Leaders Guide

Our Goal: To have fun...while learning!

Webelos Woods is an opportunity for Arrow of Light (AOL) and Webelos scouts and adults to experience the many ways the next step in scouting is different from Cub Scouts. During the Cub Scout program, scouts experienced an “adult-led” program whereas this event and those to come in Scouts BSA are “youth-led”. We have an amazing group of BSA troops in our district who will be your guides, showcasing the skills they have learned while participating in the Scouting America program.

Following check-in, each Den, with the help of their Scouts BSA guides, will set up their campsite and cook station. As part of this, they will learn where and why they should choose a specific location for each. Adults are welcome to come to the dining hall for some hot coffee.

Registration:

To register, sign into BlackPug . We encourage you to register as a unit to be sure we keep your unit together. There will be no on-site registration. Please be sure all scouts and adults are registered online and are on the Site Roster (found further in this packet) as well, even if they are only on site to attend classes or stay for the day. To save time, please have this filled out before arrival.

Location:

Camp Clark 17500 Cape Lookout Rd., Cloverdale, OR 97112 (located next to Camp Merriweather).

Suggested requirements to be completed at camp:

AOL Adventure requirements:

- Personal Fitness 1
- Outdoor adventure 4-8
- First Aid 2-7
- Archery 1-7 (might not have enough time for 6)

Webelos Adventure Requirements:

- Let's Camp 1-4, 8
- Archery 1-7
- Webelos Walkabout 5
- Chef's Knife 3-4

Fees:

Registration is \$25 per person. Price includes camp fees, program costs, insurance, and the Webelos Woods patch. A discount is given for early registration. **The fee does not include food for Webelos/AOL scouts and adults.** Dens should prepare for this event by meal planning, grocery shopping, and collecting necessary cooking gear for the outing. All adults staying overnight in camp must be a currently registered adult (Safeguarding Youth Training) or the parent/legal guardian of a Webelos Scout currently attending Webelos Woods. There is no on-site registration. All registrations are non-refundable.

Facilities:

Camp Clark features minidaks, tables, shelters, hand-wash stations, and flush toilets. Minidaks are two-person, three-sided wooden structures with a roof and wood platform bunks. Units are welcome to set up tents in their assigned campsites as well. Adults will most likely need to set up tents for themselves to sleep in. Also note that some sites are walk-in only with no access by automobile. We will try to keep only Scouts BSA troops to these walk-in sites but no guarantee.

Units will set up camp following the Guide to Safe Scouting. Campsites will be assigned based on unit size. There will be a map with unit placement upon unit arrival.

Check-in:

Please arrive between 7am and 8am. Upon arrival you will receive your assigned campsite. The first person from your Pack to arrive should be prepared to sign into camp and receive your campsite. At sign in please be sure to have the following documents: Unit Roster sheet and Medical Forms A and B for each registered participant. If your Pack includes trained medical professionals (doctor, nurse, paramedic, first responder, etc.) please inform us at check-in. Please proceed to your campsite and **DROP OFF** your gear. There will be time to set-up later. Only 1 vehicle will be allowed at your campsite at a time to unload, so please plan accordingly. Be ready for flag at 9am.

Uniforms:

Full Field (Formerly known as Class A) uniforms are to be worn at general assemblies, campfire, and chapel. Activity uniforms (formerly known as ClassB) consisting of Scout pants or shorts, Scout socks and belt, and a troop t-shirt (or a Scout-appropriate t-shirt) must be worn at all other times. This rule applies to staff as well.

Equipment List

Cub Scouts and adults will need to bring their 6 essentials, personal sleeping gear, clothes, toiletries and mess kits. Please note we are at the coast and the weather can get cool. The campfire will be on the beach so plan on layering appropriately. Adults should bring a tent in case there is not enough mindak space. Cub Scouts are welcome to bring tents if they prefer. Lanterns, headlamps and/or flashlights are a must. With the great tree cover, this camp is dark at night.

