We will do our best to get you into one of your first few choices - but will need to accommodate Troops of different sizes. So sharing a campsite may be necessary. The fields by Lion shelter and COPE towers are also available. Scoutcraft will not be available.

Parking:

Your Troop Trailer **or** ONE vehicle will be allowed to stay at the campsite. All other vehicles should be parked in the front parking lot by the Lions Shelter.

Remember - Firelands is one way counter clockwise. Please do not drive against the traffic pattern.

Food:

Food is not provided at this event - each patrol is responsible for cooking breakfast, lunch and dinner in your campsite.

Health & Safety:

• Medical form A, B1, & B2 is required for all participants - youth and adult

Packing List:

Each Patrol is responsible for bringing the following materials:

- Sled / Wagon
- Patrol Flag
- Patrol First Aid Kit
 - Triple antibiotic ointment
 - 3" bandage roll
 - 4 nonstick 3x3 or 4x4 bandages
 - 2 cold compresses
 - Ace wrap
 - Talcum powder
 - Plastic bag gallon size
 - Tarp (6x8 or 8x10)
 - 2 staves
 - Bath towel
 - Dry socks
 - Neckerchief
 - Small bar of soap
- Scout Handbook
- Writing Sticks
- Small notebook
- Personal Water Bottle
- Gallon milk jug filled with water
- Reusable Drinking Cup
- Goggles
- Gloves (work gloves)
- Hatchet
- Bow Saw
- 1 apple per Scout or participant (you can bring more if you want you'll be sad if you don't)
- 6 6ft long piece of 1/2 inch rope
- 1 30ft long piece ¹/₂ inch rope
- Tinder, kindling and fuel wood
- Flint and Steel or matches
- Pocket Knife (don't forget Totin' chip)

General Rules and Info for this Event

- Trash from campsites must be disposed of at the dumpster in the parking lot.
- Medical Forms and Health officer: leaders should have the annual health and medical form for each unit member participating in the event. These are especially important to have if a Scout will be attending the event without a parent. The Health Office is located in the Boat House. The health officer will be on staff 24 hours a day throughout the weekend.
- In order to comply with Youth Protection "two deep" guidelines, all adult members of your troop must have Youth Protection.
- Possession and/or use of alcoholic beverages or drugs are prohibited.
- Check Out:
 - If you are leaving Saturday evening, you must check out prior to leaving camp.
 - For Sunday checkout We will need your Troop number, campsite location and desired check out time on Sunday. That is the time you should be fully packed up and campsite patrolled. One of the event staff will arrive to inspect your campsite. You are then cleared to leave camp.
 - Your unit will receive their patches Saturday night upon scheduling your Sunday campsite inspection and checkout time.
