## Course fees

- Course fees are \$300 if paid in full by August 1. If paid by April 1, an early-bird discount of \$20 will be applied. A \$50 deposit must be submitted with the online registration. (Deposit is not refundable after August 1, 2021)

## What is Wood Badge?

Wood Badge is the premier adult leadership development course offered by the BSA. The ultimate purpose of Wood Badge is to help adult leaders deliver the highest quality Scouting program to young people in order to help them achieve their fullest potential.

## Who may attend?

Wood Badge is open to registered volunteers and professionals in Cub Scouting, Scouts BSA and Venturing. This includes unit or district leaders, committee members and merit badge counselors. You need to be trained in your primary registered position before the first weekend starts.

## What will I learn?

Wood Badge focuses not on Scouting skills, but on leadership skills, taught in Scouting settings, that are transferable to every aspect of your life. Some of the topics covered include; how to manage diverse talent, improving listening skills, developing individuals and teams, managing conversations and becoming an effective coach and mentor. You will also learn the patrol method and project management. These skills will help you become a more effective leader which will not only benefit you, but also the Scouts in your home units.

The Wood Badge course is designed around the Patrol Method. As Green Bar Bill, who brought the Patrol Method to scouting said, "The Patrol Method is not ONE method in which Scouting... can be carried out, but that it is the only method." The primary aim of the Patrol Method is to teach leadership. Scouts learn leadership by leading. The Scoutmaster provides them with the tools and encouragement to do their jobs. Wood Badge shows how to implement the Patrol Method.

Wood Badge, like all of Scouting is experiential learning. You will be learning by doing, trying and exploring. An essential requirement of every Wood Badge course is for you to have fun!

# What are the "Vision and Goals"? And Why do they matter?

The vision and goals are your ideas. Just ask yourself, how would I improve my Scouting unit? That answer would be your vision of that future success. Then formulate goals and a plan on "how" you would like to accomplish that vision. These goals will allow you to use your new leadership skills and competencies in ways that strengthen Scouting in your home units, districts, and councils. The primary purpose of the Wood Badge experience is to provide leadership for Scouting and leadership for America. Your ticket is a commitment to yourself to complete a set of goals that will significantly strengthen the BSA program.

Some examples of goals include...

- Coordinate at least one Pack fundraiser for the year.
- Promote the Den Chief program in our Troop and with the Cub Pack.
- Plan a summer activity program for the Pack and encourage Cubs to earn the Summertime Activity Award.
- Design and conduct adult training on troop roles and each role's duties and responsibilities.
- Plan to improve communication to leaders and families by providing a monthly newsletter of events and activities.
- Develop a functional achievement tracking system for the den to communicate to Scouts and parents their advancement status.
- Enhance adult leadership skills by training Troop Committee members on conducting effective Boards of Review for advancing Scouts.
- Work with the Senior Patrol Leader and Patrol Leaders Council to plan and execute a Scout BSA Annual Calendar.
