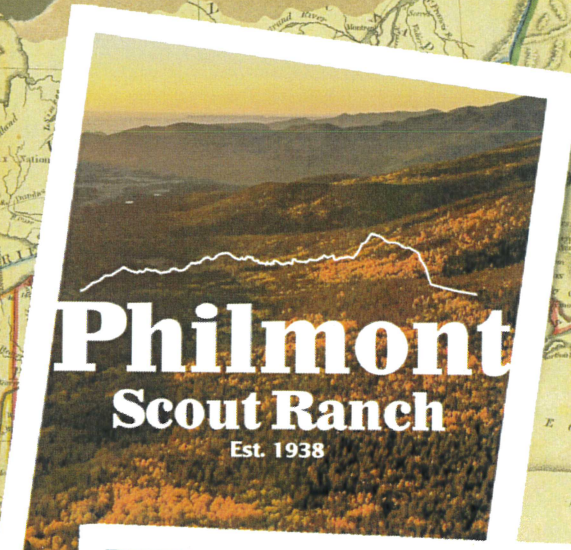
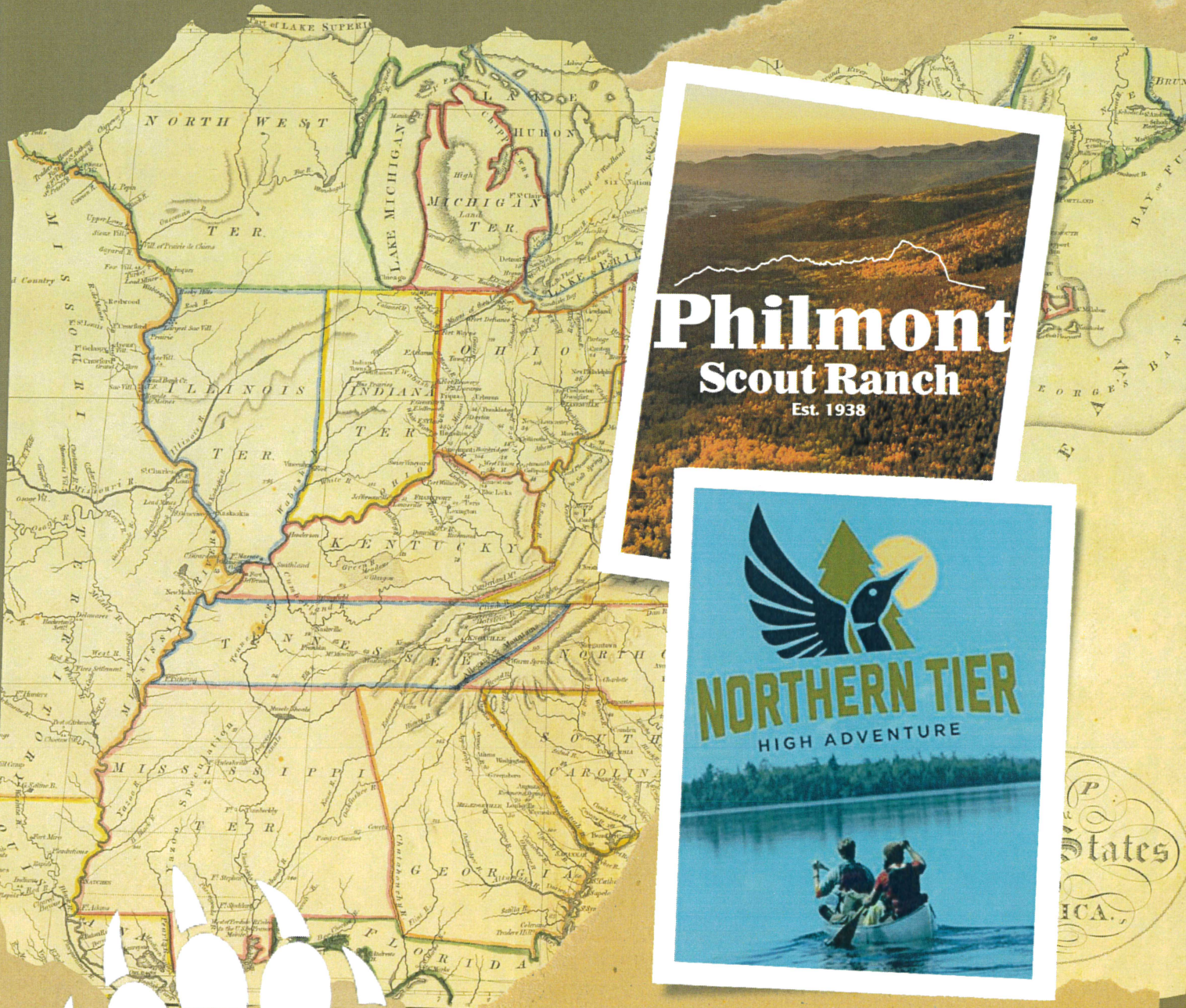
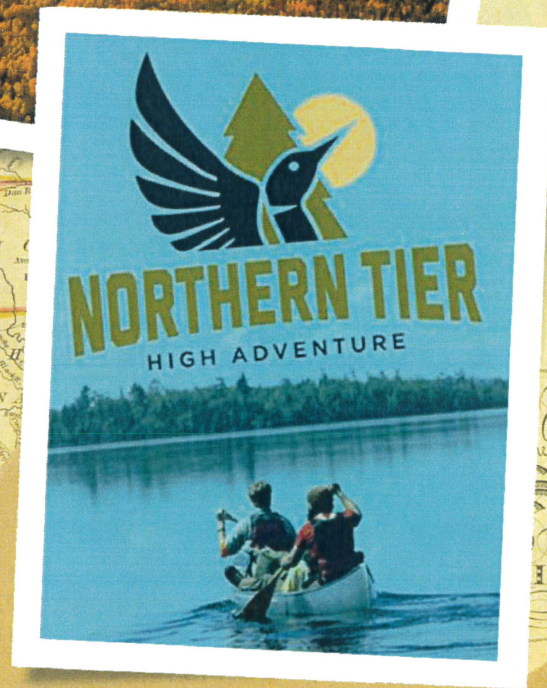

