Adults, this will be your chance to take some of your Scoutmaster Specific Training as well. And, there will be 2 Adult Cook-offs. One winner for Cascadia and one for Timberline. We ask for no more than one entry per unit.

Horse Rides Available!

Saddle up and join the fun at Webelos Woods for our Chuck & Duck Horseback Riding Adventure on Saturday, October 3, 2026! Whether you're chasing ducks around camp or hitting the trails, riders can choose a morning session from 9:00 AM to 11:30 AM or an afternoon session from 1:00 PM to 3:30 PM. The cost is \$60 per horse per session, with 30 horses available for each session. Spaces are limited and will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis, so units should register early to make sure their Scouts don't get left at the pond! Grab your hat, keep an eye out for those rubber ducks, and get ready for a great ride.

Attendance

Webelos Woods is open to all registered Scouts in Scouting America Troops, Webelos, and Arrow of Light Dens from Scouting America Packs in the Cascadia and Timberline districts. Siblings of Scouts, and other Scout-aged youth who are not Scouting America members may not attend this event. Each unit must follow the rules and policies in Scouting America's Guide to Safe Scouting.

NOTE TO PARENTS ATTENDING WITH WEBELOS AND/OR AOLS: Parents or legal guardians taking part in Webelos Woods with their own child or legal ward are not required to register as leaders. All adults must review the *"How to Protect your Children from Child Abuse: A Parent's Guide"* that can be found in the front of each Cub Scout Handbook. Verification that this has been completed is the responsibility of the Unit's Leadership. In addition, the parent or legal guardian must be accompanied by a registered leader at any time they are with youth members other than their own child/ward. All other overnight adults must be currently registered in an adult fee required position.

Webelos Woods participants leaving or arriving camp property must check in/out with Webelos Woods headquarters in the Dining Hall.

Adult guests may come to visit on Saturday. Units must provide a list of adult guests expected at Friday Check-in. Any adults, not pre-authorized at Friday Check-In, will be required to have an adult from their unit come to HQ to verify they may attend. Adult guests must follow all youth protection policies regarding adult supervision, and they must check-in and check-out with Webelos Woods Headquarters in the Dining Hall.

Registration and Costs

Registration is required for any scout or adult staying overnight via the council BlackPug website. **Here is the link:** <https://scoutingevent.com/492-timberlinecascadiawebeloswoods>. Units must register by September 18th. No new units will be accepted after this time. **Note:** there is a limit of 450 people, including 21 staff, at the event so the window to register a unit may close before September 18th.

Costs are as follows:

From August 14 through August 31st at 11:59 pm - \$17.50 per person

From September 1st through September 18th at 11:59 pm - \$20.00 per person

Once registration is submitted on Black Pug, there will not be any refunds.

Arrivals and Departures

Anyone arriving at or departing from Webelos Woods, at any time during the weekend, must sign in and out at Webelos Woods HQ located in the Dining Hall. Staff needs to be aware of any changes in attendance for all adults and youth in the event of an emergency.

Parking

Parking will be allowed in designated areas only. Parking passes will be issued for all vehicles. Packs and Troops are allowed to take gear trailers to the camping areas and will be directed by a Staff member who will control the flow of traffic, but must return them to the designated parking area Friday night. No RV's (motorhomes, camping trailers, or campers) are allowed. Please carpool to conserve parking.

Nesting Area Details

Nesting sites

Nesting sites will be pre-assigned by the staff based on registration numbers. Nesting sites for Troops will consist of 50 ft x 50 ft slots for every 15-17 people (youth and adults) in the unit. WEBELOS/AOL units will be in the mini ducks. Some nesting tents may be needed for overflow in the WEBELOS/AOL area. Maps of the nesting sites will be available upon check-in.

Unit Campfires

Unit campfires will be allowed **if a fire ban is not in effect**. Unit campfires must use above-ground, leave-no-trace fire pits. Axe yards need to be set up only in the unit space if needed.

Cooking

It is up to the individual units to bring their own cooking, food, and cleaning equipment. It is strongly suggested that due to Webelos Woods schedule time constraints, these should be kept in mind when planning meals. Time for cooking and cleaning must be at a minimum for scouts to participate in all the activities. Saturday lunch is set up as a sack lunch event - no cooking.

