Cost:

- Cub Day (Saturday only)
 - Youth - \$5 through 10/5; \$10 10/6-10/26; \$15 10/27-11/7
 - Adults - \$5 with patch; no cost without
 - Youth registration includes activities, supplies, closing campfire with s'mores, and commemorative patch while supplies last.
- Weekend (cabin rental not included)
 - Youth - \$15 through 10/5; \$20 10/6-10/26; \$25 10/27-11/7
 - Adults - \$15
 - Weekend registration includes activities, supplies, campsite, Friday leader/PLC cracker barrel, and commemorative patch while supplies last.

Pre-registration is important for event planning and preparations. While we anticipate that all participants will receive patches, only pre-registered scouts and unit leaders are guaranteed patches. Final rosters and payment for anyone not pre-registered must be reconciled at check-in.

Day-of Event Check-In/Registration

- **Unit check-in for weekend participants** will take place at the **Dining Hall** beginning at **5:30 p.m.** on Friday, November 14, 2025.
- **Cub Day check-in** will take place at the **Dining Hall** beginning at 9:30 a.m. on Saturday, November 15, 2025.
- Be sure to bring
 - Pack, Troop, or Crew Roster (2 copies – 1 for staff, 1 for your unit)
 - Health Forms (Parts A & B only) – Leaders retain for their unit
- Pre-registered troops/crews/packs will receive campsite assignment at check-in or earlier by pre-arrangement (contact Jodi – jvender@gmail.com or 814-360-6113 no earlier than Wednesday, Nov. 12 for assignment; units may indicate site preference in advance but no guarantees).

Please note:

- Parking is limited so carpooling to camp is encouraged. Weekend participants may leave unit trailer at campsite or cabin. All others must park in designated areas. Temporary parking near campsites/cabins is only allowed during gear drop-off/pick-up.
- All attending scouts and adults must have a current Scouting America Annual Health & Medical Record-Parts A & B, to be retained by the unit leader or (if scout attending individually) accompanying parent/guardian.

- Saturday Cub Day participants are encouraged to pack a lunch or partner with a troop or crew for meals.
- Per current Scouting America policy, Lions through Webelos (grades K-4) may only participate in designated Cub Day activities.
- AOL scouts only (grade 5) may participate in all camporee activities as individuals with a Scouts BSA troop they intend to join if coordinated with the troop in advance OR with their AOL den/patrol.
- Packs must have a BALOO-trained leader present if camping overnight
- Lion Cub Scouts and Tiger Cub Scouts must have their adult partner present to take part in overnight camping

- AOL scouts only (grade 5) may participate in all camporee activities as individuals with a Scouts BSA troop they intend to join if coordinated with the troop in advance OR with their AOL den/patrol.
 - **With their Arrow of Light Den/Patrol.** Arrow of Light Scouts can attend as an Arrow of Light den/patrol under the supervision of two deep leadership from their Arrow of Light den/patrol or pack. The Arrow of Light Scout's parent or legal guardian(s) may attend with the Arrow of Light den/patrol and their child, either alongside the two-deep leadership or as part of it if they are registered with the pack.
 - **As an Individual Scout.** Arrow of Light Scouts can attend with their parent(s) or legal guardian(s) if the local council coordinates two deep leadership per NCAP Standard HS-502. Individual AOL scouts are encouraged to participate with a Scouts BSA troop they are eligible to join.

Pack Camping:

- Packs may camp outdoors at the weekend camporee rate (campsite included in event fee) or rent a cabin (additional charge) for overnight camping via JVC website: <https://campreservation.com/497/Camps/402>. Rental is first-come, first-served.
- Packs must follow current policies from Guide to Safe Scouting: <https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/gss/gss03/>
- Packs must have a BALOO-trained leader present. The first part must be completed online at my.scouting.org. JVC is offering the in-person portion of BALOO training Oct 11-12, 2025 at Seven Mountains Scout Camp: <https://scoutingevent.com/497-101396>
- At least one leader must have current Hazardous Weather training, available online at my.scouting.org
- Lion Cub Scouts and Tiger Cub Scouts must have their adult partner present to take part in overnight camping.
