Registration is limited to the first 500 registrants!

Fees: Fees this year will be \$40 per participant. Participants are registered Cub Scouts (Lions-AOL). Cub Scout aged siblings (6-11) are \$40. Adults are \$25. Siblings (0-5) are \$40. Staff members are \$10.

Unit Leaders please handle the collection of fees at the unit level and register **all** participants and attendees **as a Pack** and register on-line at: <https://scoutingevent.com/467-26FallCuboree> **by October 1st**. Registration closes at midnight. **This is a rain or shine event.** All participants must come prepared for any type of weather.

Arrival: Check-In is from 4pm to 7pm. Please “Do Your Best” to arrive as a unit. All attendees must be present for you to Check-In at the Welcome Center. Please carpool, if at all possible, as parking will be at a premium. Attendants will be on site to assist with parking. After check-in has been completed, **ONE VEHICLE** will be permitted in the campsite at a time. **Please off-load your trailers at your campsite and return your vehicle to the parking lot. Your Pack will be hiking back to their campsite. Youth are not allowed to ride in vehicles. Nobody is allowed to ride in the bed of a truck.**

*** Please contact the event coordinator, in advance, if any on-site transportation arrangements need to be made for any participants with special needs/physical disabilities.**

Health Forms: A copy of a current BSA Medical Form, Parts A & B, **MUST** be on hand for each individual camping in your group. (Scouts, Leaders, Parents/Guardians and Siblings) Packs are responsible for keeping Medical Forms, please DO NOT turn in at Welcome Center.

Siblings: All siblings **MUST** be accompanied by a legal guardian at all times during the weekend.

First Aid: Packs should bring their own first aid kits to handle minor first aid needs. There will be a Health Officer available for more advanced injuries. **If an injury occurs that requires off-site medical attention, please contact the event coordinator prior to leaving MVSR, and keep us updated.**

Camping: Packs must follow all Cub Scout Camping rules. All **groups MUST have at least 2-Deep Leadership** and the “Buddy System” must be followed at all times.

Campsites: Your group is responsible for your campsite's cleanliness. No fires are permitted, unless attended by an adult at all times and contained within the provided fire rings. “Leave No Trace” principles should be followed, with regards to fire location. Please try to limit fires to one fire per unit/campsite. Fires should be at least 25’ from tents. Firewood is available in the woodshed near Hopewell and Eagle. **ONLY TAKE WHAT YOU WILL BURN.** If you have extra wood, return it to the woodsheds. Please **DO NOT** bring outside wood to MVSR. **Fires are to be FULLY extinguished, if unattended.** Coleman type gas lanterns and gas camp stoves are permitted, with proper adult supervision and used outside. **NO OPEN FLAMES** of any type are permitted in or near tents!

Per BSA Guidelines: NO youth or adults are permitted to ride in the back of pickup trucks!

Meals: Saturday Lunch will be provided and is included in the cost of camp. Please be sure to get all food allergy forms turned in ASAP.

Restrooms: Each campsite, at MVSR, has a restroom facility (KYBO) and wash station. There are indoor restrooms at the Dining Hall. These indoor facilities are for **ADULTS ONLY!** Please do not abuse this privilege.

Program Areas: All Packs will walk around together for all activities conducted on Saturday. Areas will include the Range, Kiwanis Shelter, Netami Shelter, Handicraft, McClain Shelter, and the STEM Building. It is our full intent to complete requirements for some adventures. Outdoor Adventurer, Champions for Nature, Outdoor Safety for Bobcat, Safety Adventures across all ranks, Conservation adventure, Build it, Outdoor Skills, and STEM adventures. Leaders and adults are encouraged to lend a helping hand, to the volunteers working at each session, to help keep things moving in an orderly fashion.

Friday Night: We will be having your JR Ranger Orientation at the dining hall so please be prompt and ready to learn what you will be doing.

Saturday Night Campfire Program: Each Pack is encouraged and welcome to attend and participate in our campfire program Saturday evening. Each unit will be allotted time to conduct one skit or song, that is appropriate and **pre-approved by unit leaders and the Event Chair**. It is best, and more enjoyable for the Scouts, if the song/skit has been rehearsed prior to camp. Please submit the title of your song/skit, along with your unit's number, to the event coordinator, by dinner time Saturday night.

Camp Rules

Guide to Safe Scouting must be followed, at all times, including Youth Protection and Camping Policies.

2-Deep leadership is required, at all times.

The Buddy System is required, at all times.

NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES may be brought onto camp property!

NO PETS

MVSR is a tobacco free camp. However, if you have to smoke, smokers are strongly encouraged to use the area behind the dumpsters near the dining hall or in the parking lot, but not in campsites or in sight of youth.

All fires MUST be attended, at all times

Firewood is available at two locations and may be carried or transported to sites with the use of a wagon. Loading firewood into trucks for transportation is NOT permitted. Firewood is limited and intended for cooking and social time at camp. "Bonfires" are a waste of wood and NOT permitted.

There is NO swimming or boating permitted in the lake.

Be Kind and Courteous to those around you. Avoid/prevent disturbances that may cause other campers to have a bad time. Respect the Ranger's home and maintenance area. Enter the area only for official business.

Take good care of camp facilities and equipment. Units or individual campers will be charged for defaced property and loss or damage to equipment. Removal from the Scouting program is also a possible outcome.

Any misuse of a knife will result in the loss of the knife as it will be removed from the cub's possession and may not be returned. Knives should be no longer than 3" and of the locking type. SHEATHED blades are not permitted at camp!!
