AOL Scouts:

- ❖ AOL Scouts can attend if hosted by a Troop.
- ❖ AOL Scouts must have a parent attend.
- ❖ AOL Scouts must follow BSA Guidelines for Youth Protection.

Check-In:

- ❖ All troops to check in at the canopy by the front gate.
 - > Need a copy of unit roster.
 - > Provide number of patrols.
 - ➤ A campsite location will be provided.
 - ➤ Patches will be provided for the number registered.
 - > Only vehicles pulling troop trailer will be allowed inside the gate.
- ❖ Check-In Station is open from 5:30 pm to 7:30 pm. If you arrive late, please contact Mike Banish at (513)-319-4932.

Camp:

- ❖ Troop campsite locations will be assigned at check-in.
- You will be assigned a designated campsite with shelter, water, a fire pit, and a KYBO.
- ❖ Trailers will be permitted at campsites if conditions allow.

All vehicles, including vehicles pulling trailers, must be returned to the parking lot.

Campsite Fires:

- Building fires is permitted.
- ❖ Fires must be in designated fire bowls/fire pits.
- Firewood will not be provided.

Rules:

- ❖ Follow the Scout Oath, Scout Law, and Outdoor Code at all times.
- Buddy System at all times.
- The Dining Hall is off limits except for the restrooms.
- ❖ Vandalism will not be tolerated! Please respect all facilities.
- Do not use restrooms for cleaning dishes or camp gear.
- ❖ BSA Youth Protection Policies must be followed at all times.
- Anyone not following these rules will be asked to leave camp.

First Aid:

❖ Each Troop is responsible for their own First Aid supplies and First Aid to their Scouts.

- ❖ Serious injuries to be reported to Mike Banish at (513)-319-4932.
- ❖ Each Troop must have BSA medical forms on site and available.

Troop Volunteers:

- ❖ Each Troop is expected to provide two adult volunteers to help run stations. (Instructions/materials will be provided.)
- ❖ Please provide the names of volunteers at the SPL/SM meeting Friday.

Dumpsters:

All trash must be placed in designated dumpsters at the end of the event.

Water:

Water will be available at all Murdocks throughout camp except at Trailblazer.

Restrooms:

- ❖ KYBOS and porta-johns are available throughout camp.
- ❖ Showerhouse B near the sports field will be open with running water.

What to Bring:

- Scouting Essentials
- ❖ Scout handbook
- ❖ 50ft rope for lashings (it will need to be cut up at the station)
- Fire building materials
 (No accelerants, no lighters, natural materials only)
- ❖ Patrol materials to make your own flag at Station #1

Stations:

- ❖ Everyone starts at Station #1 at Trailblazer (flag-making).
- ❖ After Station #1, patrols will be assigned their next station.
- ❖ After the 2nd Station patrols can go to any of the remaining stations throughout the day.
- ❖ Patrols are required to go to Station #12 as their last station to complete the Final Quest and to turn in all beads.
- Stations are as follows:
 - ➤ Mayflower Marksman
 - ➤ Plymouth Rock Range
 - > Colonial Crafts
 - ➤ Plymouth Paramedics

- > Fletcher's Craft
- ➤ Makeshift Mayflower
- > Settler's Spark
- > Playful Pilgrim
- > Wayfinding
- ➤ Landing at Plymouth Rock
- > The Final Quest

Thanksgiving Feast:

- ❖ Dinner will be served for everyone at the Trailblazer Shelter.
- Turkey is the main dish provided by DBC Catering.
- ❖ Every patrol should bring a Thanksgiving-themed side or dessert to share (enough to feed the number of people in your patrol).
- Bring your own serving utensils.
- Bring your own hot pad or trivet for your dish.
- Bring your own mess kits, utensils, and drinks.
- Clean your dishes at your campsite.
- ❖ Skit and song sign-ups available during dinner (see Anthony Banish).

Closing Campfire Program: (Amphitheater)

- ❖ Each Patrol is to do at least ONE skit or song at the Closing Campfire.
- ❖ See Anthony Banish to sign up before or during dinner.
- ❖ Patrol winners will be announced and prizes distributed.

Check-Out:

- ❖ Troops **must** police their campsite prior to leaving (Leave No Trace).
- All trash cans must be emptied, and trash must be taken to the dumpsters.
