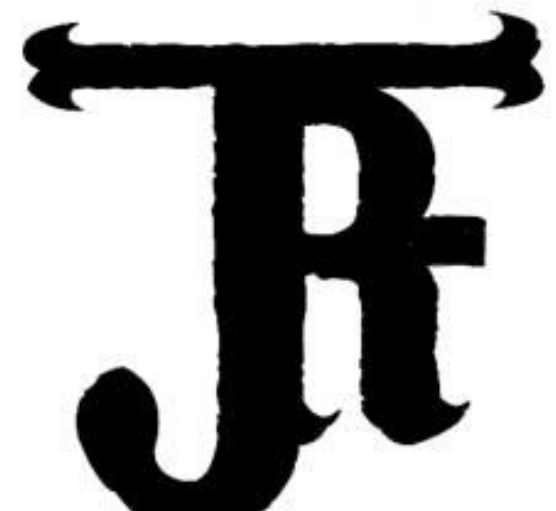

UNIT BINDER

Unit binder with the following organized into the following sections (preferred):

1. Unit Roster (downloaded from my.scouting.org with those attending marked). All persons attending camp must show on this roster.
2. Adults: Youth Protection Training Certificates (YPT) for all adults on camp. Must be valid through end of stay at camp.
3. Adults: Weather Hazards Certificate (at least one adult; recommended that multiple adults have)
4. Adults: Adult In-Camp State Compliance Form

HEALTH FORM BINDER

All: BSA Annual Health Record ABC with copies of insurance card.

This is for both youth and adults (full and part-time). Must include Part C and must be valid through the end of camp stay.

Climbing & Rappelling

- Trevor Rees-Jones Scout Camp's climbing tower has four levels of climbing – 12', 24', 36', and 48'.

- The tower is designed to challenge both the beginner and the more experienced climber with its different challenges and levels.
- Also located in the climbing area is a bouldering wall which is a horizontal climb that challenges the Scouts' climbing technique and endurance.
