# How to Register Your Unit

1. Select your session
2. Select “Register”
3. Add in the total numbers of each type of camper (youth & adult)
4. Add information to the fields flagged in red.
5. Check out and pay the minimum per person deposits.



# Additional Re-registration Details:

- Registration opens for Packs to reserve an estimated amount of space during a session of camp with a \$100 deposit on November 19th.
- Your Pack will be able to begin adding individual names and initial per person deposits to their reservation starting on January 5th.
- Your initial Pack estimates will continue to hold those spots through February 16th. Any of these spots that have not had an initial per person deposit applied will be released on February 16th.
- Additional individual registrations may be added to your Pack's registration after February 16th until the session reaches capacity.

**\*\$100 deposit is non-refundable, but can be applied towards camper fees.**

# Registration

## Summer Camp Coordinator

- Each Pack should select a Summer Camp Coordinator who takes responsibility for registering the pack and ensuring payments and information are submitted on time.
- They will receive the main confirmation email. This email can be shared with others who will be helping to coordinate the pack registration.
- They can also choose to enable the parent portal feature to allow the families to submit payment and their own camper information directly into Black Pug.

# T-Shirts

- We found that most attendees don't feel strongly about the free shirt.
- To be fiscally responsible, we are no longer giving every attendee a shirt.
- You can choose to add a shirt to your registration for \$12, which allows us to allocate funds towards theming, supplies, and staff.

# Incentives and Deadlines

## Estimate Deadline

**February 16, 2026**

Packs reserve space based on their estimated attendance given upon their initial registration. Those spots will be held until February 16, at which point only those who have paid a minimum of \$50 (youth) or \$35 (adults) will reserve space.

## Slushie Deadline

**March 31, 2026**

Scouts who are registered and paid a minimum of \$50 by March 31<sup>st</sup> will receive a reusable branded cup and get one free slushie every day of camp.

This promotion does not apply to adult attendees.

**Late Fee BEGINS (\$15/person)**

**May 1, 2026**

# Camperships

Up to 50% off Summer Camp Fees

**Application Deadline:** April 11, 2026

Campership will be **forfeited**.

# Refund Policy

The Dan Beard Council will refund all but 20% of fees paid per participant for those who fill out the 2025 Summer Camp Refund Request form, no later than **30 days prior to arrival** at camp. The form can be found at, [www.danbeard.org/campforms](http://www.danbeard.org/campforms).

You may replace the name and information on a registration at no additional fee, but they must be of the same participant type (youth for youth and adult for adult).

No refunds will be given after the 30-day cancellation deadline, except in cases of personal medical reasons as determined by the Council Vice President of Program. To be considered for reimbursement, **a refund must be requested by the unit leadership within two weeks after the first day of your camp session.**

**A doctor's note may be required for refund requests submitted after the 30-day deadline.**

Payments made within a Unit Registration will be refunded back to the Unit in the care of the Contingent Contact. Those who registered as Individuals will have refunds issued back to the payee.

# Individual Camper

Scouts can attend without their Pack, but they are **required to have an adult registered with them**. However, if 2 or more youth from the same Pack are attending Cub Camp together, **they must provide their own adult supervision**. Those registered as Individuals will not be able to reserve their sleeping accommodation during registration, though they can indicate their preference.

## Seconds

Campers that attend a Cub Camp session can attend a second session for a \$25 discount (this applies for all types of Cub Camp offered through the Dan Beard Council). The second's discount is **ONLY** for the individual. Families cannot get a Seconds discount for another child if one child is already attending.

# Adults at Camp Policy

Cub Camp requires 1 registered adult (over 21) for every 4 Cubs with a minimum of 2 registered adults (over 21) per pack.

For those bringing female youth, BSA policy requires you have at least one female registered adult (over 21).

Rising Tigers/Incoming 1<sup>st</sup> Graders MUST have an Adult Partner with them.

## Registered Adult/Leader

- Over 21

- Registered with the Council (BSA ID Number)

- SYT

## Parent/Adult

- Over 18

- Not registered with the Council

- SYT

## Required Ratios

Cubs to Registered Adult Leaders	1:4
Incoming 1 <sup>st</sup> Graders/Tigers to Parents	1:1

Remember that every Pack needs a **minimum of 2** registered adult leaders.

# Adults at Camp Policy

**ALL Adults (Leaders and Parents) at camp must have current Youth Protection Training. Proof of SYT will be requested at Check-In.**

# What To Bring

- Annual Health & Medical Record (Must be signed by a physician for Webelos Camp)
- Personal medications
- Scout age handbook (to prevent damage place in a plastic bag)

- Close toed Boots/shoes (suitable for hiking.)
- Raincoat or poncho
- Clothing including uniform (field uniforms are encouraged at flag ceremonies, but not required)
- “Creeking” clothes – an extra change of clothes, shoes, and socks. These will get WET.
- Swimsuit
- Laundry bag
- Pocketknife (Scouts must have earned their Whittlin’ Chit to carry a pocketknife)
