Registration is limited to the first 500 registrants!

<u>Fees</u>: Early Bird fees this year will be \$30 per participant. Participants are registered Cub Scouts (Lions-AOL). Cub Scout aged siblings (6-11) are \$15. Adults are \$15. Siblings (0-5) are \$5, but not eligible to participate in activities. Staff members are \$20.

Unit Leaders please handle the collection of fees at the unit level and register all participants and attendees as a Pack and register on-line at: https://www.scoutingevent.com/467-25FallCubORee by September 19th, 2024 for the Early Bird discount. After the 13th, the regular fee will increase by \$10 to any participants registered after the 19th. Final Registration closes on Friday, September 26th, 2024, at Midnight. This is a rain or shine event. Each Cub Scout must come prepared for any type of weather.

Address for Camp: 16905 CR 271, Coshocton, OH 43812.

<u>Arrival</u>: Check-In is from 4pm to 7pm. Please "*Do Your Best*" to arrive as a unit and Check-In at the Welcome Center. Please carpool, if at all possible, as parking will be at a premium. Attendants will be on site to assist with parking. <u>ONE VEHICLE</u> will be permitted in the campsite at a time, after check-in has been completed. Please off-load your trailers at your campsite and return your vehicle to the parking lot. Your Pack will be hiking back to their campsite. Youth are not allowed to ride in vehicles. Nobody is allowed to ride in the bed of a truck.

LTV's, operated by adult staff members, will be equipped with trailers to provide transportation of camp/personal gear <u>ONLY</u>, to a unit's designated campsite. Please tag/label gear with unit number. Please contact the event coordinator, in advance, if any on-site transportation arrangements need to be made for any participants with special needs/physical disabilities.

<u>Health Forms</u>: A copy of a current BSA Medical Form, Parts A & B, MUST be on hand for each individual camping in your group. (Scouts, Leaders, Parents/Guardians and Siblings) **Packs are responsible for keeping Medical Forms, please DO NOT turn in at the Welcome Center.**

<u>Siblings</u>: All siblings MUST be accompanied by a legal guardian during the entire campout.

<u>First Aid</u>: Packs should bring their own first aid kits to handle minor first aid needs. There will be a Health Officer available for more advanced injuries. If an injury occurs that requires off-site medical attention, please contact the event coordinator prior to leaving MVSR.

<u>Camping</u>: Packs must follow all Cub Scout Camping rules. All groups MUST have at least 2-Deep Leadership and the "*Buddy System*" must be followed at all times.

<u>Campsites</u>: Your group is responsible for your campsite's cleanliness. No fires are permitted, unless attended by an adult at all times and contained within the provided fire rings. "Leave No Trace" principles should be followed, with regards to fire location. Please try to limit fires to one fire per unit/campsite. Fires should be at least 25' from tents. Firewood is available in the woodshed near Hopewell and Eagle. **ONLY TAKE WHAT YOU WILL BURN.** If you have extra wood, return it to the woodsheds. Please <u>DO NOT</u> bring outside wood to MVSR. Fires are to be <u>FULLY</u> extinguished, if unattended. Coleman type gas lanterns and gas camp stoves are permitted, with proper adult supervision and used outside. <u>NO OPEN FLAMES</u> of any type are permitted in or near tents!

Per BSA Guidelines: NO youth or adults are permitted to ride in the back of pickup trucks!

<u>Meals</u>: Meals will be provided and are included in the cost of camp. We will be providing snacks on Friday, all three meals and snacks on Saturday and grab-n-go breakfast on Sunday. Please make sure your unit eats before arriving on Friday, as dinner is <u>NOT</u> provided on the day of arrival. <u>Please be sure to get all food allergy forms turned in ASAP.</u>

Restrooms: Each campsite, at MVSR, has a restroom facility (*KYBO*) and wash station. There are indoor restrooms at the Dining Hall. These indoor facilities are for **ADULTS ONLY!** Please do not abuse this privilege.

Program Areas: All Packs will be divided into groups for all activities conducted on Saturday.

- Lions: On your Marks(Back of the Welcome Center)
- Tigers: Curiosity, Intrigue, and Magical Mystery(Front of the Welcome Center)
- Wolves: Adventures in Coins(Dining Hall)
- Bears: Roaring Laughter(McClein Shelter)
- **WEBELOS**: Aware and Care(Netami Shelter)
- **Arrow of Light:** Into the Wild(Kiwanis Shelter)
- Other areas will include the Range, Racetime, Tower, STEM, Eco, Games and Fishing.

It is our full intent to complete all requirements for the above adventures. Leaders and adults are encouraged to lend a helping hand to the volunteers working at each session, to help keep things moving in an orderly fashion.

<u>Friday Night Fun:</u> We have a fantastic first night of fun planned to kick off the weekend. Everyone is invited to make Pack Flags in the dining hall, at 8PM. There will be a snack provided during the event.

<u>Saturday Night Campfire Program</u>: Each Pack is encouraged and welcome to attend and participate in our campfire program Saturday evening. Each unit will be allotted time to conduct one skit or song that is appropriate and pre-approved by unit leaders. It is best, and more enjoyable for the Scouts, if the song/skit has been rehearsed prior to camp. <u>Please submit the title of your song/skit, along with your unit's number, to the event coordinator, by dinner time Saturday night.</u>

Camp Rules:

Safety & Supervision:

- Adherence to the Guide to Safe Scouting, including Youth Protection and Camping Policies, is mandatory at all times.
- Two-deep leadership and the Buddy System are consistently required.

Prohibited Items & Activities:

- Alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited on camp property.
- Pets are not permitted.
- Swimming and boating in the lake are forbidden.
- "Bonfires," which waste wood, are not allowed.
- Loading firewood into trucks for transport is not permitted.

Camp Conduct & Facilities:

- MVSR is a tobacco-free camp. Smokers are strongly encouraged to use designated areas (behind the dumpsters near the dining hall or in the parking lot), away from campsites and youth.
- All fires must be attended continuously.
- Firewood is available at two locations and may be transported to sites by wagon; it is intended for cooking and social use, not large bonfires.
- Campers are expected to be kind and courteous, avoiding disturbances that could negatively impact others.
- Respect the Ranger's home and maintenance area; enter only for official business.
- Take good care of camp facilities and equipment. Units or individual campers will be charged for defaced property or lost/damaged equipment.
