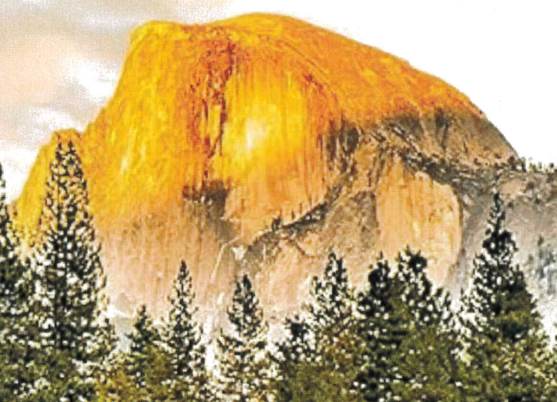




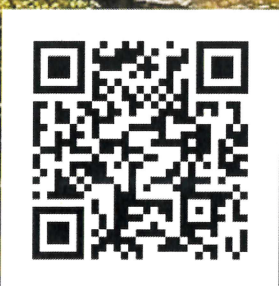

Campsite rental is included in participant cost. Campsites will be assigned within 1 week prior to the event. Contact Colleen if you have campsite preferences. Cabin rentals are separate from participant registration. Early Bird rates are available through **December 31st, 2023 @ 11:59 p.m.** Registration closes Wednesday, January 15, 2024 @ 11:59 p.m. Day-of Registration Fee applies to late registrants who register by emailing Anthony Dworning after January 15, 2024.

Volunteer Opportunities- WE NEED YOU! We are looking for volunteers to run stations! If you are interested in running a station, email Kim and Liam with your station of interest. All materials will be at the assigned locations for the event, if there are supplies you believe are needed please notify Kim. Station Mayors will need to check in Saturday morning by 8:10am at the Augustus before reporting to the station. As the Mayor of the station, you are expected to be at the station from 8:15 am-12, and then from 1:45-4:45. Please contact Kim and Liam ASAP to sign up for your stations.

National Parks Klondike Stations: All Stations are worth 20 Points

Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park - Kilauea is one hot place! So is your fire! Test your fire building skills to build the best fire possible!

Cuyahoga Valley National Park - Chug your way through the sled train obstacle course

Grand Canyon - Practice your lashing skills building a bridge to cross the "canyon"

Yellowstone National Park - Recreate the majesty of Old Faithful. Build your own geyser.

Glacier National Park - Take on the frozen tundra and make your own ice cream

Redwood National Park - Not nearly as cool as the Redwoods try out your skills at two-man saw

Arches National Park - Do your best to aim your bow and arrow at the Arches

Denali National Park - Just think, you got stuck in the middle of the woods! You're lost and some of your patrol members are hurt! You will have to solve wilderness first aid scenarios to safely make your way out!

Mammoth Cave National Park - Caves are tight and require some maneuvering. Fit your sled and contents and all people through varying levels of tight squeezes!

Crater Lake National Park - Test your hand at creating your own crater through shotgun shooting.

Everglades National Park - Ever wanted to lasso a 'croc'? Now's your chance!

Acadia National Park - Work together to save your patrol from the cold winter days in Maine and snowshoe your way through the trail!

Shenandoah National Park - Just like the Appalachian Trail, you'll meander your way through the orienteering course.

New River Gorge National Park - Your team became stuck on the other side of the gorge! You must create a "zipline" and successfully zip them their supplies!

Theodore Roosevelt National Park - Just like Teddy has his face carved on a mountainside it is your job to wood carve the famous Beaumont Gateway!

White Sands National Park - Using your excavating skills, you will be working to crack the code!

Katmai National Park - Bears, oh my! Work with your patrol to successfully hang a bear bag and keep your supplies safe!

National Park Service - Keep your parks clean! Aim your “trash” into the trash cans through a series of challenges in order to be successful!

Mesa Verde National Park - Admire the beautiful architecture of Mesa Verde! Test your skills and create your own inspired outdoor shelter!

Pinnacles National Park - Just like the tectonic plates created the cliffs and pinnacles found here! Your patrol will use spatulas to carve out your own pinnacles!

All National Monuments - National Parks aren't the only thing the NPS has to offer! Be sure to travel around camp and check out all of the National Monuments posted in our scavenger hunt! You will complete a message to know you're done!

Smoky Mountain National Park - You are enjoying a nice scout trip near the Smoky Mountains and are hungry! Dutch oven cook your lunch for the day using the ingredients that your patrol provides with a mystery secret ingredient provided the day of. Scouts are expected to light charcoal using their chimneys.

General Rules and Info for Event:

-Trash from campsites must be disposed of at the dumpsters in the McIntosh Parking Lot, near the Beau-Mart, behind the Augustus, or the McCahill Parking Lot .

Medical Forms & Health Officer: As stated in the Guide to Safe Scouting, leaders should have the Annual Health and Medical Form for each unit member participating in the event. These are especially important to have if a Scout will be attending the event without a parent. The form can be downloaded from the Lake Erie Council website. The Health Lodge is located next to the Augustus Training Center; the health officer will be on staff 24 hours a day throughout the weekend.

You will also need to have the Activity Acknowledgement form per participant signed by a parent or guardian before you arrive at camp.

Adult Participation: In order to comply with Youth Protection "Two Deep" guidelines, all members of your troop must have Youth Protection. Two adults over the age of 21 must be registered BSA leaders. All Leaders MUST be registered.

Sign in/Check in: All units must check-in each person present for the event, no exceptions. Please have a fully-typed roster for Jan at the office. See the form on the Council Website.

Alcoholic Beverages and Drugs: Possession and/or use of alcoholic beverages or drugs are prohibited. You will be asked to leave the Klondike if found with either, and may be prosecuted.

Parking, Driving & Trailers in Camp: Please take only 1 vehicle per unit to your campsite. Try to stay on the road to avoid getting stuck.

Check-Out: Schedule a time with Jan at the office. That is the time you should be fully packed up, campsite patrolled. One of the event staff will arrive to inspect your campsite. Once your site is inspected, you will receive your patches. Once you receive your patches, you will be cleared to leave!
