

Our Cuboree allows some parts of various Adventures to be completed while participating in our event. While the entire adventure may not be able to be completed, we have compiled a list of requirements your Scout will have the opportunity to complete. **Please speak with your Den Leader/ Cub Master for how they would like to record completions.**

Tiger:

- Team Tiger (Required) can be done at Jousting
 - Requirement 1: Play a game with your den, or family members, that has a set of rules. Discuss why rules are important to the game you are playing.
 - Requirement 3:** Play a game that requires at least 2 teams with your den, or two other family members. Afterwards discuss what it means to be part of a team and what makes a good team member.
- Tiger Bites (Required) can be done throughout the event
 - Requirement 3: Be active for 30 minutes
- Tiger Circles (Required) can be done at any point during event if opportunity presents itself.
 - Requirement 3: Perform an act of kindness
- Tigers in the Wild (Required) can be one throughout the day
 - Requirement 3: With your den, pack, or family, take a walk outside spending for at least 20 minutes exploring the outdoors with your Cub Scout Six Essentials. While outside, identify things that you see with your Tiger adult partner that are natural and things that are manmade.
 - Requirement 4: Identify common animals that are found where you live. Learn which of those animals is domesticated and which animal is wild. Draw a picture of your favorite animal.
 - Requirement 5: Look for a tree where you live. Describe how this tree is helpful.
- Fish On (Elective) can be done at Catch the Loch Ness Monster
 - Requirement 1: With your den or Tiger adult partner, identify the body of water where you will go fishing.
 - A safety brief for our specific event will be presented. This may not include all safety rules that may need to be followed in all fishing scenarios (i.e. from a boat). Den leader/ Cub Master can determine if they deem our briefing fulfills your pack's interpretation of this requirement
 - Requirement 2: With your Tiger adult partner, learn the rules of fishing safely.
 - Requirement 4: Go fishing with your Tiger adult partner.
- Good Knights (Elective)

- Requirement 2: Create a shield that can be for your den or a personal shield. Can be done at Knight Skills
- Requirement 4: Do a good turn. Can be done at any time throughout event if opportunity presents itself.
- Let's Camp Tiger (Elective) can be done by camping at the event.
 - Requirement 2: Before going on the overnight campout, discuss what type of weather is expected and what type of clothes you should wear.
 - Requirement 3: Pack up your Cub Scout Six Essentials for the campout.
 - Requirement 4; Learn a camping skill.
 - Requirement 5: Attend a council or district Cub Scout overnight camp or attend a campout with your pack.
- Sky is the Limit (Elective) can be done by camping or staying past sun down
 - Requirement 1: Observe the night sky with your den or Tiger adult partner. Talk about the items you see or might see there.

Range and Target Activities

Slingshot:

Tiger Scouts must have their adult partner with them while at the slingshot range. NOTE: When the word 'demonstrate' is used in a requirement, a simple demonstration made by the Cub Scout showing their understanding will serve as meeting that requirement. Where the word 'discover' is used in a requirement, explanation accompanied by visual aids will serve as meeting that requirement. When appropriate, some demonstrations/discussions can be held away from the firing line. Each Cub Scout should do their best based on their physical abilities.

Requirements:

- 1) Identify and wear appropriate safety gear with the help of your adult partner.
- 2) Recite the safety rules for using a slingshot with the help of your adult partner.
- 3) Demonstrate proper range commands with the help of your adult partner.
- 4) Explore the parts of a slingshot and their proper usage with the help of your adult partner.
- 5) Discover the types of ammunition that may be used and types that may not be used with the help of your adult partner.
- 6) Shooting Requirements:
 - Shoot 3 shots at a target. Repeat and do your best to improve your score.
 - Shoot at least 6 shots.

- 7) Discuss how to put away and properly store your slingshot and shooting equipment after use

Archery

As with all Scouting activities, Tiger Scouts must have their adult partner with them while at the archery range.

NOTE: When the word 'demonstrate' is used in a requirement, a simple demonstration made by the Cub Scout showing their understanding will serve as meeting that requirement. When appropriate, some demonstrations/discussions can be held away from the firing line. Each Cub Scout should do their best based on their physical abilities.

Requirements:

- 1) Identify and wear appropriate safety gear with the help of your adult partner.
- 2) Demonstrate the archery range safety rules and whistle commands with the help of your adult partner.
- 3) Demonstrate proper range commands with the help of your adult partner.
- 4) Identify the main parts of your shooting equipment and how to properly use them with the help of your adult partner.
- 5) Demonstrate proper stance and shooting techniques with the help of your adult partner.
- 6) Shooting Requirements:
 - Shoot 3 arrows at target. Repeat and try to improve your score. A minimum of 6 arrows are shot.

Note: The arrows do not have to be shot in one session but may be spread across multiple sessions. Keep count of arrows shot by your child and add with other events where archery is presented.
- 7) Demonstrate how to safely retrieve your arrows.
- 8) Discuss how to put away and properly store your archery shooting equipment after use.

BB:

Tiger Scouts must have their adult partner with them while at the BB gun range.

NOTE: When the word 'demonstrate' is used in a requirement, a simple demonstration made by the Cub Scout showing their understanding will serve as meeting that requirement. Where the word 'discover' is used in a requirement, explanation accompanied by visual aids will serve as meeting that requirement. When appropriate, some demonstrations/discussions can be held away from the firing line. Each Cub Scout should do their best based on their physical abilities.

Requirements:

- 1) Explain what you should do if you find a gun. Recite the 4 safety reminders with the help of your adult partner.
- 2) Identify and wear the appropriate safety gear with the help of your adult partner.
- 3) Demonstrate proper range commands with the help of your adult partner.
- 4) Show how to use the safety mechanism with the help of your adult partner.
- 5) Demonstrate how to properly load, fire, and secure your BB gun with the help of your adult partner.
- 6) Demonstrate one of the positions for shooting a BB gun (with the help of your adult partner. Note: this is a demonstration requirement and not mandatory as a shooting requirement.
- 7) Shooting Requirements:
 - Fire 5 BBs at the target. With the help of your Tiger adult partner, score your target. Repeat and do your best to improve your score. Fire at least 10 BBs.
