Event Check-In Procedures:

- Each unit must submit [a roster of participants](#) attending camp divided by respective patrols/dens. This roster must include address, phone number, and email for each participant or participant parent in case Lake Erie Council needs to contact individuals about an exposure.
- Please use the current CDC guidelines concerning exposure and isolation from others
- **Camping/Lodge Configuration:**
 - Campsites will be assigned
 - Lodges must be reserved and paid for by the individual units.
- **Sanitizing:** Please clean and sanitize your campsite and or lodge as needed.
- **Hand-washing:** Hand-washing or sanitizing is still recommended before meals and throughout the day.
- **Restrooms:** On weekends when events take place, common restroom facilities will be open. Please help keep them clean.

A Scout is Trustworthy and a Scout is Clean.

Lodges need to be reserved and paid through the Council.

Saturday Breakfast will be provided for units spending Friday night. If your unit is arriving Saturday morning you will need to email shrockj4@gmail.com if you want breakfast.

AT Check in each patrol will be assigned a patrol number and assigned to a rotation group. You must give the assigned number for scoring.

-Patrols will check-in with the station leads, and the lead will then send them to a mini event. Station leads are responsible for keeping patrols moving through mini events. -All activities will be based off of eight (8) patrol members. (For the sake of timed events to make it fair for smaller patrols.)

-Adults are expected to allow patrols to function on their own as much as possible.

Station 1: The Ranges (Bullets and bows)

Materials needed: Safety Glasses.

Rifles 22 caliber

Balls o powder slingshot Powder balls instead of paint balls (We hope)

Battle axe. (Tomahawk)

Archery

Station 2: Climbing Tower Area (Belay On)

Materials needed:

Climbing wall
Baler Twine ropemaking.
Balance on a slack line.
Others to be determined

Station 3: Jimmie O'Dell GOLD GRIDDLE @ Schwartz Road (in Front of Ford Commissioner Cabin)

Lunch instructions: See Jimmie O'Dell Gold Griddle rules. Located in the Leaders Guide.

If your Patrol is not comfortable participating in the Gold Griddle....don't. We do not want anyone to feel at risk for the sake of the competition. Please cook in your campsite / cabin.

After cooking, put out your fire and put your garbage in a trash bag before throwing it in a trash can. Rough clean your utensils, cookware, etc. using water. You may finish cleaning your gear, later at your campsite. Make sure your cooking area is absolutely clean before you depart. No debris or garbage is to be buried.

Metal ground cover and hot charcoal will be provided.

Station 4: Field across the road from the Dining Hall (Games with a 'B')

Materials needed:

Games with a 'B'
Ball of the Foos - Foosball
Backwoods Bowling - Tent platforms end to end, 2x4s for lane rails. not leveled, you get what you get.
