Event Philosophy ~ Rules & Guidelines

Purpose of the Klondike/Webelos Winter Challenge is to Demonstrate Winter Camping, Scout, & Survival Skills in a fun, safe & competitive manner with as equal a playing field as possible. Therefore, the following rules shall apply:

1. Camp sites are to be reserved with units contacting Ken Fortuna at LECKlondike@gmail.com to request a site. Sites will be allocated according to size of Troops and available sites. Multiple Units may be assigned to each campsite. Cabins will be reserved for the Webelos. You are asked to make reservations in advance for cabin space for either Friday or Saturday night, staying only one night so that we can accommodate the number of Webelos wishing to attend. **Please send your troop #, 1st 2nd & 3rd choices for camp site and the number of attendees with your request.**
2. No Scout will be permitted to participate in any event if not properly dressed and dry. If Scouts get unnecessarily wet, dirty, or snow covered as a result of rolling or playing in the snow, mud, or water, they will be disqualified from participating in events. Absolutely no one will be allowed to participate in the Klondike Race if not properly dressed & booted, *i.e.*, no spandex, T-shirts, and non-winter sock & boot type footwear.
3. Groups of Scouts (Patrols) participating in events will be broken into two (2) categories by rank: Scout ~ 1st Class & Star ~ Eagle, with flexibility for those Troops without sufficient numbers to field multiple patrols by rank categories, or possibly some fashion of handicapping. Ventures will participate as one group.
4. Participating Troops/Crews are encouraged to tent camp.
5. Webelos are encouraged to attend with a sponsoring Troop willing to be responsible for them and permit them to participate in events with a patrol or with a Senior Scout from their Troop assigned to be the event guide along with the pack adult leaders. Cabin reservations are on a first sign up basis. Webelos may also come out for the day without staying overnight. **All Webelos must participate in the planned program and be supervised by adult leaders.**
6. Volunteer Scouts (Senior Staff) are to set up and run events where appropriate. It is hoped that each participating Troop will provide two such Senior Scouts to be teamed up with Adult Event Mentors for this purpose.

PARKING SPACE IS LIMITED. WE ARE ASKING ALL UNITS TO CARPOOL AS MUCH POSSIBLE.

Scouts, Ventures and Webelo Patrols are to Bring:

1. Sled for each patrol ~ can lash event items to regular sled if need to.
2. 50 feet of ¼ inch and 50 feet 3/8 or 1/2 inch rope for the events.
3. Please bring water for your patrol use.
4. Dutch Oven if needed for each competing patrol in Jimmie O'Dell's Gold Griddle Cooking Competition
5. Saturday lunch for Troop and Troop Sponsored Webelo Patrols
6. Two copies of recipe on index card, duty roster & ingredients for each Patrol's Jimmie O'Dell's Gold Griddle lunch
7. Mess kit, Sierra cup, utensils for each Scout and all utensils needed for cooking.
8. Compass for each competing patrol
9. Ingredients for dinner at campsite or prepay for dinner in Dining Hall
10. Patrol Flag on pole for each competing Patrol
11. Sack to hold Klondike Gold Coins won during events & to bring to Council Fire Auction
12. One can of soup each (no cream or seafood based – to be turned in at registration)
13. Two Staves for a stretcher
14. Tarp or blanket to make a stretcher

Campground Rules

- 1) **BSA “Guide to Safe Scouting”**: All units are expected to know and adhere to requirements established in the guide book.

- 2) **ABSOLUTLY NO VEHICLES WILL BE PERMITTED IN THE CAMP DURING THE EVENT. Questions? Please email Lisa Shrock at lmsrock@gmail.com**
- 3) **Fires**: Unattended fires are not permitted at Camp Stigwandish. Charcoal cooking is permitted in the fire ring or raised off the ground.
- 4) **Latrines**: Each person is responsible for leaving the latrine clean and usable for the next person. Toilet paper is the responsibility of each unit for their own campsite. Common area latrines will be stocked by the Commissioner Staff.
- 5) **Camp Cleanliness**: Each person is responsible for keeping their campsite and any common areas around their campsite clean. Let’s leave the camp better than we found it.
- 6) **First Aid**: Each unit should have its own First Aid Kit. Be prepared to handle all minor first aid cases in your campsite. First Aid emergencies beyond the unit’s capabilities should be brought to the Medical Office located in the **Rotary Building**. All First Aid situations **must** be reported to the Health Officer.
- 7) **Damages**: The unit is expected to pay for all damages caused by its members to the camp property or equipment.
- 8) **Strictly Prohibited**: Absolutely **NO** alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs are permitted at Camp Stigwandish. Also **NO** personal firearms or weapons of any kind are permitted on Camp Stigwandish property. **NO** fixed blades or sheathed knives.
- 9) With the safety of our scouts, leaders and staff as our top priority. **No** personal vehicles will be allowed in camp during the Klondike. Only vehicles with a camp permit issued by the event chairman will be allowed in camp. Parking will be available in the camps parking lot. Trailers can still be parked by the quartermaster building (or at the boathouse if no room is left at the Quarter maters building. Trailers must be kept as far off of the roadways as possible to allow Emergency Vehicles access to the camp.

