The Adventure:

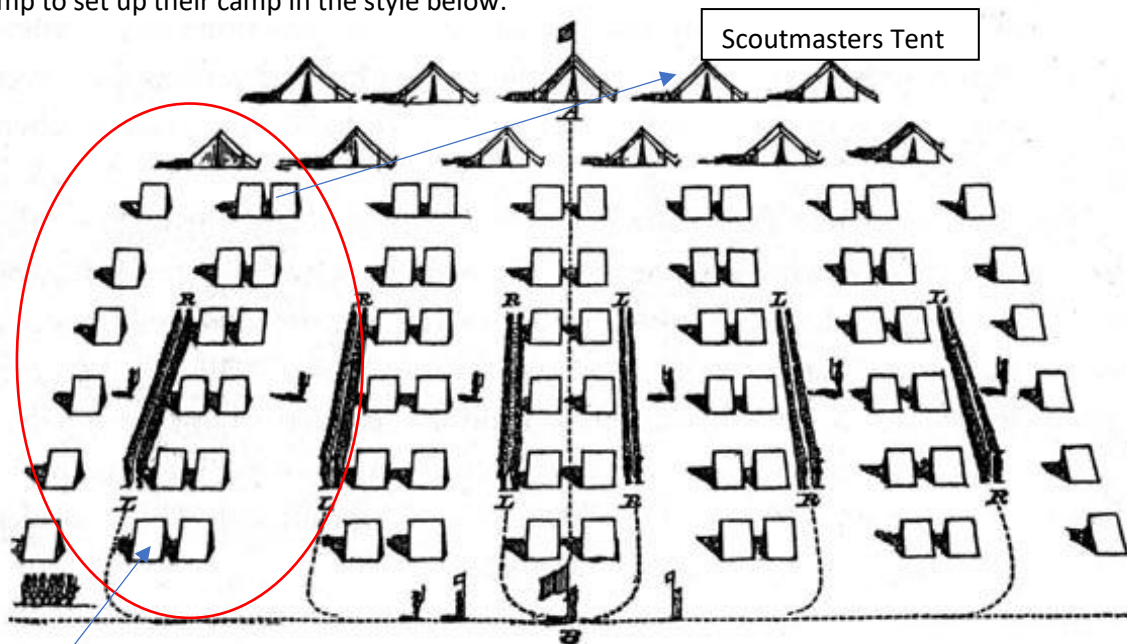
“Scouts depart for their annual Spring Camporee, but as their travels begin, a large storm overtakes the scouts and their leaders. Upon clearing the storm, the scouts and their leaders soon realize that they are no longer in the present as cell service has stopped, vehicles are gone, and the once paved roads have turned to gravel and dirt. As they continue down the road, a fort appears garrisoned by soldiers in blue who appear to have come straight from the American Civil War. To navigate the new world these scouts find themselves in, they must learn what it takes to be a Union soldier in 1862.”

### Logistics

Scouts Tents

Units are responsible for providing the Scouts with their meals along with their dietary needs. Saturday night will be a period recipe challenge in which Troops will be asked to make a period dish for supper. This period dish will not be judged but will provide scouts another opportunity to taste period food. Units will want to bring a plan for gray water usage as water may not be turned on yet.

**Latrine Facilities:** Latrines will be available to use based on Camp Wilderness guidelines.

**Weather, Fire Hazards, Lost Scout:** Camp Staff will have weather band radio, Sheriff Det. Will be aware we are camping at Camp Wilderness. Specific Procedures will be provided to leaders at the Friday evening Cracker Barrel. Storm Shelters will be marked.

**First Aid:** Units will be briefed on the location of the First Aid station at the Friday evening Cracker Barrell. Medical personal will be on staff and available to assist as needed. All scouts should have a personal first aid kit and each scout **MUST** have a water bottle. 911 works for all emergency services.

**Medical Forms:** As stated in the Guide to Safe Scouting, leaders should have the Annual Health and Medical form for each unit member participating in the camp. Please bring a copy of the Health forms along with a copy of the Assumption of Risk Waiver forms. These will be turned in upon check-in.

**Scout Packing List:** Each scout should have their own weather appropriate gear the same as any Spring or Fall Camp to include a sleeping pad. Scouts should have appropriate sleeping gear. Scouts should bring their personal hygiene kit as a scout is **CLEAN**. Activity levels and weather conditions can vary throughout the day. Make every effort to ensure your Scouts are properly dressed. Dress in layers. Being cold and wet can make for a miserable time and risk hypothermia. Adult Leaders ensure all scouts are properly dressed and wearing adequate head, hand, and footwear.

**COVID-19 Precautions:** As COVID-19 is still here, upon check-in each member will be screened by the medical officer at the welcome site and temperatures will be checked. Units are asked to stay within their companies during the course to the weekend and masks will need to be worn when social distancing is not possible and/or are inside buildings.

**Trading Post:** The Trading Post at Camp Wilderness will be open and scouts and adult leaders will have time to visit the trading post in the afternoon during a pre-assigned time.