Water

For Webelos/AOLs the nesting sites of Mini Ducks have water. For BSA Troops nesting in tents in the field, there are several spigots where units can get water. Bringing water is also an option. No washing of dishes is allowed at the spigot sites.

Gray Water

There is no disposal station for Gray water. Please encourage your scouts to practice Leave No Trace and use as little water as possible for clean-up. **Please strain your gray water before broadcasting into the bushes.**

Sanitation and Bathrooms

There is a shower house with 13 individual units. Each unit is made up of a sink, toilet, and shower. Also, in the Mini Duck nesting sites there are several KYBOS. There are KYBOS in the Program Field as well where the BSA Troop youth/adults will be nesting. Bathrooms in the Ducky Dining Hall are for Staff Only.

Trash

Pack it in – pack it out! Please bring sealable garbage bags for disposal of your trash and garbage. **All units must remove and take their own trash home on Sunday.** Please be considerate of our venue and leave your area cleaner than when you arrived.

Flags

US and Unit Flags are to remain as part of your nesting site entrance. Dens are to bring a den flag and a cheer, aligned with their den name/number to morning flag and Saturday activities. BSA Troops please

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have a cheer. Do not bring any flags to the evening flag ceremony as we will be transitioning immediately into the campfire.

Respecting Other Units' Sites

Everyone should respect other units' nesting sites. Please do not cross through another unit's site, instead go around. Show others the level of courtesy you would like shown to you.

Quiet Hours

All activities will be subject to quiet hours and lights out from 10:30 pm till 7:00 am each day. Leaders in each unit are responsible for enforcing these hours. A Scout is Courteous. After Lights out at 10:30 pm, every Duckling Scout is expected to be in his/her nesting tent or mini duck and quiet at that time. If you must move about in your own area after taps, do it quietly so that others are not disturbed. Roaming about the nesting grounds or other nesting sites will not be tolerated.

General Information

Mandatory Leader Meeting Friday Night

After check-in, each unit will be expected to set up their nest site. At 9:00 PM there will be a mandatory leader meeting for Scoutmasters, Senior Patrol Leaders, and Den Leaders at Webelos Woods HQ in the Ducky Dining Hall. A quacker barrel will be provided for the participants at the meeting. Staff will answer any and all questions and resolve issues. If additional staffing assistance is required, units may be asked to volunteer.

Note: All youth and adult leaders are asked to bring their own cup, plate, spoon, etc. to the Quacker Barrel. Our goal is to limit all unnecessary use of paper products.

Webelos Woods Staff

This year, Webelos Woods is staffed by adult district volunteers of Scouts BSA troops. We currently have a full staff of 21 Adults. Staff members can be identified by their staff T-shirts and a lanyard name tag of a yellow duck with their first name on it.

Adults participating on staff do many things such as help with planning and logistics leading up to the event, site setup, unit check in/check out, parking, and help replace paper towels/toilet paper, among other duties. There is no cost to register as a staff member and all staff members receive a staff T-Shirt and can eat meals and sleep with the other staff members or their unit. Please select which option during registration so space for a nest and food can be planned for staff.

Our goal is to make Webelos Woods as much fun as possible for all participants. For adults who are staffing this year, please register directly on the Blackpug site and choose the "Staff" session.

Webelos Woods Evaluations

Each unit is asked to turn in a completed youth/adult evaluation form upon check-out on Sunday. These evaluations are essential for us to improve the event year after year. If you feel some major changes need to be made to Webelos Woods or if you want to praise a specific staff member, please include it in your evaluation. Suggestions for future locations/themes are welcome.

Webelos Woods HQ - The Ducky Dining Hall

Staff Headquarters (HQ) will be located at the Ducky Dining Hall. Staff will be eating and sleeping near this area as well. Headquarters will be staffed from 8:00 am to 10:00pm. If you need to find a staff member outside of these hours, come to the staff nesting area.

Lost and Found

Items found are to be turned in at Webelos Woods HQ. Lost items may be claimed at the Webelos Woods HQ. Items not claimed by the conclusion of Webelos Woods on Sunday will be sent to the Beaverton Scout Office. (Hint: Label your belongings!)

Uniform and Dress Code

All youth and adults must wear field uniforms for the Interfaith Service, Flag Ceremonies, and during the Campfire Program. Traveling to and from Camporee uniforming is up to each unit's discretion.

During the day on Saturday, during activity time, youth and adults may dress in either field uniform or activity uniforms.