All camp roads must remain open during the Klondike for emergency vehicles to get through.

Health & Safety

Medical Forms

A health history, revised within the past *twelve* months is required of each camper and adult regardless of age. All campers who are at the Camp Stigwandish Klondike Derby are required to have a medical form on file with their units. **A copy of all the medical forms must be at camp with the Unit Leader in case of an emergency.**

All participants in all Scouting activities complete Part A and Part B. Give the completed forms to your Unit Leader. This applies to all activities, day camps, local tours, and weekend camping trips less than 72 hours. Update at least annually.

Part A is an informed consent, release agreement, and authorization that need to be signed by every participant (or a parent and/or legal guardian for all youth under 18).

Part B is general information and a health history.

Campers and adults without proper medical forms are not permitted to remain in camp.

Make sure to double check the following items on health forms before coming to camp:

Emergency name, address, and phone number are listed on the medical form.

Parent or guardian signatures and dates (current year).

All immunizations must show the most recent date.

Medications

The taking of prescription medication is the responsibility of the individual taking the medication and/or that individual's parent or guardian. A leader, after obtaining all the necessary information, can agree to accept the responsibility of making sure a youth takes the necessary medication at the appropriate time, but BSA does not mandate or necessarily encourage the leader to do so. Also, if state laws are more limiting, they must be followed. BSA camp standards may modify this for specific camp operation.

First Aid

An individual trained in first aid will be available at all times. For emergencies, the camper will be transported to a nearby hospital where a physician is on duty. All registered Scouts are covered by minimal accident insurance (which is secondary to the family's own insurance plan). Please report all injuries and illnesses immediately to the Health Officer located in the Rotary Building.

