Registration:

Deadline:

- Registration ends April 1st.
- Limited to 250 campers (adult, youth, and staff).

Weekend Fee:

- \$20 each attendee
- There are no single day fees, all participants pay the weekend fee.

Physicals:

 All scouts and leaders must have part A, B1, and B2 of the BSA Physical Form present in paper form during the camporee

Food:

 No food will be provided by the Council, District, Host Troop, or Host Site. Units are responsible for providing their own meals and other food.

Water:

• Very limited water will be available on site, so come prepared to bring all necessary water that will be needed for the weekend.

Equipment:

 All equipment and supplies required for the weekend, for campsites and competitions, is the responsibility of the unit or patrol, unless otherwise listed specifically for an activity.

Scheduled Competition Descriptions

Identifying Trail Signs:

- · Patrols will interpret signs commonly found in the wilderness and hiking trails
- Supplies needed: pen and paper, handbook

Fire Building:

- Patrols will build a fire and burn a string
- Supplies needed: fire starting supplies

Signs, Signals, & Codes:

Patrols will interpret a written message and appropriately respond in morse code

What's Wrong with This Site:

Patrols will identify items wrong with the host troop's site

First Aid / Splinting:

Patrols will identify and intervene for an injured patient

Lifesaving Ring Toss:

Scouts throw a rescue ring/buoy for accuracy

Spine Board Trek:

Patrols will build a stretcher and transport a scout through an obstacle course for time

Emergency Packing:

Patrols will be provided with emergency gear to pack and transport

Emergency Knots:

Patrols will complete a timed knot tying relay

Common criteria for all scored events:

- Did all scouts in the patrol participate
- Was the patrol organized and prepared

Supplies needed:

- Pen / pencil
- Scout handbook
- Fire'n chip

All other materials will be provided.

Non-Scheduled Competitions

Nighttime Orienteering / Search & Rescue After Dark:

• Friday night, patrols will complete a nighttime orienteering course to identify a lost individual

Survival Shelter Building:

- Scouts will build a survival shelter in their campsite, and optionally sleep in on Saturday night.
- Units may bring their own materials, but they are encouraged to be as natural as possible. Points may be deducted for man-made materials, including poles, rope, and tarps, but these would still be acceptable for the overall entry.
- Judges will come around to the campsites during the times designated on the Itinerary.

Campfire & Awards Ceremony

- All patrols are encouraged to participate in the campfire on Saturday evening by performing a scout song, skit, or cheer.
 - Signing up for participation will earn the patrol points for the competition.
 - o The SPL or Patrol Leader should sign up during the SPL/PL meeting Saturday morning.
- Awards will be presented at the end of the Campfire.
 - o First place ribbons for each competitive event
 - Nighttime Orienteering / Search & Rescue After Dark Friday Night
 - Identifying Trail Signs
 - Fire Building

Miscellaneous Event Details

Troop Campsite Time / Quiet Time / Reveille / Taps

- Reveille and Taps will be promptly at the times designated on the Itinerary.
- Troops are expected to be respectful of others during Quiet Time and after Taps.
- Troop Campsite Time is included throughout the Itinerary for site set-up, planning, meals, and building camp gadgets and the survival shelter.

Meals

- Units are expected to provide their own food.
- Ample time has been allocated for breakfast, lunch, and dinner on Saturday and those units deciding to eat dinner on site Friday evening and breakfast Sunday morning.
- The allocated time includes the expectation that all units will be able to prep, eat, and clean. A
 Scout is CLEAN. This includes the site and equipment. We do not want to draw in unwanted
 guests.

Vespers

An interfaith service will be held Sunday morning.

Check-Out

- All units must schedule a site inspection for check-out.
- The host troop will inspect each campsite before the unit departs.
 - Units should inform the host troop of any event concerns or future recommendations for improvement that may be relayed to the council or next host troop.
 - Units should inform the host troop of any damage to the campsite so that it may be relayed to the host organization.
 - o The host troop will ensure that the unit has all of its patrols' and individuals' gear.
 - Complete the event survey during campsite inspection
