#### **SLED/PATROL EQUIPMENT:**

Charcoal will be provided for those participating in the Jimmie O'Dell Gold Griddle and Webelos Bronze Bowl

AT Check in each patrol will be assigned a patrol number and assigned to a rotation group. You must give the assigned number for scoring.

-Patrols will check-in with the station leads, and the lead will then send them to a mini event. Station leads are responsible for keeping patrols moving through mini events. -All activities will be based off of eight (8) patrol members. (For the sake of timed events to make it fair for smaller patrols.)

-Adults are expected to allow patrols to function on their own as much as possible.

Theme: Claim Jumpers and Deputy Marshals.

The gold fields always had a few bad apples, namely claim jumpers. We have recieved information that there is a claim jumper (hereafter referred to as the CJ) roaming around at this Klondike. Beware!!! we are tring our best to capture this villian, but so far we have been unable to catch the rascal. To help everyone we are starting out each patrol with 100 extra points in case you meet the CJ. If the CJ finds your patrol do not resist, but find a deputy marshal and file a report and we will restore the points. If you do not file a report with the deputy marshals the points will not be returned! Since we are making charcoal at this event please submit a charcoal sketch of the CJ to aid us in finding the CJ. Bonus points awarded for the best drawing of the CJ.

**Note to Scoutmasters**, we have asked and the CJ has agreed that CJ will only take points from the 100 that each patrol starts with, not any points earned at stations

#### Station 1: Moritz Pavilion area

Materials needed: Scout spirit, sense of humor, open mind.

This station is all about games

Activities could include

4 / 6 man skis, Snoe Shoes kind of, Other snow activities – or other activities depending on whether we have snow or mud.

#### Station 2: Scoutcraft / Amphitheater Area

Fire and charcoal

Materials needed: Safety glasses, Patrols Favorite camp gadget

<u>Charcoal</u> – Saw some wood and make charcoal.

<u>Favorite Camp gadget</u> – show and demonstrate your patrols favorite camp gadget! Other activities tbd if needed.

#### (in Front of Ford Commissioner Cabin)

Lunch instructions: See Gold Griddle rules. Will be added as separate attachments. If your Patrol is not comfortable participating in the Gold Griddle ....don't. We do not want anyone to feel at risk for the sake of the competition. Please cook in your campsite / cabin.

After cooking, put out your fire and put your garbage in a trash bag before throwing it in a trash can. Rough clean your utensils, cookware, etc. using water or snow. You may finish cleaning your gear, later at your campsite. Make sure your cooking area is absolutely clean before you depart. No debris or garbage is to be buried.

Metal ground cover and hot charcoal will be provided.

#### Station 4: Stake your claim Sports pavilion on Schwartz road

Materials needed: Compass, first aid kit, other materials from sled items.

*Find your pace*— how to measure distance using your pace length.

*Find your claim* – Using your compass and pace find and stake your claim.

*<u>First-aid</u>* – accident may happen on the way to your claim. Be ready to render first-aid.