Alcohol, Illegal Drugs or Stimulants

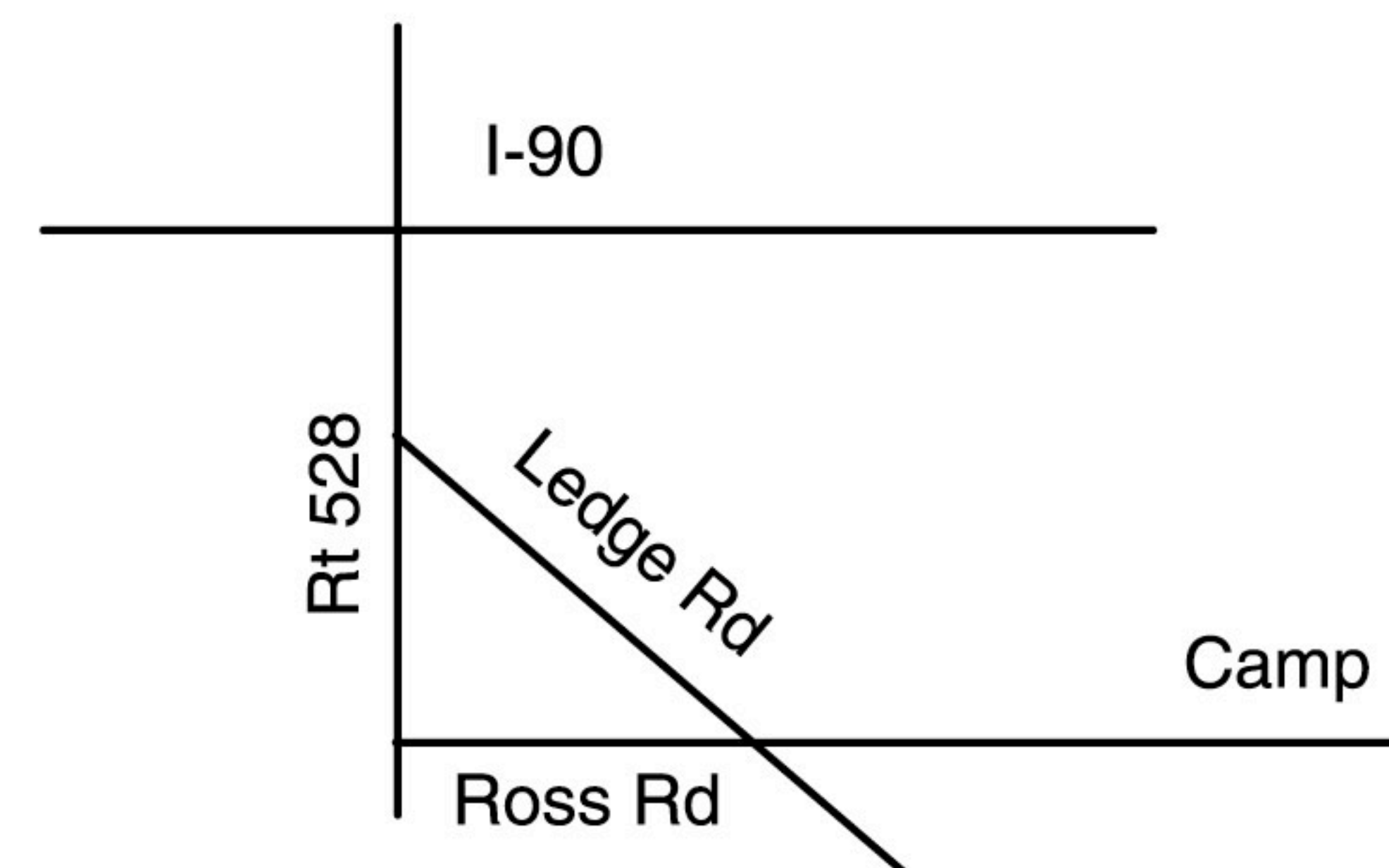
It is the policy of our council that under no circumstance shall alcohol, illegal controlled substance or paraphernalia associated with illegal substances be brought onto, held in possession, or consumed on any camp property. Any violation of this policy shall be cause for immediate removal from camp as well as referral to the appropriate legal authority. The Council reserves the right to require testing of those suspected of the use or abuse of such substances. In addition, those who knowingly withhold information related to the use and/or possession of alcohol or a controlled substance on camp property shall also be removed from camp. The above policy, and consequences so noted, shall not be open to arbitration or negotiation.

