Merit Badges for OKPIK Winter Adventure

“VERY IMPORTANT INFORMATION”

Please explain to your scouts they will be given a merit badge worksheet for each class these will be provided. The scout will be responsible for getting these signed by the Counselor at the end of the class and turned into their Counselor. The Counselor will put either Complete or Incomplete on the worksheet. The worksheet can be picked up by the Scout Master at Saturday Night Leader Meeting. If the Scout does not get this taken care of it is on THEM NOT, THE COUNSELOR!!! “This will be the Scout Master Information for the Scout and the Merit Badge”!!!

All merit badges will start at 8:15am and end at 5:45pm on Saturday February 28, 2026. The scout must choose which merit badges he would like to earn and sign up for the merit badges when doing online registration. The merit badge councilors are asking that Unit Leaders look at the merit badges that their scouts sign up for and if there is any material needed for the merit badge that the scout provides these material “THIS HELPS KEEP DOWN Event COST”. The counselors have also asked that the **“SCOUT MUST BRING WRITING MATERIAL”**. The councilor may ask the class to finish up the class work after dinner on Saturday night if needed. This will be up to the counselor. There is a counselor for each merit badge that we have to offer our scouts this year “But Depending on Class Size Some of The Adults in Camp May Be Ask to Help Control and Assist”.

Merit Badges Prerequisites Needed for some Classes.

- ❖ Texas Hunters Education Class – “This class will be an all-day class and limited to 16 students; the class cost is \$15.00 this cost provides the book and ammunition for the class.” The students that take this class will not be

able to earn a merit badge. Please read all the information when registering Scout. I have online registration set up for the Winter Camp Hunters Ed. Merit Badges

The Scout can earn two Merit Badges unless they are signed up in a special class information listed below. One merit badge in the am class and one in the pm class.

Class size will be 12 students per class **“Once the Classes are filled, they will be closed.”**

- Scouting Heritage – Class 8:15 am or 1:45 pm.
- American Heritage – Class 8:15 am or 1:45 pm.
- Citizenship In Society – Class 8:15 am or 1:45 pm.
- Backpacking – Class 8:15 am or 1:45 pm.
- Chess – Class 8:15 am or 1:45 pm.
- Crime Prevention – Class 8:15 am or 1:45 pm.
- Drafting – Class 8:15 am or 1:45 pm.
- Law – Class 8:15 am or 1:45 pm.
- Pioneering – Class 8:15 am or 1:45 pm.
- Wilderness Survival - Class 8:15 am or 1:45 pm.

- Texas Hunters Education – Class size limited signup to 16 students.
- ILST Training Prerequisite for NYLT – Class 8:15 am. Class limited to 25 scouts. **“Students can sign up for one merit badge in the pm classes.”** Scoutmasters let your scout pick a merit badge, understanding there may be a possibility that ILST may need to also be covered in the afternoon to make sure all requirements are met this will be up to the instructor.
