Responsive Reading: The Scout Oath

Everyone: On my honor I will do my best

Service leader: Our honor is a quality we possess because of our dignity as human beings. Our 'best' means to give all we have. It means to keep striving to do what we know is right, and in the oath. It means we will try to be good scouts by fulfilling our scout duties as expressed in the scout law.

Everyone: To do my duty to God and my country and to obey the scout law.

Service leader:Our duty to God and country means chiefly two things: obedience and loyalty. The duties we owe to God, to our country, to our parents, & to one another. The Scout Law sums up all the qualities a scout should have and without which he cannot be a good scout.

Everyone: To help other people at all times

Service leader: Real human charity or love prompts us to want to help others at all times. Our scout training will give us skills and knowledge that will put us in a better position to do this.

Everyone: To keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight.

Service leader: Scouting offers us many opportunities to grow physically. To be alert and ready requires us to give special care to those gifts of soul - intellect and will. Morally straight' means we must try to know what is right and true, and to love what is good and choose it.