Firearms at Camp

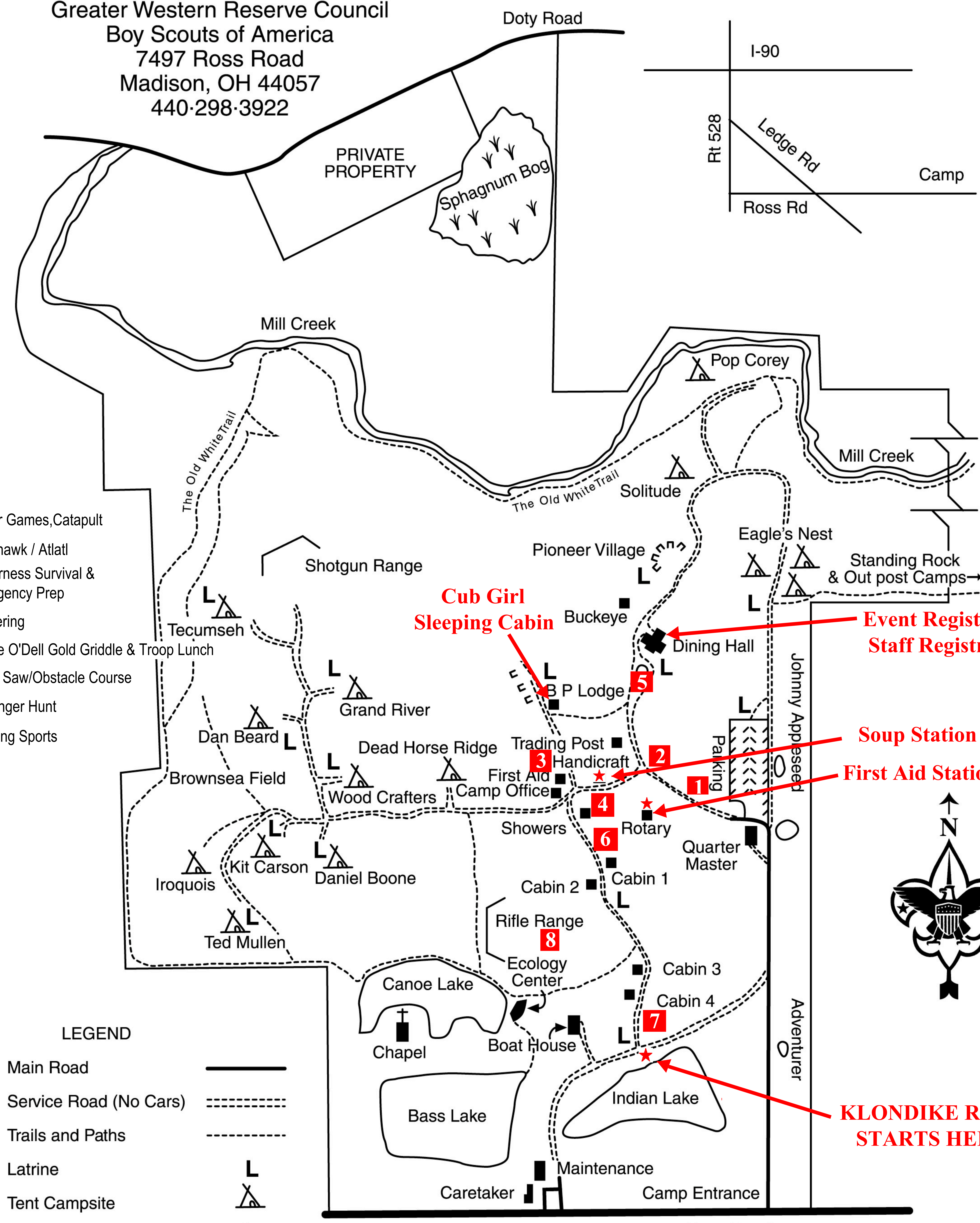
Except for law enforcement officers required to carry firearms within their jurisdiction, firearms shall not be brought on camping, hiking, backpacking, or other Scouting activities except those specifically planned for target shooting under the supervision of a currently certified BSA national shooting sports director or National Rifle Association firearms instructor.

