- Cub Scout Day Camp Sun, June 29th Wed, July 2nd
- Cub Scout Family Camp Sun, June 29th Tues, July 1st
- Scouts BSA Resident Camp
 - Week 1: Sun, July 6th Sat, July 12th
 - Week 2: Sun, July 13th Sat, July 19th
- Cub Scout Resident Camp Sun, July 20th Thu, July 24th



Summer Camp Reminders

- Registrations all registrations completed on-line through BlackPug.
- Health Forms:
 - Cub Scout Day Camp forms should be brought to camp with the scouts.
 - Scouts BSA and Cub Resident Camps leaders should turn in two weeks prior to camp.
- Special Diet Forms Turn in two weeks prior to camp. Families submitting forms should expect to be contacted to review. Available on camp webpage.
- Check-in Designated check-in time for resident camp arrival will be assigned by JVC. Continuing dual check-in tent system from last year for registration and health checks.

Summer Camp Reminders (cont'd)

- Camp cots Will be issued to SBSA units during check-in process of week 1
 and then in sites for units arriving week 2 and cub resident camp.
- Adult Registration All adults accompanying a troop or pack to resident camp must be registered as a leader including completion of a Criminal Background Check and current Youth protection training.
 This does not apply to family members joining their scouts for Family Overnight Camp.



Medical Forms

- The AHMR Form Parts A & B are required for anyone participating in a camp and Part C (doctor's signature) is required for any camp lasting longer than 72 hours.
- Please ensure that the forms are dated less than a year old by the end of the month of the camp attending.
- SBSA and Webelos Unit Leaders should turn these in to the camp office a least 2 weeks prior to arrival at camp. Day Camp Leaders/Parents should have these with their scout at check-in for collection.
- Please provide a COPY of the health form that can be left with camp staff and keep the original. Forms will be destroyed at the end of the camping season if not returned.
- Make sure parents have completed page 1 of Section A as they want for the informed consent, photo or video release, use of BB gun, and adults who are to pick-up or NOT pick-up from events. This is what staff will follow.
- Please include unit type and unit number on upper right-hand corner of each form. (ie. T32 or P375)

Scouts BSA – Camp Notes

- Scheduled arrival time for resident camp will be assigned.
- Only two vehicles per unit will be allowed into the sites to unload on Sunday. All vehicles except for unit trailers must be removed from the sites and stored in the designated parking lot. Any exceptions must be coordinated with the Ranger and Camp Director.
- Canvas Tents being used again this year in most sites. Units may still
 provide their own tents if desired. Not all tents will be set in each site.
- Continuing the minimizing of visitors to Camp Primarily Friday Campfire
 Only
- Merit Badge supplies will be available at the trading post for purchase as indicated in leader's guide.

Scouts BSA – Camp Notes (cont'd)

- While the Friday night dinner is for resident camp attendees, families are still invited to the closing Campfire.
- Units may depart after the Friday campfire however formal checkout is not until Saturday morning. Units leaving Friday night should arrange checkout in advance with the camp director.
- Wednesday evening meal will be prepared in the Dining Hall and served Tailgate Style in front of the Dining Hall.
- Continuing with the block merit badge schedule for program this year.
 Two MB slots on M/T and Two MB slots on W/T with some special program on Friday.
- All Bluecards will be completed electronically in BlackPug.

Scouts BSA – Camp Notes (cont'd)

- Merit badge pamphlets are now entirely available in PDF format on scouting.org at: https://www.scouting.org/skills/merit-badges/all/
 Scouts should have reviewed them to prepare materials for their classes at camp. Select the merit badge of interest, scroll down to view or download the pamphlet.
- Rimmey Cabin will be configured as a leader work and discussion area.
 WiFi is being installed. Commissioners and Program Ambassadors will work from this location.
- The Netami program (first year camper program) runs for merit badge periods 1, 3 and 4 Monday through Thursday as well as Friday morning's open program period. Scouts in the Netami program will still have the opportunity to select a merit badge during period 2 and to attend open program periods of their choice.


Order of the Arrow (OA)

Family Camp

- Families can use canvas tents or bring their own. Moyer and Elks sites will be used for family camp.
- Wear comfortable clothing appropriate to the weather. Wear closed toed shoes – no sandals or Crocs.
- Camp schedule:
 - Staff will run program from end of day camp closing campfire until family arrival for set-up and dinner. (approx. 4:15 5:15 pm)
 - Family arrival by 5:30 pm for dinner.
 - Evening program from 7:00 9:00 pm.
 - Breakfast at 8:00 am. (Families are encouraged to register for day camp before breakfast.)
 - Family Departure by 8:30 am if leaving for the day.
- Rotating evening program being planned for each night.
- Registration cost includes Breakfast and Dinner for scout and one parent. Additional adults and siblings are able to register as well.
