#### The Wood Badge Uniform

For Wood Badge, you should have the full BSA field uniform for your program.

If you don't have some of the uniform components, feel free to borrow what you can and consider lower-cost sources such as Craig's List, Goodwill Stores or eBay for anything you need to purchase.

Please show up for both weekends in your full field uniform. There will be no laundry facilities at Lost Pines.

Course cap will be BSA Uniform shirt for issued at start of first Troop neckerchief your program (Cub weekend and neckerchief Scouting, etc.) If your slide will be Venturing crew doesn't issued at start of wear the full uniform. first weekend you need to obtain one for this course. 