Arrow of Light Call Out

The Order of the Arrow will be holding an Arrow of Light Call-Out ceremony on Saturday evening following the campfire. This is a public recognition ceremony to announce those scouts on the final leg of their Cub Scout journey. Immediately following the Call Out - all AOLs and OA members are invited to a Quacker Barrel in the Ducky Dining Hall. Everyone else will please return to their campsites.

Special Accommodations

Arrangement for individuals with special needs must be made with the Webelos Woods Chairs prior to Webelos Woods.

Discipline

Leaders will be responsible for the supervision of their units and will be held accountable for behavior. A Scout is Kind.

Interfaith Ceremony and Bugler

We are in need of a Youth, or several Youths for a short interfaith ceremony on Sunday morning. Also, if any of the units have a bugler who would be willing to play reveille in the morning and taps in the evening please let me know. It never hurts for units - Packs & Troops, to bring extra tents just in case they are needed to accommodate everyone.

Health & Safety

First Aid & Medical Facilities

Review any acute medical conditions with the medical staff upon arrival during the health screening process. Please have the summary page that is provided in the back of the leaders guide filled out for any person with a medical condition and/or medications our Medic should know about. i.e. EPI pens, inhalers, heart meds, etc

Minor first aid needs are the responsibility of the unit. All accidents must be reported to the camp medic regardless of severity.

Our medic will also want to know if there are any doctors in your group.

Medical Forms & Medications

Units must bring copies of Scouting America medical form Part A & B1, B2 for every youth and adult attending Webelos Woods. Unit Leader will provide their Unit's medical information on check in. The Units will keep all Medical forms.

In this guide is a summary page of any medical issues of which the Camp Medic needs to know. i.e., EPI pens, inhalers, heart meds., etc.

Medications MUST be kept in a secure locked box or in a unit leader's car.

Check-In & Check-out procedures

Before Arrival:

- **Confirm registration for all participants** - Please make sure your Webelos Woods payments have gone through on BlackPug. Remember that registration closes on Friday, September 18th, at 11:59 PM.
- **Medical Forms** - All participants need an Annual Health and Medical Parts A, B1 and B2, signed by participant and adult on youth forms, for the unit leader to hand over to the Head Medic for review only. Unit Leaders will be given the forms back for them to keep at their campsite.

Arrival:

- **Time** – Scouting units may arrive starting by 5:00 PM. Units need to be in camp by 8:30 PM so their leaders can attend the 9:00 PM leaders meeting.
- **Parking** – Staff will assist with parking. Each car will receive a parking pass from staff. These need to be filled out and left in the vehicle dashboard. Cars and trailers will need to remain in designated lots.
- **Check-in** - All Leaders must come to HQ, in the Ducky Dining Hall with their units medical forms for review. The following will be done:
 - **Health Screening** - Camp Medic will look over the Summary of Medical Conditions form and any individual Health forms as needed then hand the Health forms back to the Leader.
 - **Unit Check In** - Unit leaders will receive a copy of their roster and update if needed, including showing others who will arrive later. They will then be given a nest site map showing their nesting site location.
 - **Unit Gear Drop-off** - Once medical screening has been completed and the units checked in, they may use one unit vehicle at a time to drive to their nestsite to unload gear. Please drop all gear off in the staging area before taking it to the nestsite. All vehicles need to be returned to the parking lot so others can get in.
- **Personal Gear Drop-off** - Scouts need to carry in their own personal gear to limit the number of vehicles on the activity field.

Departure:

- **Gear Pick-up**- Beginning after closing Flag, units may use one unit vehicle at a time to drive to their nestsite. All gear must be stacked close to the road by their nestsite and ready to be loaded before the vehicle arrives.
- **Time** – Check-out will begin Sunday morning after the closing flag ceremony.
- **Evaluation Forms** – Complete form to ensure Webelos Woods can be improved upon year after year.
- **Final Nestsite Inspection** – Send your Unit Leader or Senior Patrol Leader to Webelos Woods HQ with completed evaluation forms to request a nestsite inspection.
- **Webelos Woods Patches** – Upon completion of check-out, your unit will receive patches for all registered participants (youth and adults).

Events

The Webelos Woods staff and planning committee have been thinking of new ideas and considering what has worked well in the past and what has not. Each Troop will run a morning station and a service project will need to be signed up for.