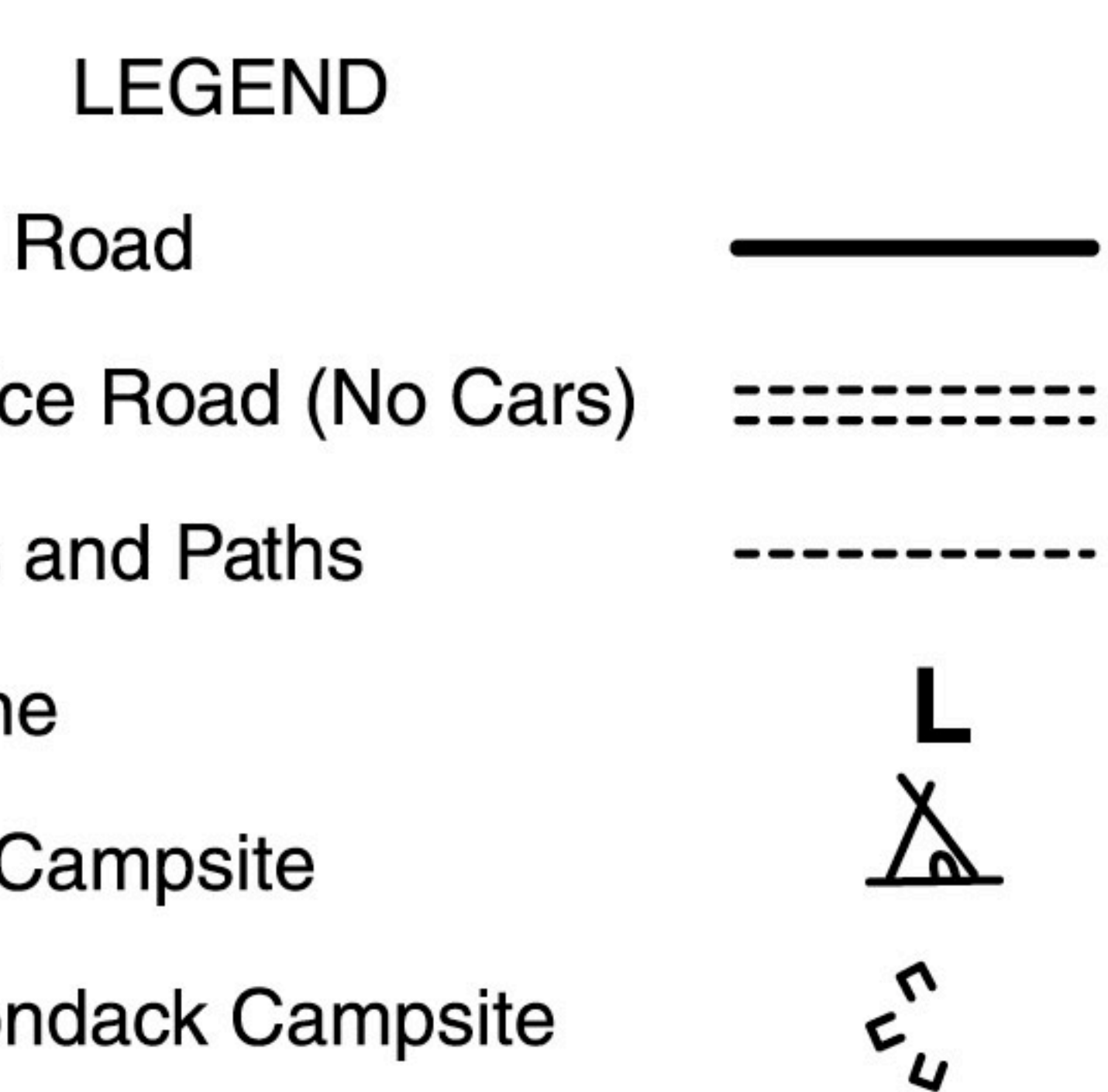

The Meal:

1. Scouts should prepare their best **Noodle** recipe
2. A noodle of some type must be included in your meal but feel free to expand on this with seasonings or added ingredients. There is no limit to what recipes can be used.

The Rules:

1. The meal must be prepared during the lunch period provided
2. **Only** Scouts should be prepping the meal
3. Any adult help will disqualify the entry from your Troop/Patrol
4. No pre-cooking ingredients
5. This will be the same lunch that's served to your Troop/Patrol
 - a. If you have Webelos with your Troop, this should include them as well



Other Items:

1. A charcoal fire will be provided
2. Meal can be prepared in a Dutch oven or other suitable manner provided it is over the charcoal fire provided
3. As usual, a good sized portion must be provided for the judges
4. Entries will be gathered by the Scout Judge's Panel at the Dining Hall Lunch Circle
5. Judges are experienced and trustworthy Scouts

What are the judges looking for?

Qualifying entries will be judged on:

- Taste
- Recipe card presented
- Originality
- Suitable for camping



Helpful Hints:

Trying your recipe on a campout before Klondike is very helpful.
Be creative with your recipe!

Klondike/Webelos Winter Challenge Program

The Klondike Derby/Webelos Winter Challenge will once again be hosted by the troops of Camp Stigwandish. There will once again be eight challenging program stations. One of those stations will be the Jimmie O'Dell Gold Griddle competition (see page for the details). At the end of program the highlight of the Klondike Derby, the sled race, will be run. A Campfire and then the ever popular Klondike Auction(Troops Only) will end the day in the dining hall.

Program stations will include:

Station #1 (All)

Winter Games: Be prepared for anything. One thing is for sure. It will be fun.

Catapult: We are going to be tossing something for distance.

Station #2 (All)

Tomahawk/Atlatl Throw: Learn to throw this primitive device. Can you hit the target and score points?

Station #3 (All)

Wilderness Survival / Emergency Preparedness: The scout motto is Be Prepared. You can never get enough experience in first aid or survival skills. What will you do in case of emergency? How are your shelter building skills?

Station #4 (All)

Pioneering: The knowledge of all your knots will be very helpful at this station.

