## Parking

Vehicles and trailers needed for units' program booths can park in the lot to the south of the event between The Pavilion and The Bennett Center.

Vehicles should remain in parking areas once setup has been completed. Please no driving in controlled areas unless directed to by event staff.

All other vehicles will need to park in the designated general parking areas marked on the map.

## Bring a chair!

Don't forget to bring a camp chair for the closing fireworks show (recommend leaving your vehicle until closer to the show).

## Exhibitor Setup and Check In

Booth check-in and setup will be available on Friday, May 29<sup>th</sup>, starting at 4 pm. Check-in will be at the rear of The Pavilion near the loading dock. From there, participants will be directed to the space they are assigned. Participants should unload their vehicles and then move the vehicles out of the space to the parking areas to assist in the smooth flow of traffic inside the buildings. If you do not need to drive your vehicle into the building for unloading, please park in the parking lot and bring your supplies in through the Northeast entrance of the building.



Participants will be assigned a 2-hour time slot to arrive and unload. These time slots will be 4:00-6:00 pm, 6:00-8:00 pm, and 8:00-10:00 pm on Friday, and 8:00-10:00 am on Saturday.

# OKC Fair Park Parking Map

The following areas have been recommended for general parking on the day of the event by the OKC Fair Park staff.



## Event Code of Conduct

Please review with your unit prior to arrival.

The Scout Oath and Law guide our actions. Any Scout or Leader who conducts themselves in a manner contrary to the Scout Oath and Law may be asked to leave the event.

Please do not bring any of the following items to the event:

BB Guns

Bows or Arrows

Alcohol

Drugs

Fireworks

Weapons of any sort

Adults and youth trained in knife safety (Toten' Chip or Whittling Chit) may bring an appropriate scout knife. **No Fixed blade knives.**

### Restrictions

The use of propane must be limited to 1lb bottles unless approved in advance.

No balloons may be used or distributed.

No drones may be flown.

No smoking, vaping, or tobacco use on the fairgrounds or in the exhibit buildings.

Pets are not allowed and must be left at home unless they are Service Animals.

## Uniform & Appearance

Field Uniform (Class A) is the uniform of the event.

Please keep in mind that this is a public event, and we are representing Scouting America.

Each Scouting America unit is invited to put together a demonstration booth to show off Scouting activities and skills.

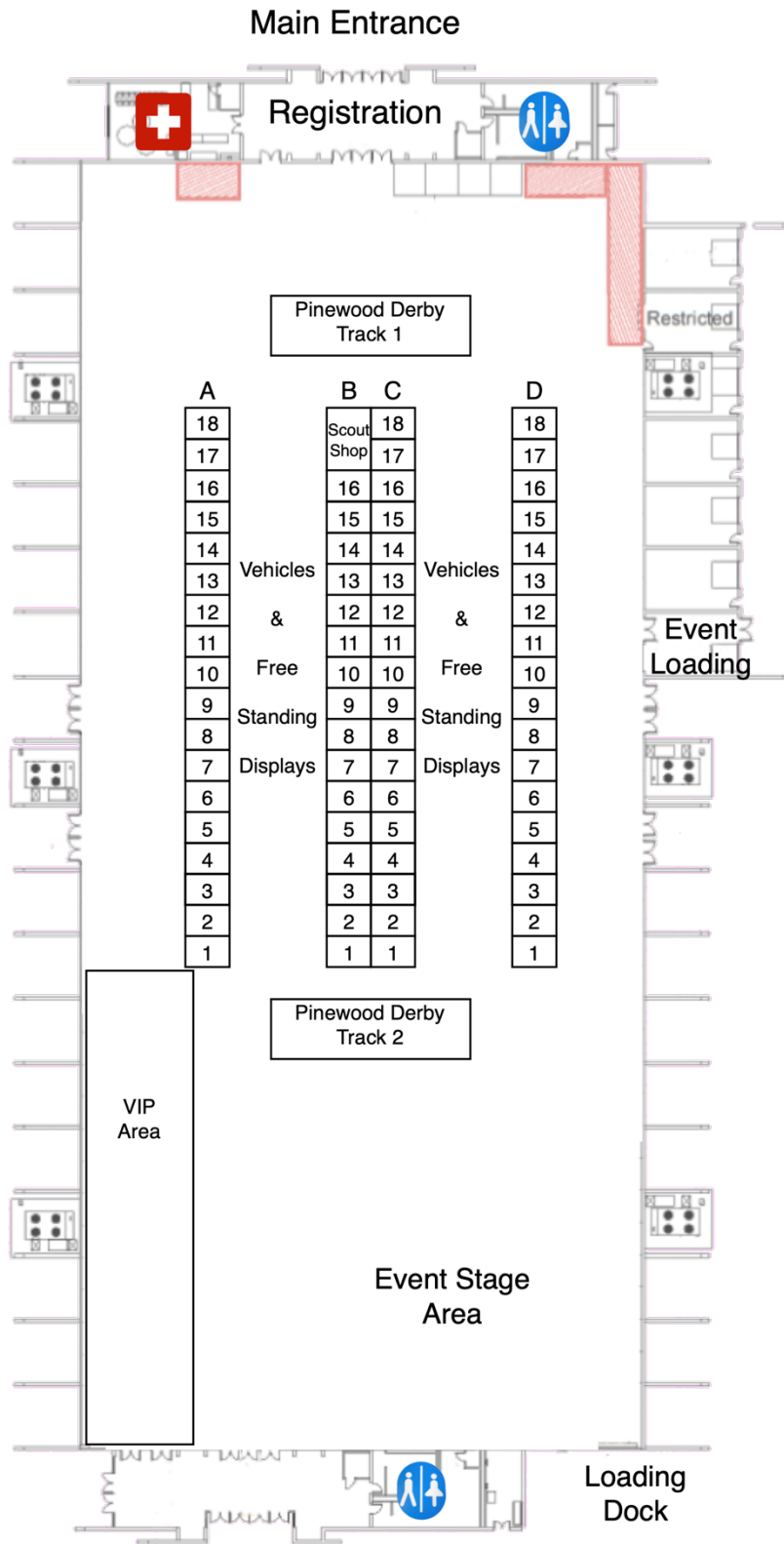
- ✓ Youth-led, interactive experience
