GSMC Leadership Summit 2025 is scheduled for Saturday, February 15, from 9 a.m.-4 p.m. on the Roane County Campus in Harriman, Tennessee. Enrollment is limited to 608 scouts.

Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. The cost is \$25 for each scout and \$25 for each adult leader. One scout leader must be in attendance for every 10 scouts.

The registration fee includes lunch. Scouts must bring their own writing materials to take notes and **must** bring the official Merit Badge pamphlet for their badge.

All badges have class size limits, and registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. The registrar can see if a badge is open or closed in real time during **Open Registration**. Included in

the instructions is a **Pre-Registration Worksheet**. It is highly recommended you complete this form in advance and have it with you during registration. **ALL MERIT BADGES ARE FULL DAY**, one Merit Badge will be worked on.

9:30a.m.-12:30p.m.	Cub Leader Training	Live position specific training for our Adult Cub Scout Leaders. We will cover the Aims and Methods of Cub Scouting, Advancement, the uniform, Den Management, Conducting a Meeting, Pack Structure, Safe Scouting and more.
9:30a.m.-12:00p.m.	We've Crossed Over: Now what	What to expect as a parent/leader once your scout crosses over into the Troop and how you can remain engaged in their success.
9:30a.m.-12:00p.m.	Adult Disability Awareness	Topics of discussion will include (but are not limited to) recognizing common disabilities and identifying what assistance may be provided, how to implement accommodations for rank and merit badge requirements, providing access to outings and rules and regulations concerning service animals in Scouting.
1:00p.m. - 3:30p.m.	Merit Badge Counselor	Live Merit Badge counselor Training course will review the position specific requirements and advancement
1:00p.m. - 3:30p.m.	Mental Health Preparedness in Scouting	In this session, we will discuss our need to normalize talking about mental health to ensure we can be mentally awake. We will discuss what defines our mental health, how to identify mental health challenges, and our role as mental health advocates in Scouting. Finally, we will discuss resources available to help those enduring a mental health challenge and most importantly our role once we identify a potential mental health challenge.
1:00p.m. - 3:30p.m.	Scout Master/ASM Training	Live position specific training for Adult Leadership in Scout Master or Assistant Scout Master roles. We will cover the Scouting Organization, Aims and Methods of Scouting America, Roles of the Unit Key 3, Roles of Specific Leadership, Troop Meetings, Patrol Method, Advancement and more.



Badge Requirements & Preparation

Scouts must:

- Bring a notebook and writing instruments to the MBC.
- Come dressed in complete uniform. Uniform regulations of individual troops will be allowed.
- Bring any required equipment such as compass (OR), etc. (see page 2).

Attendance

Attendance alone will not guarantee a merit badge; only through preparation and participation will a merit badge be awarded.

Required Reading

1. Each scout is **required to READ, study & bring** to the MBC the appropriate merit badge pamphlet. Be familiar with the requirements.
2. A statement certifying you

have read the pamphlet is required. See your scout leader for a copy of this statement or print one from the RSCC MBC website.

3. Research and prepare any reports or materials asked for in advance of the MBC.
4. Requirements with time spans will not be handled by the MBC counselor.
5. Requirements not covered at the MBC are to be finished at home by a local counselor.

Outside Badge Activities

Some badges require some or all activities to be performed outside. Note those badges and dress appropriately (i.e. climbing, forestry and orienteering).

Payment

Payments not postmarked by January 31 will remove your troop's reserved status.

Scouts will be dropped from pre-assigned badges, and the badges will be reopened for registered troops to select on Monday, February 5. Online registration allows released badges to be claimed. Troops should check daily for newly released badges.

Should you still wish to attend after being dropped from reserved status, your scouts must select from available badges.


There are rank and age restrictions for these merit badges:

- ⊕ **Citizenship in the Nation**
- ⊕ **Citizenship in the World**
- ⊕ **Environmental Science**
- ⊕ **Personal Management**
- ⊕ **Radio**

To register for these badges, scouts must be at least 13 years of age and/or First Class by February 15, 2025.

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