For the Service Project, **AT THIS TIME IT HAS YET TO BE DETERMINED.** Once we know we will send out an email blast of what will be needed from the units. For BB Gun Range and Archery Range, the group size is limited to 8 youth per session. Webelos/AOL units may want to sign up Webelos separate from AOLs if the combined number of youth exceeds 8. A sign up sheet will be completed on Friday night by Unit Leadership. This will help to keep the lines shorter. Please note that for the Service Project, both WEBELOS and AOLs may work at the same time or split up into two times. For BSA Troops, rotating people in and out during the day will work - based on Troop needs. The hope is that each unit will have some representation.

Morning Troop Stations

When Scouts BSA Troops registered, they were asked for the plans for a morning station. Morning stations all have an element of fun to them and allow the Webelos and Arrow of Light scouts to participate in an activity. **Please go to this link to sign up for your station:**

Afternoon Events

Afternoon is a time for Arrow of Light and Webelos Scouts to continue to activities such as BB Gun, Archery Ranges, waddling across the Monkey Bridge, participate in the Service Project, and then watch the Trebuchet Event.

Vendor Knife Sales

We are thrilled to announce that Randy, "The Knife Guy", will be attending the Webelos Woods and selling his impressive selection of knives on Saturday. Both Scouts and Adults will have the opportunity to purchase a knife at this exciting event.

Knife prices range from \$5.00 to over \$100 with fewer knives priced at \$5.00 and over \$100. Most knives will fall within the \$10 to \$30 range.

For Scouts BSA Scouts to hold or purchase a knife, they must present their Totin Chip card. This ensures that they have received the necessary training and are deemed responsible enough to carry a knife. Webelos must have completed the Chef's Knife Adventure and AOLs must have completed the Knife Safety Adventure. Webelos and AOLs must also have an adult present. Important Note: While carrying a knife is considered one of the 10 Essentials, all ranks of Scouts must have either completed their Rank Knife Adventure or their Totin Chip card on them to carry it.

Adults can purchase a knife on behalf of Scout if the Scout finds a knife they wish to buy but does not have completed their Knife Adventure or have their Totin Chip card. However, the Scout will not be allowed to use or carry the knife until they have either completed their Rank Knife Adventure or earned their Totin Chip card.

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We look forward to seeing everyone at the Webelos Woods and hope you take advantage of this unique opportunity to purchase a high-quality knife from Randy, "The Knife Guy".

Scoutmaster Training

Do you have an untrained Scoutmaster or assistants in your Scouts BSA troop? The Timberline District Training Team will be offering Scoutmaster Training on Saturday at Webelos Woods. This course is Scouting America's initial level of training for the top leaders of Scouts BSA troops. Taking this course along with the Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course (taught in the spring) and online Hazardous Weather Training demonstrates that you are a trained leader in your unit!

Note this course is not only for Scouts BSA troop leaders! Are you a Cub Scout leader or parent who is moving to a troop next spring? This course is a great introduction on what to expect and start your journey!

There is no cost to attend this course! Training sessions will consist of videos, discussions, and conversations on topics such as how to work directly with the Scouts to provide direction, coaching, and support, how to provide junior leaders with the tools and skills to run the troop, and how to ensure the rules of Scouting America and chartered partners are followed to create a safe scouting environment.

The course will be 9:00 - 3:00 with a break from 12:00 - 1:00 for lunch with your unit. Adults can sign up as part of the registration process on Blackpug.

Adult Cook-off

Adults can participate in a cook-off. The winner will also be honored with special recognition at the Sunday morning flag ceremony. Contestant Rules re:

1. One entry per unit
2. Cooking must be done in camp - feel free to use your Duck-Oven!.
3. The contestant will provide all ingredients.
4. The entry will be fully prepared and cooked at Webelos Woods. No pre-prepping and bringing from home.
5. Participants may start cooking no earlier than 12:30 pm on Saturday. All entries must be submitted to the judge's table at Webelos Woods HQ, in the Ducky Dining Hall, at 6:00 pm.
6. Each contestant will be assigned a letter when they register at check-in to prevent judging bias. The contestant will deliver one bowl or plate and a copy of their recipe tagged with their assigned number. No need to bring the entire portion you make.
7. Contestants will be judged on Flavor, Texture, and Presentation. Judges will rate each category 1-10 and score will be the total. In the event of a tie, the prizes will be awarded to the dishes with the highest degree of difficulty.
