the final analysis, a Scout Show is the noise of hundreds of enthusiastic performers and interested spectators. It is the color, smell, music, and excitement of a circus! It is the Handbook of Scouting come to life. It is an all-youth production about the whole Scout family.

For all Cubs, Scouts, Explorers, and Ventures, a Scout Show helps develop team play. All must work together in their Unit to build the exhibit. A Show provides opportunities for Cub Scouts to see what lies ahead in Scouting.

For the Unit the Show provides added program as everyone works together to prepare for it, and later from ideas seen and heard in other Unit exhibits at the Show itself. The Roughrider District Scout Show can and should be one of the biggest Scouting events of the year!

With this year's Scout Show Partnering with the District Pinewood Derby, we are excited to see how spectacular we can make this event. We will be advertising it at the schools and in the community. So be prepared to welcome new faces and encourage current scouts with your booth.

OFFICIAL GUIDELINES FOR SCOUT SHOW

Scouting is an organization that allows all to participate. We learn by doing, whether it is outdoors skills or creating the perfect pinewood derby car. The Scout Show is an opportunity for your members to demonstrate some skill or fun activity they learned in the Scouting Program. And to encourage others to join scouts.

Booths - Booths can be set up on Saturday from 10:00 – 10:45 AM. All booths will be indoors or outdoors. **There is electricity for indoor booths.** Tables will be provided for you.

Additional Materials – Materials such as scissors, decorations, tape, tacks, hammers, saws, flags, paper, etc... must be provided by your own unit.

Scout involvement – We strongly encourage the scouts to play the largest role at the booths. Making the displays, leading the project, helping the visitors, etc.

Selling at Booths – The Scout Show is designed for displays, action programs, and viewing different phases of the BSA program. With this in mind: Units cannot use the Scout Show as a means to sell products.

Fires – No fires are allowed

Loudspeakers & Public Address Systems – These are not allowed. If sound movies/videos are used the volume must be kept down so as not to disturb anyone or interfere with another booth or store.

Uniforms – Scouts will dress in Class “A” uniforms. The only exception will be if the unit theme calls for some other type of apparel.

Clean-up – Each Unit must clean up their area and remove all materials from the building immediately after closing ceremony is completed. **BOOTHS MUST REMAIN STANDING UNTIL CLOSED**, at least 1pm.

Registration – The unit registration form is due by **Wednesday, March 22nd**

CHOOSE A THEME OR PROJECT

This year's theme is "**Scout Carnival**"

CUB SCOUTS ... can choose from the achievements, electives of activities in the Wolf or Bear Books or use ideas from any of the monthly projects. List your first and second choice on the application.

WEBELOS ... are urged to use their Webelo's Books, activity badges, and monthly themes.

SCOUTS ... Select one of the merit badges or one of the Tenderfoot, Second Class or First Class requirements related to Scouting. List first and second choice on your application.

VENTURERS / EXPLORERS ... Use your specialty area to plan your demonstration area.

NOTE: Cub Scout Books, Scout Handbooks and the numerous Leader Manuals will have program ideas.

We will be "labeling" the spot/tables with the Scout Law. Each one will be given a Character Trait, so you may use this as a guide as well. First come, first serve to request one.

POINTS: Worth/Given

1. **PROMPTNESS & DISCIPLINE:** Booth ready for opening of Show. **10**_____
Participates are courteous to the public in all contacts, gracious to those attending, and cooperative with those helping in the booth. (Members present their “best face” to the public at all times - hold visiting inside the booth to a minimum).
2. **ATTENDANCE:** Booth attended at all times (at least two (2) members are in the exhibit or booth at all times; an adult in attendance in Cub Scout booth. If a machine is being used in Scout booth, an adult leader is present for safety precaution). (Cubmaster/Scoutmaster or their Assistant should be present for most of the day.) **10**_____
3. **PERSONAL APPEARANCE:** **ALL** participants in proper uniform, costume, or Explorer Post identification. (Neat & Clean. Protective cover may be used over uniform should the display require it - aprons for cooking, coveralls for painting, etc.) **10**_____
4. **ORIGINALITY:** The booth or demonstration shows unusual originality in its development and design and treatment of subject matter. (Creative use of color and imagination in presenting the subject.) (Is it SCOUT made with adult supervision?) **10**_____
5. **DISPLAY APPEARANCE:** General attractiveness and appeal. (Is it obviously a “scout made” exhibit or is it “factory built”? Did members have a hand in its makeup? According to their age? Is it apparent that extra effort went into the development of the exhibit or was the booth a result of minimum or passive effort? Does it generate audience interest?) (Were all (or most) of the scouts involved in making the booth?) **10**_____
6. **SUBJECT MATTER:** Satisfactory presentation or demonstration of the subject. **15**_____
(How does it compare with others of similar subject matter? Does it merit a look by the public as spectators pass by? Does it tell a story? (Would it interest spectators enough to find out more about the Scouting program?) (Is it educational or informative?)
7. **LIVE ACTION:** A “live” exhibit. (Objects being constructed or demonstrated in their **25**_____
use. Not just a static display. (A booth where the family or youth get involved or attracts their curiosity.)
8. **DISPLAY IDENTIFICATION:** Legible sign giving Unit number, leaders, sponsor, **10**_____
description. (Requirements of merit badge, progress award, skill award, achievement, elective, etc.) (Again - was it prepared by the scouts?)

TOTAL POSSIBLE POINTS: 100_____

NOTE: Ratings will be higher if the Scouts have totally prepared the booth display (i.e., signs, etc.), rather than adult preparation!
