

What is WOOD BADGE?

Wood Badge is the premier adult leadership development course for the Boy Scouts of America for Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Varsity, Explorer, and Venturing leaders. The ultimate purpose of Wood Badge is to help adult leaders deliver the highest quality Scouting program to young people to help them achieve their highest potential.

HOW IS THE COURSE CONDUCTED?

Wood Badge teaches contemporary leadership and team-building skills in a comfortable outdoor and indoor setting over a period of two weekends. Participants begin their experience as Cub Scouts, then bridge over into Boy Scouts and form patrols. During the course, they take part in numerous presentations, discussions, and activities that explore and advance a wide range of leadership philosophies and tools. A key area of exploration is the process of team development. With this in mind, participants will learn to apply appropriate leadership strategies that enable teams to reach their highest levels of performance.

The course will be held at the Bartlett Training Center at the Mabee Scout Reservation, just South of Locust Grove, OK.

Please initial each statement

_____ I understand that I must attend the entire Wood Badge course. I understand that the first weekend begins at 8:00 a.m. Friday morning and runs through 5:00 p.m. Sunday afternoon and that the second weekend begins at 8:00 a.m. on Friday morning and runs through 5:00 p.m. Sunday afternoon.

_____ I understand when I arrive at the Wood Badge Course I will be required to submit a completed Boy Scouts of America Annual Health and Medical Record, parts A, B, and C (signed by a physician) within one year of the first day of the course. I further understand that I may be asked to submit to a medical re-check by the camp's health officer.

_____ I understand that I must complete the on-line training course "Youth Protection" and the basic leader training for my primary Scouting position prior to the first day of the Wood Badge course.

_____ I agree to follow all of the rules and regulations of the Boy Scouts of America, and to let the Scout Oath and Scout Law guide my actions and behavior during the Wood Badge course.

_____ I understand the Council will be sending me additional information via email regarding the Wood Badge course including a list of items to bring to the course, the BSA Physical Form, a Wood Badge Participant Questionnaire and other information about sixty days prior to the course. The information will be sent to the contact information listed above. If my contact information should change I understand it is my responsibility to notify the Scout Service Center and to keep this information current.

PREREQUISITES FOR PARTICIPATION

- Be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America.
- Complete basic training courses for your primary Scouting position.
- Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment.
- Receive medical clearance for participation with a physician certified BSA Annual Health and Medical Record (Parts A, B, and C)

POST COURSE COMMITMENT

Following the conclusion of the course, participants will work to complete a personally developed commitment to action or "ticket". Wood Badge recognition items are presented upon completion of the Wood Badge ticket.

BEGINNING / ENDING DATES

Participants must report to the Bartlett Training Center by 8:00 a.m. on the first day of each weekend to begin training. Please arrive at or before that time as the course will commence immediately. Training will conclude on last day of each weekend at 5:00 p.m..

UNIFORMS

BSA Field Uniforms are required for participation. (Cub Scout, Boy Scout, or Venturing shirt and pants/shorts).

FEES

The total fee is \$250 if all fees are submitted by March 17. The event fee may be paid in full or in multiple payments. Due to course preparation requirements, reservations and deposits should be made by March 31.
