Activity Descriptions

Taiga Heat - Participate in fire building activities to challenge yourself to keep warm in the Alaskan winter.

Frosty Knots – Test your pioneering survival skills in Alaskan conditions. Work as a team to construct helpful backcountry gadgets.

Blizzard Building – Construct a blizzard resistant shelter big enough for two scouts to bunker down in, using only natural materials and items from your sled.

Garbage Hoops – It's a new twist on an old favorite: Trash Can Basketball

Alaskan Cooking – At cracker barrel, each patrol will present an evening snack or dessert, prepared in a Dutch oven as part of a shared camp snack during the auction. If you are camping in an inconvenient campsite, we will have cooking stations available at the dining hall. You will need to bring all of your supplies to prepare your dish with you.

Lumberjacking - Did you know Juneau is the only US Capital not accessible by road? Test your Alaskan strength to chop through all the wood you would need to survive the Alaskan Taiga.

Alaskan Aim – This station is scored from the best target in the patrol. The goal is to group all 10 shots within the size of a quarter.

Backcountry Medic - Work with a real First Responder to learn all the wilderness first aid skills you would need to survive the backcountry.

Escape Room - Work as a group to solve a series of puzzles to escape the room.

Frozen Axes - This station is scored from the best target in the patrol. Inner ring= 10 golden nuggets, middle ring= 6 golden nuggets, outer ring= 3 golden nuggets.

Husky Homestead - Patrols will race their sled up the sledding hill, competing for the fastest time in camp! Patrols will be timed and recorded throughout the day. Golden Nuggets will be awarded at the auction based on ranking.

Gold Rush - Pan for gold nuggets and minerals like real 49ers and create your own panning apparatus.

Frontier Preparedness - Have each member of your patrol successfully hang and secure a bear bag.

Find your claim - Cache your way through your day at Firelands. Each cache will have a clue and maybe a few golden nuggets leading you to the mega cache containing your "Claim paper". Claims will be exchangeable for additional golden nuggets at the auction.

Other Information

VISITORS

We love having visitors out at camp to see what's happening! **We do ask that visitors ALWAYS check in at the office and get a wristband so that we have an accurate count of who is in camp in case of emergency.**

PETS

Pets are not permitted in camp at any time during the camping season in compliance with the Ohio State Health and Safety Codes. This policy does not pertain to pets of the Ranger or service animal.

VEHICLES IN CAMP

All Pack and personal vehicles must be parked in the main parking lot. In the event of a camp service vehicle or camp ranger vehicle traveling through camp, all people should stop and step off to one side of the road and face the driver until the vehicle passes. We have plenty of scouts, but none to spare -. The speed limit on all camp roads is 10 mph.

TRASH

The dumpsters/dump truck are located near the Dining Hall. If you inform us of full trash bags, we can transport them to the dumpsters from your campsite.

Please make sure all bags are tied tightly!

LATRINES

The latrines at your campsite are your Patrol's responsibility. If you need cleaning supplies or toilet paper, please ask and we will do our best to accommodate you. If you need a spray bottle of disinfectant or a scrub brush, a request can be made at the camp office.

Remember to keep the lids down when not in use, as this allows the smelly gases to escape out the chimney and not into your latrine.

SHOWER HOUSES/RESTROOMS

Flush toilets and hot showers are available as a convenience to campers. Showerhouses are located by the Dining Hall. Occasionally unsanitary conditions require us to temporarily close the facilities until the responsible parties correct the situation. Shower houses are meant to supplement—not replace the washstands and latrines in the campsites.

LOST & FOUND

Articles found should be deposited in the box at the Dining Hall. Unclaimed items will be either thrown away or donated to a clothing bank at the end of the camping season. We will make every attempt to return a well labeled item to its rightful owner. Valuable items (knives, watches, etc.) should be turned in to the Health Office or Office. Please remind your scouts to check the Lost & Found box often, or check with the Office if they are missing an item.

Emergency Information

Camp Avery Hand, Firelands Scout Reservation has a siren that can be heard from the entirety of camp. If you hear the the siren please report to the dining hall as quickly and efficiently as possible. Most likely it is due to severe weather or we are in need of a head count.

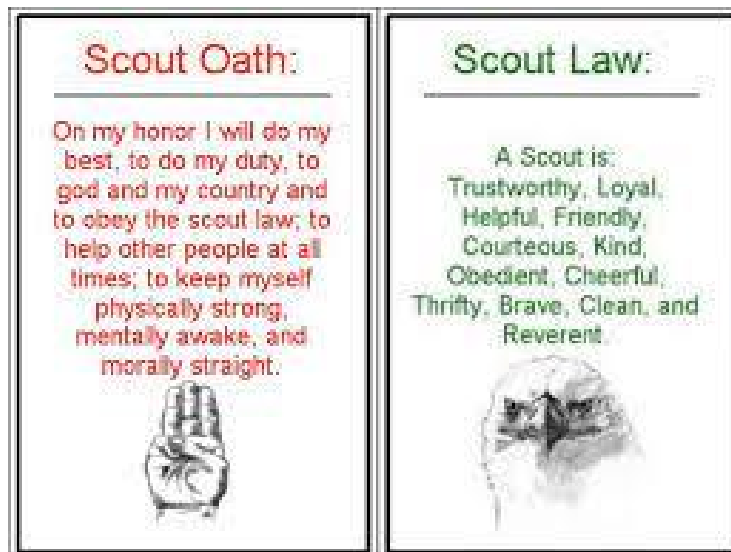

Lake Erie Council Smoking Policy



It is not the intent of the Lake Erie Council to take issue with the smoking preferences of individuals. Lake Erie does acknowledge its responsibility to demonstrate a healthy lifestyle and personal responsibility and concern for the health of others and to the youth served by the Council.

Therefore, the following guidelines have been implemented at all Lake Erie council offices, stores, and camps.

- Smoking is prohibited in all offices, stores, and enclosed spaces at all offices and camp areas owned or operated by the Lake Erie council.
- At both camps, a designated smoking area will be identified in an outside area and in a location sufficiently apart from areas utilized by youth attending camp activities.
- The designated smoking areas for Camp Wyandot and Camp Avery Hand at Firelands Scout Reservation are the parking lots. Smoking in the campsites is strictly forbidden.
- Please “Field Dress” and dispose of butts appropriately in the trash receptacles.
