Personal Equipment Checklist

(This form is for the participant's use and does not need to be turned in)

You are packing for a week-long camping event. Adjust the quantities of gear according to what YOU need for such an activity. Shower facilities are available (and will be used). There will be limited time to wash clothes (camp-style) so if you think you need more spare items do bring them. One T-shirt will be provided and used as part of your "Activity" uniform. Only the official uniform parts are acceptable. (Be prepared for an outpost hike as well as living in camp).

All will be in official uniform (the first six items on the equipment list) before moving to the campsite. Your pack must be used for getting your gear from the parking lot to the campsite. If your Unit does not require headgear, do not purchase for this course. You may not use suitcases, footlockers, or trunks. Normal prescribed patrol equipment will be issued to you from the Quartermaster. Since this is a training conference, normal camp facilities will NOT be available for your use. You will have no need for "street clothing".

All T-shirts must be plain or Scout T-shirts – red is preferred (NO ADVERTISEMENTS are allowed on T-shirts). Before coming to camp, see that all badges and insignia are properly placed on your uniform.

* Official Scouts BSA uniform parts

** Official Scouts BSA baseball cap or headgear worn by your troop. NO ADVERTISEMENTS are allowed on headgear.

TRADING POST