Cooking Challenge - Bears! Last night the bears on the ranch stole your pots, pans, and most of your utensils. Base camp is miles away. Try to cook an egg, and bacon, in only a paper bag and an orange!

Fire-building Race - Practice your fire-building skills with a fire-building race!

Pioneering Project Contest - Build a helpful contraption with rope, lashings, pioneering poles, and scout engineering! This project could be for comfort, utility, or help you cook.

Shelter Building - Practice your outdoor survival skills by building a shelter to withstand the elements.

Dutch Oven Cookoff - Show your outdoor cooking skills during the Dutch oven cookoff. Make sure to include the secret ingredient!

Pull a Canoe Race - Why pull a sled when you can pull a canoe?

Cold Water Rescue - You're off on the cold high seas and *Crash* your patrol's boat is taking water! Practice your first aid with cold water-specific first aid scenarios.

Ship/Maritime Knots - Prepare for sailing in the Keys by demonstrating your scout knot skills!

Ice Cream Station - What better to beat the Florida heat than with a delicious treat?

2 Man Ski Race - Prepare to trek the snow with a buddy in a race!

Maple Syrup Station - Minnesota doesn't have just snow and cold, it has syrup! Learn how to tap a tree and enjoy a maple syrup treat.

Two-Man Saw Competition - Show off your strength in a two-man saw competition!

General Rules and Info for the Event:

-Trash from campsites must be disposed of at the dumpsters in the McIntosh Parking Lot, near the Beau-Mart, behind the Augustus, or the McCahill Parking Lot.

Medical Forms & Health Officer: As stated in the Guide to Safe Scouting, leaders should have the Annual Health and Medical Form for each unit member participating in the event. These are especially important to have if a Scout will be attending the event without a parent. The form can be downloaded from the Lake Erie Council website. The Health Lodge is located next to the Augustus Training Center; the health officer will be on staff 24 hours a day throughout the weekend.

You will also need to have the Activity Acknowledgement form per participant signed by a parent or guardian before you arrive at camp.

Adult Participation: In order to comply with Youth Protection "Two Deep" guidelines, all members of your troop must have Youth Protection. Two adults over the age of 21 must be registered BSA leaders. All Leaders **MUST** be registered.

Sign in/Check in: All units must check-in each person present for the event, no exceptions. Please have a fully-typed roster for the office. See the form on the Council Website.

Alcoholic Beverages and Drugs: Possession and/or use of alcoholic beverages or drugs are prohibited. You will be asked to leave the Klondike if found with either and may be prosecuted.

Parking, Driving & Trailers in Camp: Please take only 1 vehicle per unit to your campsite. Try to stay on the road to avoid getting stuck.

Check-Out: Schedule a time with Jan at the office. That is the time you should be fully packed up, and the campsite patrolled. One of the event staff will arrive to inspect your campsite. Once your site is inspected, you will receive your patches. Once you receive your patches, you will be cleared to leave!