Station #5 (Troops, Crews Teams, Posts)

Jimmie O'Dell Gold Griddle Competition: See attached rules. Competition is in front of the Dining Hall. Please turn in your recipe when you turn in your food entry.

Station #6 (All)

Two Man Saw and Branding: Participants will learn what it was like to cut wood in years gone by. Using a two man saw participants will work together to cut off a disc. Brand your disc when you are finished.

Obstacle Course: Can your patrol move through the obstacle course? Knowing the T-1 skills will be helpful here.

Station #7

Scavenger Hunt: Scouts will learn their pace to assist them during the scavenger hunt. You will get lost without your compass and knowing how to use it.

Station #8 (All)

Shooting Sports: (Troops, Crews Teams, Posts) Participants will first review shooting sports safety with staff followed by a demonstration of lead ball molding. Scout Patrols will be directed to the rifle range for an opportunity to fire a black powder rifle.

Webelos scouts will be shooting with sling shots.

Tokens earned at each station will be based on patrol participation, the patrol method and scout spirit.

Webelo Scouts are not eligible to earn tokens during the Webelos Winter Challenge

Eligible Participants – Boy Scouts, Venture Scouts & Webelo Scouts

Any registered Boy Scout, Venture Scout or Webelo Scout are welcome to attend and participate in the Klondike Derby or Webelos Winter Challenge.

Klondike/Webelos Winter Challenge Sled Race (All)

Meet on the roads out by the lakes. See the map 4:10pm

Vespers (All)

Scout Staff: Each Troop & Venturing Crew present at Klondike must have an appointed Chaplain Aide to assist at Vespers.

Council Fire & Awards Ceremony (All)

Auction (Troops Only) with Klondike coins changed into tickets earned at events will be used to allow Scouts to acquire Troop type equipment.

First Aid Station

First Aid station is located at the Rotary Cabin for any Scout or Scouter that needs First Aid. Coffee, Hot Chocolate, and Soup will be available.

Check-In/Check-Out Procedures - Troops

Check-In

- Check-In will start at 7:00 pm on Friday January 25, 2019 in the **Dining Hall**. Please do not arrive before this time.
- Saturday Check In January 26, 2019 will start at 7:30am in the **Dining Hall**.
- **Please bring a roster of every scout and leader who will be attending the Klondike.** Using the camp roster form in this leader guide will help you put your unit into patrols. This will aid us during the registration process. Please include your campsite and Unit Leader on the form.
- More than one unit may be assigned to a campsite.
- If you are traveling from out of council you must have a Tour Plan.
- Please bring your Medical Forms with you in case of an emergency.
- Event Staff will need to Check In at the **Dining Hall**.

Check-Out

- Check out will take place in the **Dining Hall**.
- Check-Out will begin at 6:30 am on Sunday January 27, 2019.
- Once your unit has packed up and has checked to ensure the campsite is clean and all trash removed, you will need to have your campsite inspected. Send your Senior Patrol Leader and a second scout to the **Dining Hall** so that a staff member can check and approve your site. Once approved by the staff member, return to the **Dining Hall** to finish your check-out procedure.
- Fill out the event survey.
- Pick up your event ribbon and patches at the **Dining Hall**.
- Saturday checkout will take place in the **Dining Hall** starting at 8:00pm.
- Sunday Checkout will take place in the **Trading Post** starting at 7:00am

Webelos Winter Challenge

Check-In Procedure

Leader Notes:

- 1) The unit leader or their designee needs to register the entire unit at one time.
- 2) Please make sure your parents and scouts know your unit number.
- 3) Register your complete Webelos unit once they are at camp.
- 4) Please make sure your unit is considerate of those units who are coming in or leaving the cabin you are sleeping in.
- 5) Please adhere to the check in and check out times.
- 6) Check with the unit coming in before or after you before storing your gear in the cabin.

Arriving Friday 1-25-2019

- 1) Check in at the **Dining Hall** (7:30-8:30pm) with your Units completed roster.
- 2) Check out time for Friday night units is at 12:00 pm on Saturday 1-26-2019.
- 3) When checking out of the cabin you must remove your gear from the cabin. You may contact the unit following you to ask for permission to leave your gear in the cabin.

Arriving Saturday 1-26-2019

- 1) Check in at the **Dining Hall** (7:30-8:30am) with your Units completed roster.
