

National Youth Leadership Training

Training youth leaders is important in helping the individual Scout and the unit grow. The B.S.A. has developed an advanced training experience that has proven valuable in training of youth leaders.

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) is an intensive, week-long camp experience for Scouts BSA and Ventures (Co-ed). Each participant works through a series of indoor and outdoor challenges with the mentoring of highly skilled youth staff members. Participants are equipped with the basic skills necessary to become leaders in their unit and throughout their everyday lives.

NYLT is structured to represent a month in the life of a typical Scouting unit. Participants will sleep in the outdoors, prepare meals with their Teams, and live by the Scout Oath and Law.

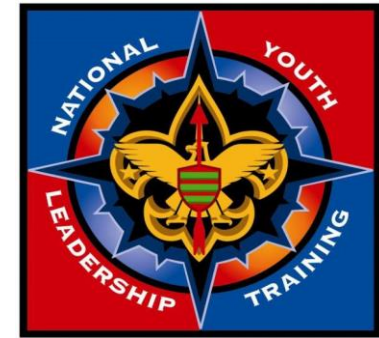

What is NYLT?

NYLT is an advanced training course for all youth leaders in Boy Scouts, Varsity, Venturing, Sea Scout and Exploring programs. Participants must have basic camping skills and the maturity to keep up with the fast pace. Participants will be working with other Scouts in their team to accomplish daily camping tasks and meet the challenges presented by the course.

Practical Training

During this 6-day outdoor event you will live as a member of a Team, practice skills of leadership, and learn how these skills apply in your role as a leader in your unit. The course is structured to reflect a typical month in the life of an ideal unit. It combines a series of classroom sessions with practical experience challenges that are designed to build upon each other. The course is presented by youth leaders under the direction of the Course Leader.

Uniform

Participants should wear the official BSA uniform that is appropriate for their Scouting program. Each participant will receive (4) NYLT "Class B" t-shirts to wear during the course.

Physical Requirements

A current BSA part A, B, & C medical form is required for attendance. The form should be for the current year and submitted at the Orientation Meeting (date TBD).

Living Arrangements & Equipment

Participants will need to bring their own tent and sleeping bag & cot. Meals will be a combination of prepared in the Team site and in the Dining Hall. Each Scout will need a personal tent and backpack for the overnight experience.



Recognition

A recognition event will be held on Friday, June 14th. Unit leaders and parents may register to attend for a \$10 fee to cover the cost of food. This is a great way to see what they learned and help celebrate their week.

Qualifications

- Registered member of Troop, Team, Crew, or Ship
- At least a 1st Class Scout (if in a Troop)
- Be at least 13 years of age
- Completed B.S.A. Health Form
- Completed the Introduction to Leadership Skills course for your program.
- Have unit leader approval
