Challenges:

Since we will need to be socially distant, it is Important that all Tribes listen and understand the directions given by the judges. Before each challenge starts, the Chief of each Tribe will be called forward.

The Challenge will be detailed and it is the Chief's responsibility to explain the rules to the Tribe.

LNT Pick Up- A Scout is Clean....Any Tribe that picks up liter or garbage during the event will receive points.

Scavenger Hunt- Tribes will be given information for a virtual scavenger hunt. Points will be awarded commensurate with success completing the list.

Raw Egg- At the beginning of the event, each Tribe will be presented with a special raw egg to share their FSR experience with them. There will be timed check in stations to show that it Survives thru the event. The longer it is safe...the more points you score!

Dessert Cook Off- Tribes will receive points for turning in a dessert cooked in their campsite between the open of the event and 10 pm. Samples will be presented to judges at the Jarreau Shelter. Points will be awarded for originality and taste.

Orienteering- Tribes will be given a set of bearings and distances to Navigate a course. Points will be awarded for time completing the adventure.

Pioneering- Tribes will need to assemble a pioneering project. Points will be given for correctly competing the assigned work.

Fire Building- Fire is life to a Tribe! Points will be assigned to how you light your fire.

Knot Tying Relay- Tribe Members will complete the following knots: Square, Timber Hitch, Tautline, Two Half Hitches, Clove Hitch, Bowline, & Sheet Bend.

Marksmanship- Tribe members will each shoot at a target. The best average score for the total group will be recorded.

Plant Identification- Tribe members will try to identify selected plants at camp for points.

Frisbee Challenge- Tribe members will compete for the closest pin for points.

Wagon/Sled Inspection- Tribes will have their "whatever on wheels" inspected for the required equipment list.

Raft Race- Tribes will build an escape from the island and see how far they can float. Points will be given for the design of the raft using a milk jug and how far it travels across the lake.

Deal or No Deal- Answer Scouting questions....the more you know the higher the reward!

Survival Eating Challenge- When stranded food can be scarce....Scouts will be challenged to eat non traditional treats for points.

Scoring Guidelines:

Events will be scored on:

The more challenges the Tribe completes the more points they will earn.

Health & Safety:

- *Medical Form A & B is required for all participants.
- *Temperature checks will occur upon arrival to the Council Service Center and if anyone has a fever of 100 degrees or higher their full group will be sent home.

Please check your own temperature prior to leaving for the event.

Refunds will not be made for people arriving to the event with a fever.

If you call on the morning of to report symptoms, we will be able to make a refund.

- *We also ask that all attendees do a self-assessment for each of the 14 days prior to coming to the event for COVID-19 symptoms (fever, cough, or shortness of breath).
- *Everyone is required bring a personal face covering that covers your nose to your chin. Wearing your face covering is encouraged for scouts throughout the entire day, and required when in close proximity of others, or indoors.
- *Additional hand sanitizing stations will be installed around camp and at each program area. Everyone should sanitize upon arrival and when leaving the program area, and at any transition time.
