## **DETAILS**

The Camporee will have 6 stations, each with a challenge related to various scouting Skills. Each patrol (from 3 to 6 scouts) will be paired with a patrol from another Troop to form a team to complete a challenge. Patrols will rotate through each of the stations, being paired with a different patrol to form a new team. In this way, the scouts will be able to meet and interact with other scouts from different troops throughout the day.

The teams will be awarded points at each station based on how well they meet the challenge. This will include aspects of teamwork and Olympic spirit.

While adult Leaders may accompany each team, adults are NOT permitted to participate or assist Scouts while at any station, except in extraordinary circumstances determined by staff. Points will be deducted for adult involvement or assistance to Scouts while completing the various events. The only involvement of an adult is if a health or safety situation arises.

The camporee will also have a lunchtime Panel Speaker Session titled "Living the Scout Law as a Female..High School and Beyond," and a Leaders' Roundtable. Please see the schedule for details.

## **CHECK IN**

- Check in will be on Friday, September 20th, 2024, from 6:00-7:30pm at the Lazarus Welcome Center (near the parking lot).
- Saturday arrivals MUST be before 8 am.
- All Unit Leaders will be required to check in and provide a roster which includes each Scout and adult participant, and Parts A and B of the BSA Medical Forms for all participants.
- During the Friday night Cracker Barrel, SPLs must provide a list of their patrol(s) which includes the patrol name, and number of Scouts participating in each patrol. Each patrol should contain 3 to 6 scouts.

## **WEATHER**

As for all Scouting events... Be Prepared for rain or shine, and the possibility of cooler weather. Scouts and Scouters must be appropriately dressed for the weather, or they will not be allowed to participate. If extreme weather conditions occur and the Camporee has to be modified or canceled, troops will be notified via the email with which they registered.

## **CAMPING**

Units camping will be assigned a campsite based on the size of your unit. Units may be

sharing sites depending on final registration numbers. Please follow the Scout Oath and Law when sharing a site with another unit. An appropriate area should be allocated for adult tents and a general area for setting up a cooking area. Units should check in with a Camporee staff member upon arrival on Friday at the Welcome Center. We will try to assign campsites in advance and communicate assignments via email.

\* Please be advised that all communication from Camporee staff will be via email to the address used to register your unit!

### **VEHICLES AND PARKING**

Vehicles will not be permitted beyond the main parking lot without permission from program staff. One vehicle per unit will be permitted to drive closer to their campsite to drop off supplies; vehicles must return to the parking lot. Please be prompt with dropoff and return so that other vehicles may do the same.

### **FOOD/COOKING RECOMMENDATIONS**

- We will have a cracker barrel on Friday night (food provided).
- Units are requested to bring a potluck dessert to the Campfire Program on Saturday night that is a Troop favorite or specialty. Please label with key ingredients to avoid allergy issues. Nut free items are preferred.
- All other meals are the responsibility of the units.
- For lunch on Saturday, please plan to bring it with you to the Panel Discussion in the Exchange Lodge from noon to 1pm. There will be time to BRIEFLY go to your campsite after the morning activities to pick up your food.

### **CAMPOREE EQUIPMENT LIST**

Other than your personal gear, or any other item that you want to carry (don't forget a water bottle!!), please bring the following items:

- Troop Flag for the Cracker Barrel

For the Bearing the Torch station:

- Fire starting materials (matches, lighters, flint and steel, lint, shavings, tinder, creative materials, etc.)
- Firem'n Chit Card (mandatory)

### **DRESS/ATTIRE**

Class A is not required. Scouts are encouraged to wear their Troop's Class B shirts. (Hint: Spirit points may be awarded for Olympic themed attire...)

## **CAMPFIRE PROGRAM**

- We will be having an Awards and Campfire Program. Troops are requested to bring a potluck dessert (please see above); scouts can perform a song or skit. We will have sign-ups for this at registration and at the Camporee Headquarters (Exchange Lodge); skits/songs must be submitted for approval no later than 7pm.
- Event patches and awards will be distributed at this time, so all units are encouraged to attend.

## **SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS/REMINDERS**

1. Please have a copy of the Camp Lazarus map available during the camporee:

2. Any Troops arriving on Saturday should arrive 15 minutes before the opening start time on Saturday morning.
3. Once a period begins, patrols are asked to remain at their station until that allotted time period ends.
4. Patrols that behave in an un-Scout-like manner, may face disqualification and/or be asked to leave the event.
5. Potable water is available at many campsites and some central locations. Dishes and utensils should only be washed in your campsite using approved methods, and not at the water sources, please.
6. Fuel Use - See Guide to Safe Scouting.
7. No drugs or alcohol are permitted at BSA events. No exceptions.
8. Leave-No-Trace: Please use only BSA approved cooking methods (grills, stoves, etc.) or existing site fire rings, and properly dispose of trash and grey water.
9. All sites must be policed by your unit upon departure, and all trash must be packed out of the campsite.
