WELCOME

Welcome to Lehigh District's 2026 Spring Camporee – ***Please carefully read the important information contained within this Participation Guide***, it will assist you in your planning a successful weekend with your Scouts. Be sure your Scouts are well prepared, well equipped, and ready for a great time.

The theme for this year's Spring Camporee is "The American Fire Service". The event will have Scouts and Leaders participate in various aspects of Wildland Firefighting, Structural Firefighting, Safety, Preparedness, and Search and Rescue. Scouts will have an opportunity to complete requirements for the Wildland Fire Management Test Merit Badge, Emergency Preparedness Merit Badge, Fire Safety Merit Badge, Safety Merit Badge, and Search and Rescue Merit Badge. Scouts may earn a partial on the merit badges if prerequisites are not completed or if they do not attend all the stations and participate.

This event is being organized by members of Venturing Crew #77, with help from Venturing Crews and Ships within Minsi Trails Council. Local emergency services units will also be assisting in providing the program.

SCOUT RESPONSIBILITIES

Scouts:

Scouts should be prepared for their merit badge classes with books, notebook, pencil/pen, and any supplies/equipment needed.

Scouts should be sure to take water with them to the merit badges.

A responsible scout should be designated as the "Patrol Leader" for each merit badge group from the troop.

For Saturday activities, Scouts and Leaders shall wear the Official 2026 Spring Camporee T-Shirt.

Participants should wear long pants and **must wear proper footwear** (hiking boots are recommended, sneakers are fine; **NO OPEN TOED SHOES OR CROCS**). Scouts wearing improper footwear will be asked to change or will not be able to participate in activities.

Program Operations

GENERAL INFORMATION

Uniforms: Though uniforms are an important part of Scouting, this Camporee is a very active event and the Scouting Field Uniform (Class A) will not be required.

Friday night and Sunday activities will be in Class B uniform (troop shirt is strongly recommended).

For Saturday activities, Scouts and Leaders shall wear the Official 2026 Spring Camporee T-Shirt. Participants should wear long pants, proper footwear (hiking boots are recommended, sneakers are fine; NO OPEN TOED SHOES OR CROCS). Scouts wearing improper footwear will be asked to change or will not be able to participate in activities.

First Aid: Each unit should have their own first aid kit and be prepared to treat minor injuries. There will be qualified medical personnel at the Camporee to treat any medical emergencies.

Emergency Procedures: Emergency Procedures will be the same as summer resident camp.

Water: Water is available throughout the grounds. Participants *must* bring individual water bottles for the weekend to take to program areas.

Camping:

Units will provide their own tents and camping equipment.

All food and water for the weekend is the responsibility of your Troop/Crew.

There must be at least two adults in each campsite at night.

No unattended fires.
