PATROL OR GROUP OVERNIGHT CAMPING GEAR

The following items can be borrowed from your troop gear box or other leaders:

- Nylon cord, 50 feet

■ CLEANUP KIT

- Sponge or dishcloth
- Biodegradable soap
- Sanitizing rinse agent (bleach)
- Scouring pads (no-soap type)
- Plastic trash bags
- Toilet paper in plastic bag

■ GROUP EXTRAS (OPTIONAL)

- Camp shovel
- Sheathed ax
- Camp saw
