

NYLT PERSONAL EQUIPMENT LIST



REQUIRED

- Field Uniform Shirt (with appropriate patches) *
- Uniform Bottoms (at least 2 suggested) *
- Uniform Socks Short or Long (2-3 pair) *
- Scout Style Belt (Can be a plain non scout belt) *
- Hiking Boots/Shoes (suitable for walking) *
(Note: Course hat and neckerchief will be issued)
- Scout activity T-shirts (1 NYLT T-shirt provided)
- Neckerchief Slide/Woggle
- Raincoat/Poncho or rain suit
- Sweatshirt/Jacket
- Under garments (3 sets minimum)
- Pajamas or sleep wear
- Tent (no larger than 9' x 9')
- Sleeping Bag or Blankets
- Backpack (See below)
- Daypack or cinch-sack (See below)
- Flashlight & extra batteries
- Water bottle
- Bath Towel
- Shower shoes
- Toothbrush and paste
- Hand soap/container/shampoo
- Comb/Brush
- Personal mess kit or plate, bowl, cup, knife, fork, spoon
- Ground Cloth (waterproof, separate from any used with your tent)

Packed so they are handy to be given to ASM for Health & Safety at check-in

- **Completed BSA Health Form Parts A, B, and C (with doctor's signature)**
- Required Prescription Medication

OPTIONAL

- Sleeping pad or cot
- Change of shoes
- Sunglasses
- Pocket Knife (no belt clip, sheath knife)
- Personal First Aid Kit
- Watch or alarm clock (battery powered)
- Pillow/Case
- Insect repellent
- Sunscreen/lip balm
- Period products
- Sewing kit
- Scout Handbook
- SPL or PL Handbook (Based on your home Troop Position)

* Scouts will use the Official Scout Uniform throughout the course, if dirty the scout will be able to do laundry in the campsite. Laundry buckets and soap will be available. Non-Scouting clothing will not be needed for the week.

- The Official Scout Field Uniform (first five items on the list) should be worn upon arrival.
- Scout activity T-shirts are typically worn much of the time in place of the Official Field Uniform Shirt. One NYLT T-shirt will be provided. Scouts can purchase additional NYLT T-shirts through the registration site or bring other Scout T-shirts, preferably red.

A backpack will be used for transporting all your gear (except for tent and cot) to campsites and on outpost hike. A small daypack or cinch-sack is helpful to carry course materials throughout the week and needed items to showers. Participants must not use suitcases, footlockers, or trunks.

Tents will not be provided by the course. We suggest checking with your unit if you do not have one.

We suggest you put your name on all your personal items.

Typical patrol equipment will be issued by the course.
