<u>Who Should Attend</u>: Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters or any registered adult involved in a Scouts BSA Unit. This course is required to be considered "Trained" for Scoutmasters and Asst. Scoutmasters. *Any* adult that is registered with Scouting America and has current YPT is eligible to take this course. It is not required to be a Scoutmaster or Asst. Scoutmaster to attend.

NOTE: You MUST be a registered, background-checked adult in Scouting America with current YPT to attend this course.