Your unit will be cooking in your campsite so bring what cooking and dishwashing supplies you will need for your meals. If you are using a dutch oven, make sure to include charcoal in your supplies. Adults are encouraged to bring a hot cup to fill with coffee and tea from the dining room.

Meal Planning:

Saturday Lunch: Your scouts are responsible for planning their warm lunch. Cub Scouts are not expected to cook this independently. The guides will be there to help your scouts cook lunch. A few suggestions to get them started are macaroni and cheese with hot dogs or a grilled sandwich and some soup. Please remember to review food allergies and plan accordingly. Keep in mind that a hungry scout does not have as much fun!

Saturday Dinner: We will have a pot luck in the dining hall. This is another opportunity for your Cub Scouts to practice cooking with the help of the guides. Each unit should plan to cook enough for their unit and half again as much so there is extra to share. For example, if you have 12 youth and adults in your unit, plan to cook enough for 18 to eat. This meal can be cooked in a dutch oven or on a camp stove.

Fires:

Campfires are allowed at Camp Clark, but only in designated fire pits. There is no firewood in camp, and please do not bring your own firewood in order to control tree disease and invasive insects. All of Webeleos Woods will have a campfire on the beach Saturday night. Please bring approved skits.

Water:

Water spigots will be available for water. Bring water jugs and remember to conserve.

Garbage:

Trash cans and liners will be provided. Do not dump waste into KYBOS.

Webeles Woods Activities:

Saturday morning will be spent within your campsite setting up with your BSA Scout guides. Your scouts will learn how to set up a campsite and why, as well as do it themselves without adult help. Saturday will consist of a rotation of 3 skill stations, Archery, First Aid, and Scout Skills, in the afternoon to fulfill adventure requirements.

Leadership:

The events will be led by youth from our Scouts BSA units in the Rivers Edge District.

Campfire Program Saturday Evening:

All patrols and dens are encouraged to provide one skit or song for the campfire on Saturday night -- fun and appropriate entertainment to delight all. All skits will need to be approved by a designated Staff member before they are performed.

Visitors:

All visitors must check in at the Webelos Woods Headquarters upon arrival. Using the attached camp map, head to the Dining Hall and you will be directed to the appropriate staff for check-in.

Check-out:

Sunday morning, each Pack will need to complete the assigned camp and campsite cleanup. Webelos Woods check-out procedures will be provided at check-in. Some units will be leaving on Saturday evening and will need to have their campsite inspection and checkout before dark. They can attend the campfire, but their site should be cleared for inspection before the event. All units should connect with Kay Riley (Webelos Woods Coordinator) or headquarters staff before your departure for a site inspection. Your unit is expected to leave your site clean, take out your trash, and complete any assigned group cleanup before departure. In addition to duties related to your campsite, all units will be assigned cleanup of common areas such as the shower house and common bathrooms. Webelos Woods officially ends at the Final Webelos Woods Assembly on Sunday. All Units must be out of camp by Sunday at 10:30 am. If you are leaving Saturday night you are expected to complete the same procedures.

Upon finishing each registered participant will receive a souvenir patch in your check-out packet.

Tentative Schedule

7:00 – 8:00am Arrival.

9:00 am Flagpole: Morning Flag

9:20 am Guides lead scouts to set up campsites. Please have 2 Adults stay in the campsite with the youth (no more, no less) Extra adults are welcome in the dining area for coffee/tea and a little relaxing time.

11:00 am Lunch prep in the campsite: Personal Fitness Req 1y can shop and plan a meal. All AOLs should have a task to do.

Noon: Lunch is served in your campsite for all your youth and adults.

1:00 pm Rotation 1: See check in packet (Guides know as well)

2:15 pm Rotation 2

3:30 pm Rotation 3

4:30 pm Prep dinner in your campsite for potluck. Be sure to prepare 1.5 times the number of people in your campsite Ex: 12 people = potluck serving for 18 people

6:00 pm Dinner in the dining room, Don't Forget your mess kit!

7:30 pm Campfire and Scouts Own on the beach: Don't Forget your approved skit!
