GENERAL INFORMATION

What is University of Scouting?

University of Scouting (UoS) is the premier one-day supplemental training opportunity for all Scout Leaders. It is the only time during the year where you can find, all in one place, the widest variety of training opportunities in all program areas. UoS goes beyond Leader Specific Training to give knowledge and skills on specific topics that will help to deliver the promise of Scouting. The goal of UoS is to provide information that is practical and immediately useful on topics that are not readily available at the local unit or district level. UoS Instructors have skills and insights that have been developed through years of Scouting experience. It's also a great opportunity to network with other Scout Leaders, make new friends, and share best practices across the Council. Whether you are new to the program or a veteran of many years, the University provides interesting courses in Cub Scouting, Scouts BSA, Venturing, and more. Uniforms are recommended but not required.

Online Registration – Online registration is open at https://www.scoutingevent.com/533-2024UofS, and will close at midnight on Friday, October 4th, 2024. Registration for all leaders and youth participants is \$12. The registration cost for staff taking no classes is \$4. Staff who plan to take classes when they are not teaching will need to register accordingly. This registration fee is \$8. Please only register for the classes you plan to be a participant in. You do NOT need to register for the classes you are teaching. The per person registration fee includes attendance at six hours of University of Scouting courses, a patch, lunch, and certificates if earned.

Opening Assembly – At 8:10 am in room 119/121 our opening assembly will be conducted for all participants. Short welcoming and inspirational messages, pertinent information, and other last-minute details will be available in the morning assembly.

Class Schedules, Patches, Diplomas, and Certificates – An information packet for registered participants must be picked up at the Registration Area when you arrive. In this information packet you will find a personalized class schedule (including room assignments), a school map, and the 2024 University of Scouting patch and if earned your degree or diploma.

Certifications and Credit for BSA Classes – Certifications and credit for official BSA training courses will be handled by the instructors of those courses.

University Staff/Instructors - All Instructors and University Staff must check in with College Dean's to receive an Instructor Package and copies of your handouts for your class(es). There is an instructor meeting at 7:45am for all instructors.

Event Cancellation/Refund Policy – The Council will refund prepaid event or activity fees, less an administrative fee of 10% of all prepaid event or activity fees, for an indoor event/activity if the notice of cancellation or withdrawal is received in writing at the Scout Service Center more than 21 days prior to the start date of the event/activity.

The Council will refund 50% of all prepaid event or activity fees for an indoor event/activity if notice of cancellation or withdrawal is received at the Scout Service Center within the timeframe of 21 days or less before the start of the event or activity until the closing date of registration for the event/activity.

The Council will not refund any of the prepaid event or activity fees for an indoor event/activity if notice of cancellation or withdrawal is received at the Scout Service Center after the closing date of registration for the event or activity.

Classes - Before selecting your classes, be sure to review this entire packet. There are classes for your specific Scouting area as well as a variety of classes that span the full spectrum of Scouting to enhance your supplemental training. The day is structured with six periods (three in the morning and three in the afternoon), with lunch for everyone from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Many classes are only offered once. We encourage unit leaders to attend together so your unit can gain as much of the valuable information offered as possible. Classes will be 55 minutes long with 5 minutes to rotate to your next classroom.

- Class periods: Most of the classes are scheduled for one period (55 minutes with 5 minutes to walk to
 your next class). There are some classes, such as position-specific courses, that are scheduled for
 multiple periods. Be sure to consult the schedule so you do not overlap your classes. (The online
 registration portal will not allow any participant to register for overlapping classes.)
- Uniforms: Uniforms are recommended, but not required.
- Youth classes: There are several youth classes being offered at U of S. There are also other classes in which mature youth (based on unit leader and parent/guardian discretion) are welcome to join.
- Lunch: Lunch is included in your registration fee. Lunch for the event will be pizza.
- Parking and carpooling: While there is ample parking, we encourage your unit to carpool (a great start to the Sustainability merit badge!).
- No smoking is allowed on the McCann School of Business campus.
- Scouting fun and learning: Scouting is always more fun with a friend! We invite you to bring at least one friend, unit leader, or Scout with whom to learn and have a fun University of Scouting day.

Check out our Midway throughout the day. Various committees and groups throughout the Council will be represented in the Midway throughout the day. They have come to see you for some great Scouting opportunities! The Midway will be open until 2:00pm.

THE DEGREE PROCESS

General Degree Guidelines

A Scouter who attends the University of Scouting is strongly encouraged to pursue a degree. You may take courses from any college at any level. To attain a degree the requirements outlined below must be met.

The course levels (Level 100, Level 200, etc.) are shown to identify the complexity of the course. Generally, we recommend that students take Level 100 courses before Level 200 courses and Level 200 courses before Level 300 courses, because courses are logically more sophisticated, progressive and/or specialized as the level increases. However, we leave it to each Scouter to determine what courses to take at any level.

Bachelor's Degree: To earn a bachelor's degree, do all the following:

- Complete six courses at any course level
- Multi-hour courses count for more than one remaining class.

Master's Degree: To earn a master's degree in a college, do all the following:

- Hold a bachelor's degree in that same college.
- Complete six additional courses (for a total of 12 courses) at any course level.
- All six of these additional courses must be different from those completed for the bachelor's degree.
- Multi-hour courses count for more than one remaining class.

Doctorate Degree: To earn a Doctorate degree in a college, do all the following:

- Hold a master's degree in that same college.
- Complete six additional courses (for a total of 18 courses) at any course level. All six of these additional courses must be different from those completed for bachelor's and master's degrees.
- Multi-hour courses count for more than one remaining class.
- Serve in a teaching role in the College at the discretion of the dean of that college.

Diploma: To earn a diploma at the University, do all the following:

- Be a registered Scout or Venturer
- Complete six classes open to youth in any College.
- Multi-hour courses count as more than one class towards the diploma.


