Counselors in Training or C.I.T's assisting with the supervision of young Scouts during camp activities, providing support to full-time counselors, participating in camp preparation and clean-up, acting as a positive role model, and undergoing training to eventually become a fully certified camp counselor, all while learning the necessary skills to lead and mentor youth in a Scouting environment.	The Dining Hall Staff will work close ly with the Dining Hall Steward in the management and care of a tidy, clean, and efficient dining area. Under direction of the Dining Hall Steward, provide maintenance, inventory, security, safety, and wise use of all dining area and kitchen equipment used in the Dining Hall or other dining area. Other duties as assigned, must be able to lift weights up to 40 lbs.	Program Staff/Camp Counselors are responsible for assisting with the planning, development and execution of program activities. Camp Counselors are assigned to aquatics, Cub Scout or Webelos Programs, or to specialized positions upon hiring. They also attend to cleaning facilities, serving in the kitchen, and other duties as assigned. Camp Counselors report to the Program and Camp Director.
Trading Post Staff (15+)	Lifeguard (16+)	Range Instructors (18+)
Under the direction of the Trading Post Operations Manager, Trading Post staff work in the Trading Post. This is primarily a customer service role, with Trading Post staff assisting customers with purchases, answering phones, handling sales and packaging orders. The Trading Post operates at the will of the camp and maintains hours based on Trading Post Manager's discretion.	A camp lifeguard is responsible for actively monitoring all swimming areas, ensuring the safety of swimmers by preventing accidents, performing rescues when necessary, and upholding all camp aquatics safety protocols. Requires knowledge of water rescue techniques, educating campers on safe swimming behaviors and following camp rules. Must be able to stand for long periods of time, tolerate hot/sunny conditions, lift up to SOlbs, willing to become CPR/1st Aid and Lifeguard Certified through the Scouts of America or Red Cross.	The Ranger & Target Activities Instructor reports to the Ranger & Target Activities Director and is responsible for the safe operation of all range & target shooting programs at Camp. Range & Target Activities Instructors must possess sound, mature judgment and personal integrity with a strong commitment to working with youth. The Range & Target Activities Instructor must be 18 and must obtain a valid C.ub Scout Range Master Training certificate from the Last Frontier Council.
Health Lodge Officer (18+)	Camp Cook (18+)	Dining Hall Steward (18+)
Responsibilities of the health officer include administering first aid, medications, and overseeing a safe and healthy environment for all campers and staff. Working at camp provides an opportunity to operate under a unique set of standing orders, treating everything from cuts and bruises to homesickness or trauma. Must be currently licensed as one of the following: physician, RN, LPR, or LVN, physician's assistant, paramedic, or EMT-A. No Scouting experience is necessary.	Responsible for providing meals for campers and staff during the summer camp program, preparing meals for special diets, ordering food and cleaning/ organizing kitchen and appliances. In addition, cooks are responsible for general cleaning and maintaining meal records.	The Dining Hall Steward functions as food service floor manager of the dining hall. There are 6 serving periods each day, with 150-200 campers and staff each meal. Stewards coordinate and provide guidance and cleaning supplies for safe cleaning of the dining hall before and after meals. Monitor commonly accessed items like drink coolers and the plate/cup/silverware racks are stocked and accessible. Close communication with the kitchen staff is necessary.
