Merit Badges for OKPIK Winter Adventure

"VERY IMPORTANT INFORMATION"

Please explain to your scouts that Merit Badge Worksheeta will be provided for each class. The scout will be responsible for getting these signed by the Counselor at the end of the class and turned into their Counselor. The Counselor will put either Complete or Incomplete on the worksheet. The worksheet can be pickup by the Scoutmaster at the Saturday night leader meeting. If the Scout does not get this taken care of it is on THEM NOT, THE COUNSELOR!!!

All merit badges will start at 8:15am and ending at 5:45pm on Saturday. The scout must choose which merit badges he/she would like to earn and sign-up for the merit badges when doing online registration. The merit badge counselors are asking that Unit Leaders look at the merit badges that their scout's sign-up for and if there are any materials needed for the merit badge, that the scout provides these materials. "THIS HELPS KEEP DOWN Event COST". The counselors have also asked that the "SCOUT BRING WRITING MATERIALS". The counselor may ask the class to finish up the class work after dinner on Saturday night if needed. There is a counselor for each merit badge that we have to offer our scouts this year .

PLEASE READ FOLLOWING INFORMATION

"WHAT TROOP UNITS MUST BRING"

- Scouts must bring clothing that can get dirty or ruined while doing the merit badge i.e.: "Automotive". They should read the merit badge pamphlet they are taking and see if they need any special supplies and bring them.
- We are asking Troops if they have any tarps to please bring them. "These may only be needed if we have bad weather".
- Each Troop is asked to be prepared to give \$ 10.00. This will be collected at the Friday night Leaders Meeting for the "Kitchen Emergency Fund" and will be refunded to the Troops on Sunday morning if not used. "This Emergency Fund Will Be for Kitchen Only Not Merit Badge Classes".

"NEW CAMP COOK THIS YEAR" THANK YOU, MRS. HAMLIN

• "FOOD MUST BE TURNED IN"!!!

You must turn in all your food to the Kitchen Staff at arriving to Camp at Check-in before setting up your Campsite. "Mrs. Hamlin is over the kitchen this year and she has asked that the Troops bring Gallon Size Zip Lock Bags label with Troop Number and label their food with their Troop Number, so she knows who to give extra food back to at the end of the camp." ALSO, LABEL TROOP NUMBER ON YOUR ICE CHEST.

"Meals"

- Meals will be provided by Troops. Whatever it takes to feed your unit, you must bring. "Example if your unit wants 2 pieces of sausage for breakfast and you have a head count of 10 it would take 20 pieces to feed your unit 10x2=20". We also ask that you bring enough food to feed two extra people per unit. Meals will be prepared by Kitchen staff and served. All Troops will help with KP Duties on the Dining Hall. "You must also provide Paper Plates, Paper Towels and Eating Utensil's for your Unit. We are asking on Cups you bring a Camp cup that can be washed and reused"!!!
- In the past, there are some Troops that have over 20 people sign- up and some Troops with maybe only 5 people sign-up. That being said, "BRING THE AMOUNT OF FOOD THAT IT WOULD TAKE TO FEED YOUR TROOP PLUS THE TWO EXTRA GUESTS USING THE EXAMPLE ABOVE. THIS IS ONLY FAIR TO EVERYONE BIG OR SMALL."
