The Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in the Scoutmaster Position-Specific Training. In addition, IOLS covers the teaching methods, activities, and games model teaching used in effective and engaging Scouting programs. The skills sessions in IOLS closely follow the Scouts BSA Handbook. IOLS will help new leaders become proficient in many of the Scoutcraft Skills required for the First Class rank. Participants should leave the training with a better understanding of how the Patrol Method operates, a feeling of comfort in working with and instructing their youth leaders, and an increased level of confidence taking Scouts outdoors safely.

This course, combined with the Scoutmaster/Assist. Scoutmaster Specifics, completes the **“Trained”** requirements for a Scoutmaster/Assist. Scoutmaster.

Also qualifies as Supplemental Training for Scouters Training Award.

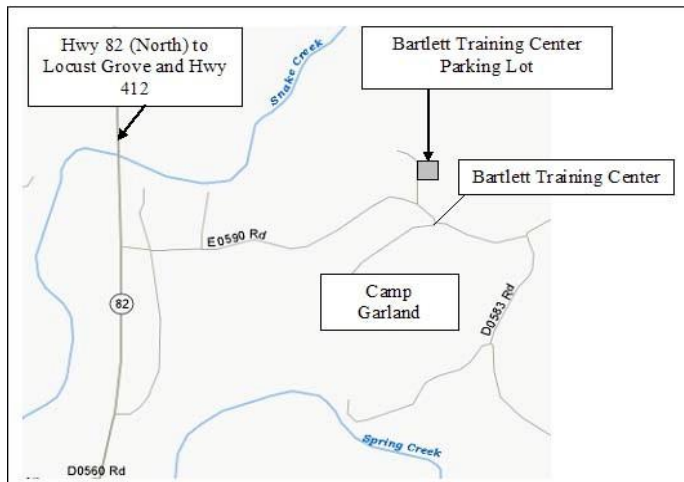
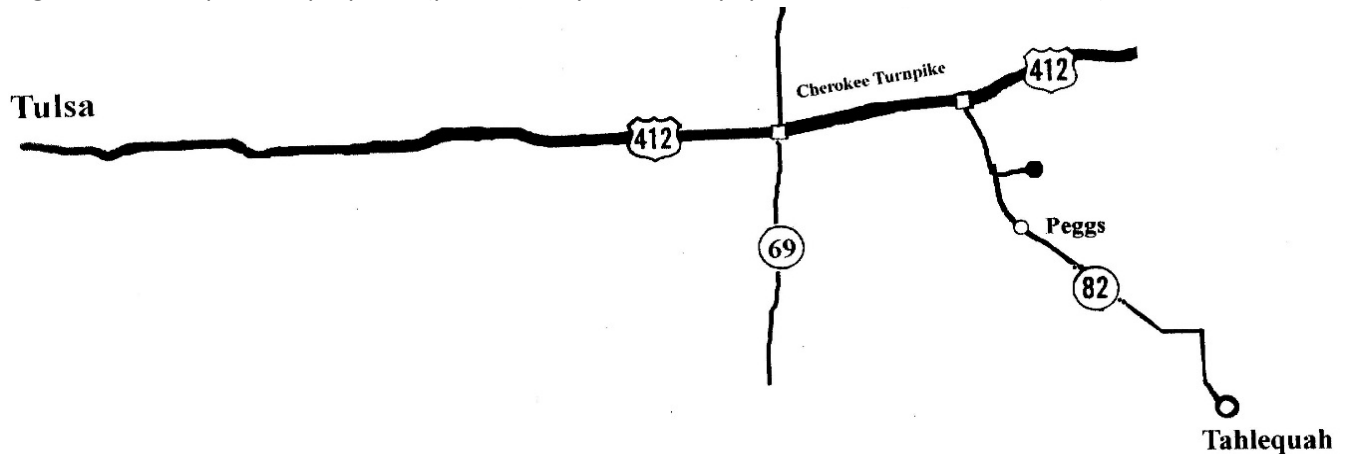

MAP to Mabee Scout Reservation

Camp Garland:

- Follow Highway 412 to the Cherokee Turnpike
- Exit and follow the Cherokee Turnpike to the Highway 82 Exit
- Turn right on Highway 82 and travel 2 miles (past Snake Creek)
- Then turn left (east) at the Camp Garland sign onto E 0590 Rd.
- Travel .9 miles – Camp Garland will be on the right
- The entrance to the Bartlett Training Center will be on the left
