



Check-in:

When you arrive, you will be greeted at the registration canopy located at the parking lot entrance on Friday evening and at the corner of the parade field in front of the dining hall Saturday morning. You should receive a packet containing your campsite designation, items pre-purchased during registration (late registrations will receive these items at a later date), along with a camp map and other flyers. Please follow the instructions given there as to gear drop off, parking, etc. Anyone with a balance owed will be instructed to go to the office first so plan on parking before unloading any gear.

Trading Post:
