Dear Ordeal Candidate,

Congratulations! You have been approved by your Scoutmaster and elected by the Scouts of your troop to become a member of the Order of the Arrow (OA), Scouting's National Honor Society. Membership in the OA not only marks you as one of the best in Scouting but opens up additional Scouting opportunities for you including National Conferences, Training, High Adventure Opportunities, and new leadership experiences.

Your election was the first step of your induction into the OA. Your next step is to complete the Ordeal. The Ordeal is a 24-hour test of your strength and will. The Ordeal is not done to see if you are worthy for membership in the Order, you've passed that test already by being elected by your fellow Scouts. The Ordeal is a test of your desire to be a part of such a great honor society.

Sometimes candidates are told that they must go through a Call-Out ceremony before they can go through their Ordeal. This is not true. The Call-Out is an optional public recognition of your achievement. You can even go through a Call-Out ceremony after you've completed your Ordeal.

Your first opportunity to undergo the Ordeal is at Spring Conclave. The Chapter Spring Conclave will be taking place May 8-10, at Camp Wilderness. If you are unable to attend this conclave, your next opportunity will be at Fall Conclave, August 14-16 at Heart Butte. If you do not complete the Ordeal within one year from your election, you will have to be elected by your troop again.

Conclave Instructions:

Medical Forms - Per national requirement for Ordeal weekends, you must bring a current Annual Health and Medical form, with the first two parts, completed (Parts A & B), although it is **strongly** recommended that all three parts (Parts A, B, & C) are completed.

Registration - To register for Spring Conclave please visit www.nlcbsa.org under the calendar.

Cost - The total cost for the May Spring Conclave is \$60. The cost includes food. OA handbook, lodge flap (patch), conclave patch, Ordeal sash, induction costs, and other materials. You may wish to bring extra money to purchase items at the Lodge trading post. The trading post will offer many OA items including special patches, OA shirts, fleeces, and other goods.

Friday and Saturday - Plan to arrive Friday night between 6:00 p.m. - 8:30 p.m. If you must arrive later please notify the OA Chapter Adviser (adviser5@pa-hin.com or cell 701-403-7129) and let us know your expected arrival time. Immediately upon arrival, you will register at the Black Building There will be no dinner served on Friday evening, so you should eat before checking in. Ask your Scoutmaster if others were elected in your troop so you can arrange to carpool.

Come prepared to spend the first night of your Ordeal under the stars. You will not be allowed to have a fire Friday night, so don't bring matches or lighters with you. You will need a sleeping bag, ground cloth (plastic tarp), and your raincoat or poncho. Please remember this is Minnesota in May. The weather can vary greatly from very cold to very warm. Check the weather forecast and bring enough clothing. --- Wear Layers! The Chapter Advisers will be watching the weather closely during the week leading up to the event and during the event, to keep each scout safe.

During the Ordeal you will be expected to do physical labor, this may involve lifting, walking, reaching and other strenuous activity. If you are physically incapable or concerned about performing these activities, please contact the Health Officer upon your check-in Friday night and we'll make adjustments as needed. Please also let the health officer know at check-in if you brought any medications with you.

You will need a tent for Saturday, we'd like you to bring your own tent but if you want to share with a buddy that is okay. You must have a tent, no exceptions, even if you are planning an early checkout on Saturday. You will set up your tent on Friday evening in case weather conditions prevent sleeping under the stars and to store your excess gear.

You will want to wear old clothes or work clothes on Friday night and Saturday, but you will need your Scout uniform for Saturday evening and Sunday. A pair of work gloves for Saturday is strongly suggested. Showers are available and all eating utensils, plates are provided.

Check out – Program for the weekend runs through Sunday morning. Checkout will be at 8:30 a.m. Sunday. There will be worship services held during the weekend.

While the program does go through Sunday morning, we understand that some people will need to leave on Saturday. We will open an early checkout from 8:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Saturday evening at the Black Building. You must indicate at registration that you are doing an early checkout.

Here is a list of items you must bring, should not bring, and may want to bring with you on your Ordeal. Your equipment will be checked on Friday to ensure you are prepared.

Things You Must Bring (No Exceptions!):

- Tent (Your own or one you share with a buddy from your troop)
- Sleeping bag
- Ground cloth/plastic tarp Rain gear

Things You Should Bring:

- Class 'A' Scout uniform
- Cold weather gear
- Shower kit
- Work clothes
- Water bottle
- Good boots
- Flashlight
- Prescription medicine (in original container)

Things You Shouldn't Bring:

- Food or snacks
- Scout Medical, complete 3 part form

 Tent (Your own or one you share with allowed to have a fire Friday night)
 - Portable electronics (iPods, video games, etc)
 - Cell phones are discouraged
 - Sheath knives
 - Hatchets, axes, tools

Things You Might Want to Bring:

- · Camera (only limited opportunities to use them though)
- Air or Foam mattress
- · Day pack or regular backpack (may be easier to carry your sleeping bag and ground cloth on Friday night)
- Notebook, pencil, pen

Parents and Non-OA Scouting Leaders – Parents (and non-OA Scout Leaders) are welcome to stay for the weekend if they wish. They should register as a guest during registration. We do discourage them from attending ceremonies if they believe they will be a member of the OA in the future because knowing what happens ruins some of the mystery.

Officer Elections (Chapter 5 Members) – For youth Arrowmen from Chapter 5 we will hold our annual officer elections on Saturday evening immediately following the Ordeal Ceremony. If you win an election, you'll take office June 1st. Offices available:

- Chapter Chief is the top youth leader in the District for the OA program. He sets the goals and agendas for the Chapter.
- Chapter Vice Chief of Program—represents the Chapter Chief when he is not present and oversees the OA Troop Representative program.
- Chapter Vice Chief of Elections Over sees the Unit Election program, includes preparing materials and organizing election dates for each Scouts BSA unit within the district.
- Chapter Secretary Takes minuets at Chapter meetings, submits news articles, and administrates other projects as delegated by the Chapter Chief.

The terms of office are one year; there are no term limits. Election is by majority vote of the chapter's youth membership. The only requirements are:

- You are under 21 years of age for your entire term
- You are a member of the OA (Ordeal, Brotherhood, or Vigil) in good standing (meaning you've paid your dues)
- You are a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America
